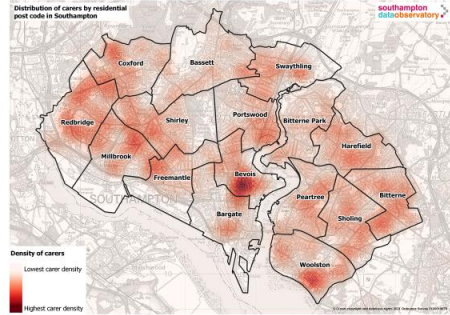

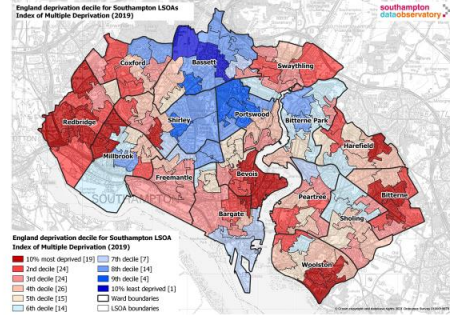

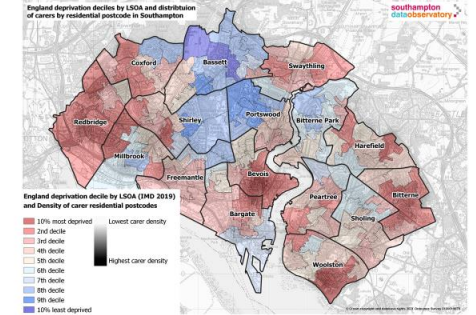

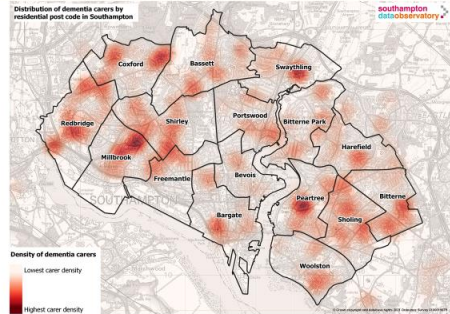
Index of Multiple Deprivation 2019 Map



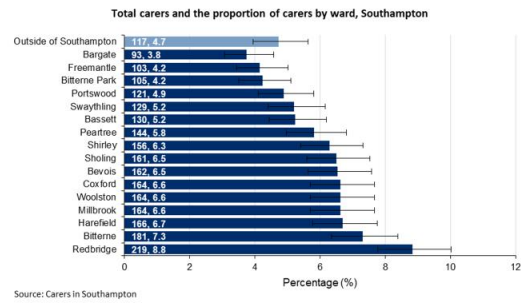
Index of Multiple Deprivation 2019 and Heatmap



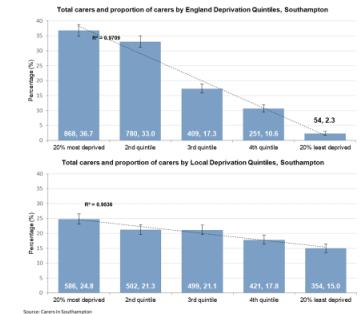
Dementia Carers Heatmap



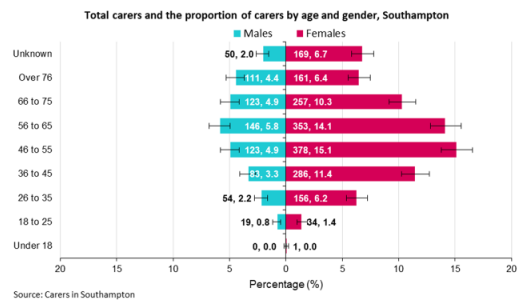

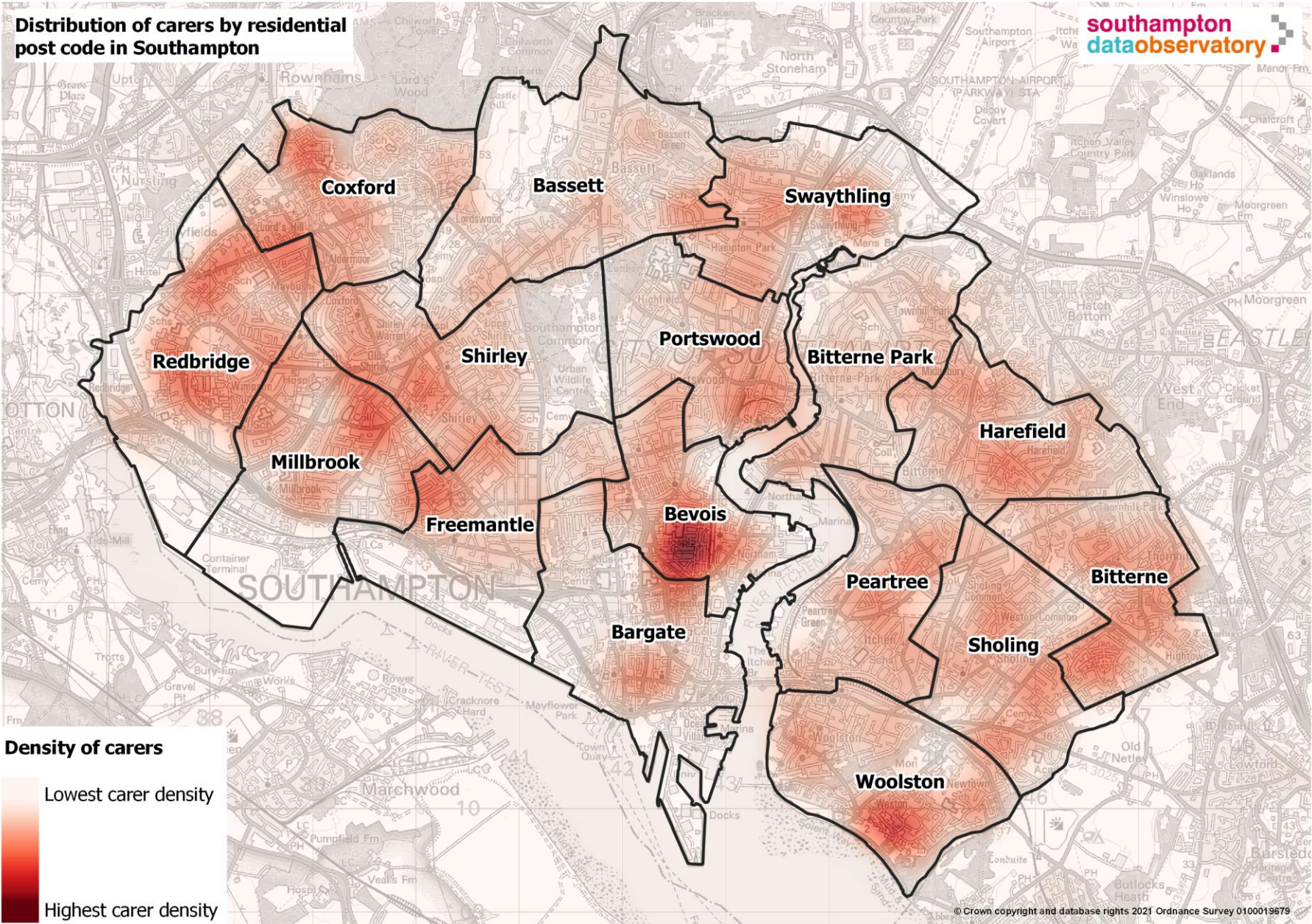

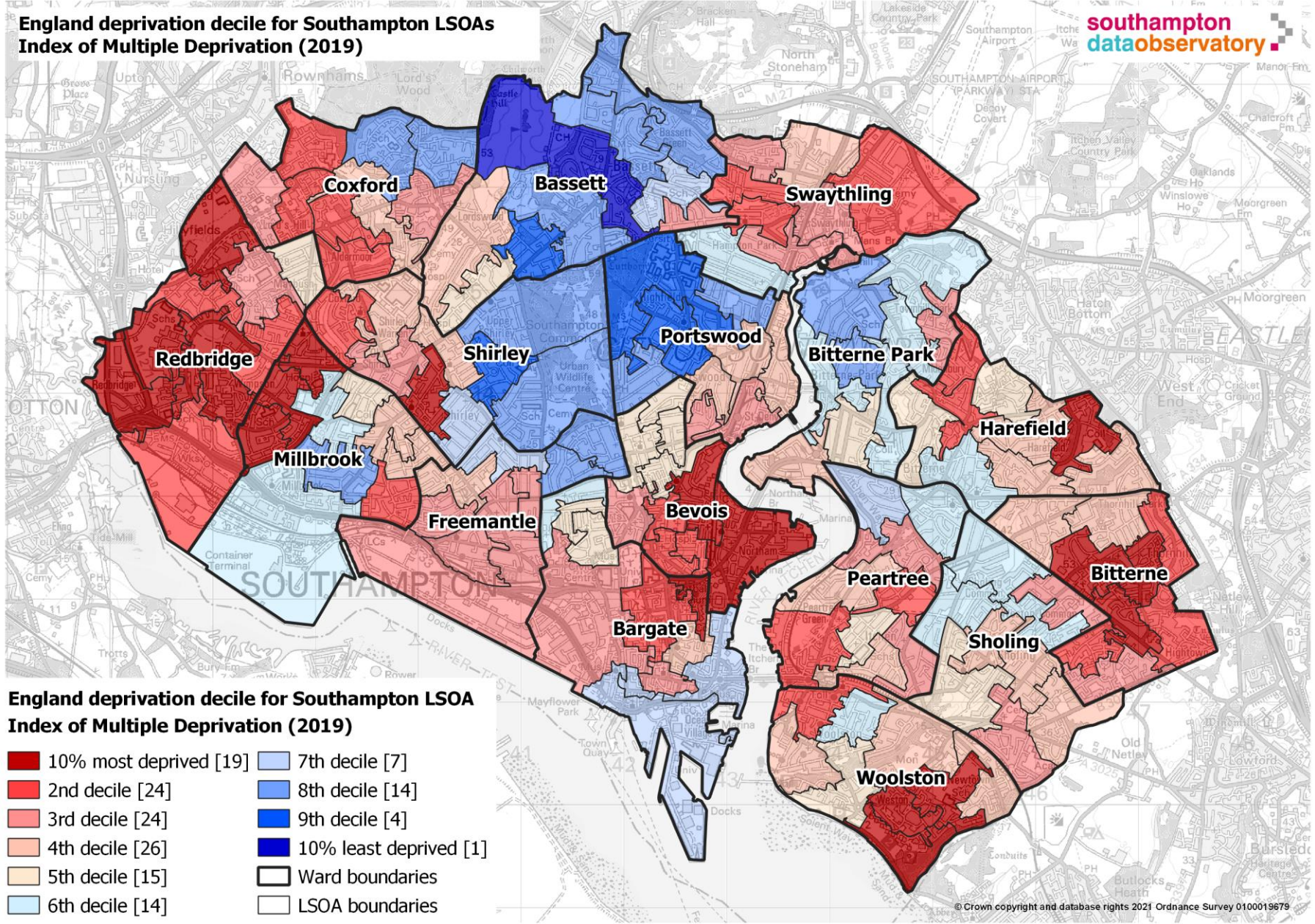

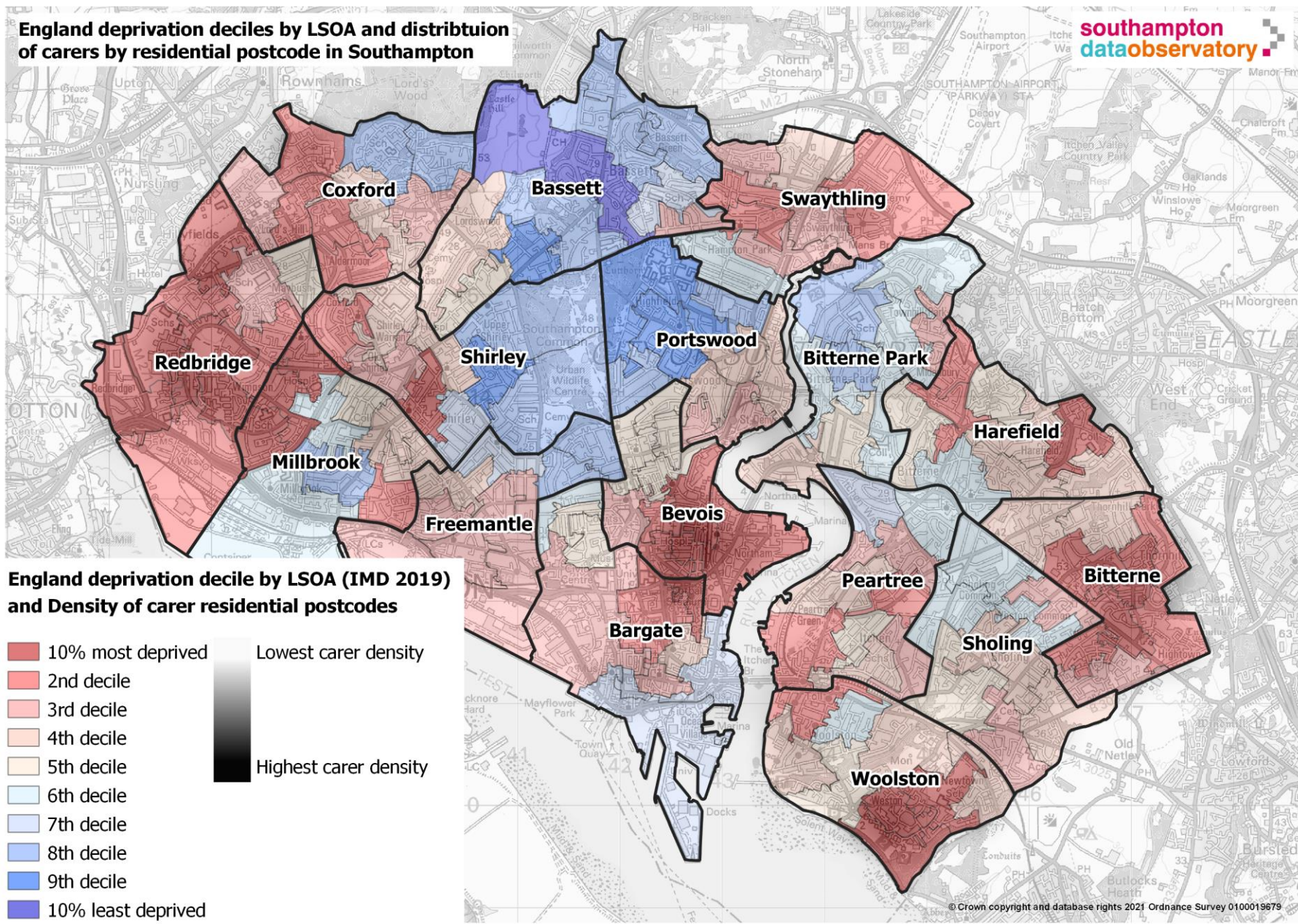

Index of Multiple Deprivation 2019 and Heatmap

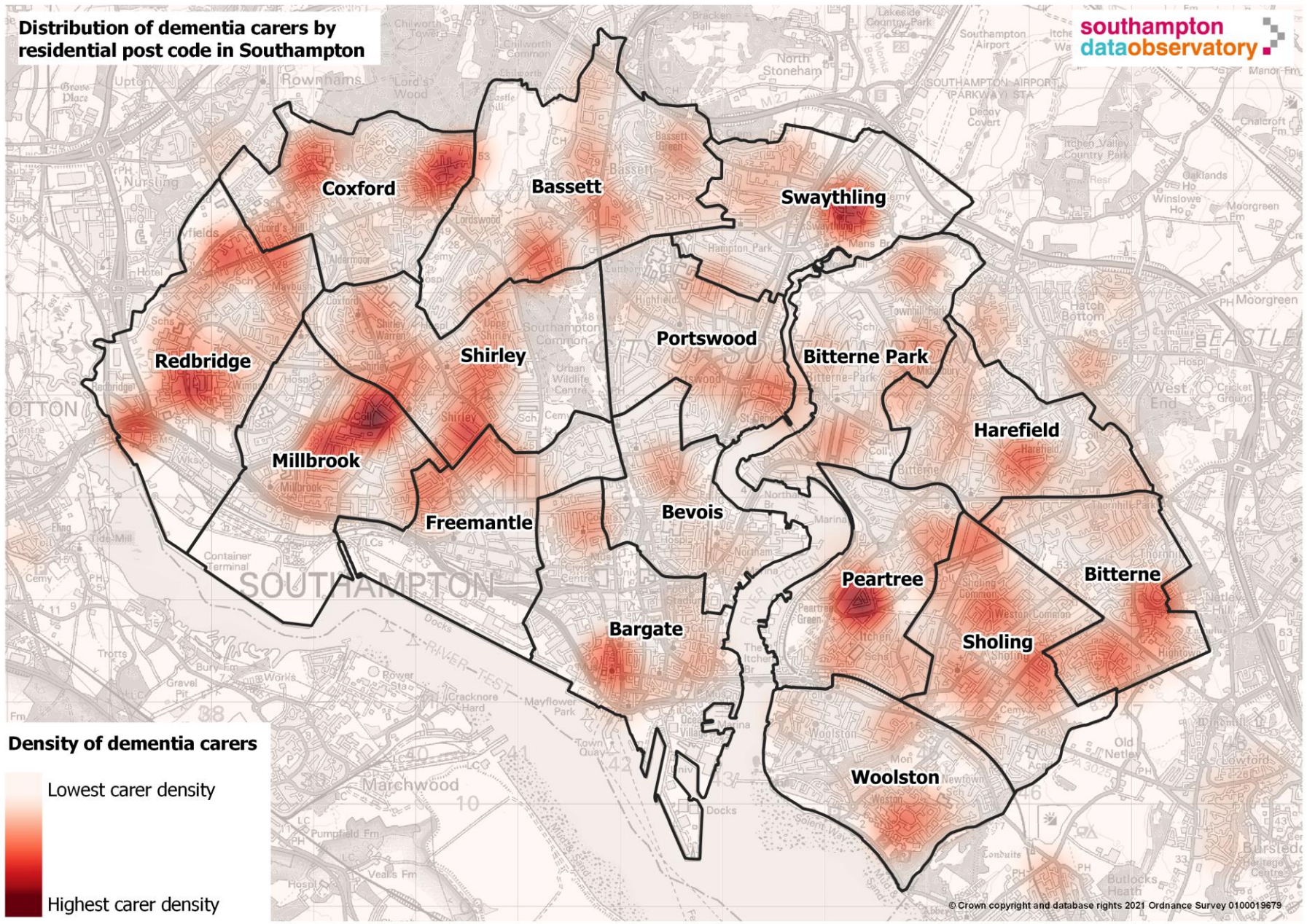




- Hotspots of carers living centrally in Bevois, in Bitterne and Woolston in the east, and in a stretch from Freemantle to Redbridge across the western localities
- These happen to be in some of the more deprived parts of Southampton: Bevois, Bitterne, Redbridge and Woolston
- Much lower densities of carers living in least deprived areas, especially Bassett and Upper Shiley
- Lower densities around Portswood, Swaythling and Bassett may also be influenced by the student populations



Dementia Carers Heatmap

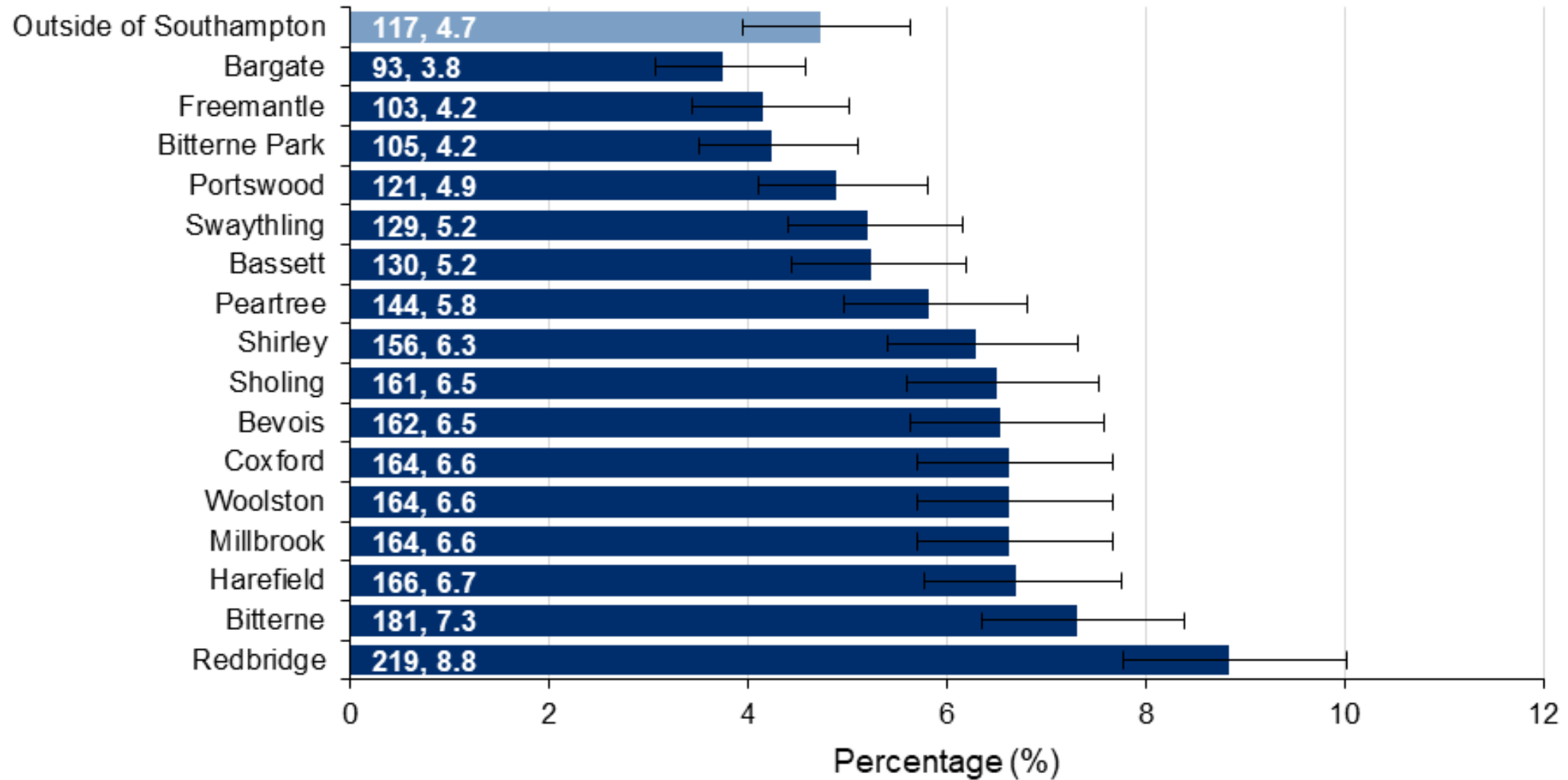




- Hotspots of dementia carers much more spaced out around the city
- Much lesser prevalence compared to all carers in central localities, especially Bevois, and with notable hotspots appearing in Coxford, Peartree and Swaythling
- Majority of dementia carers also appeared to reside in more deprived parts of Southampton
- It should be noted that the numbers of dementia carers is much smaller than all carers in the dataset; 297 against 2953



Total carers and the proportion of carers by ward, Southampton

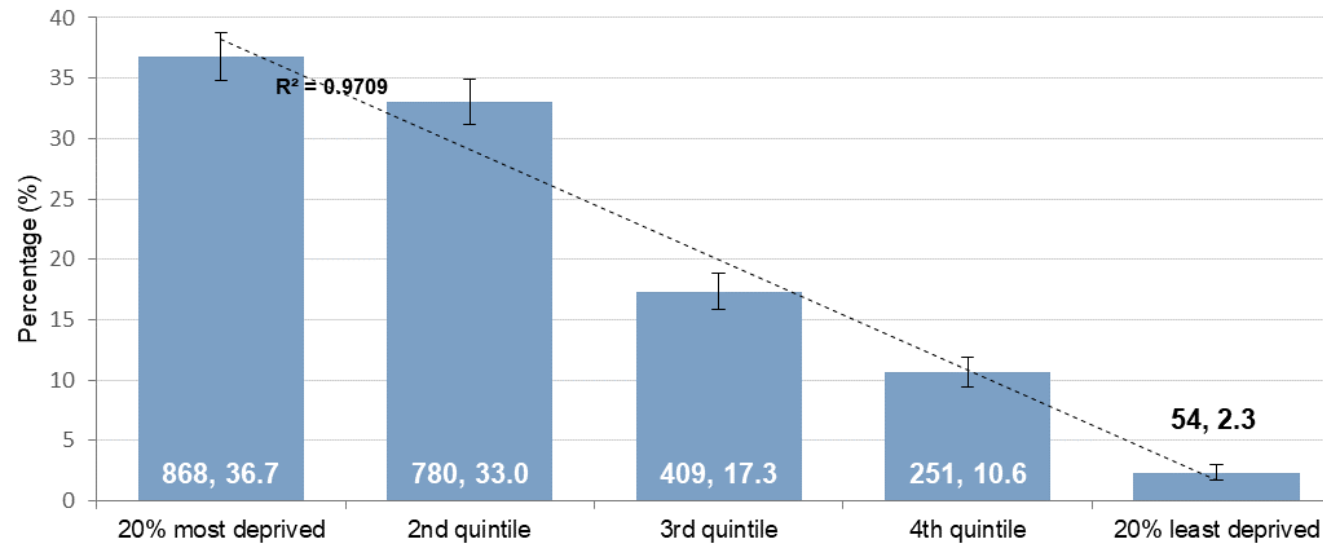

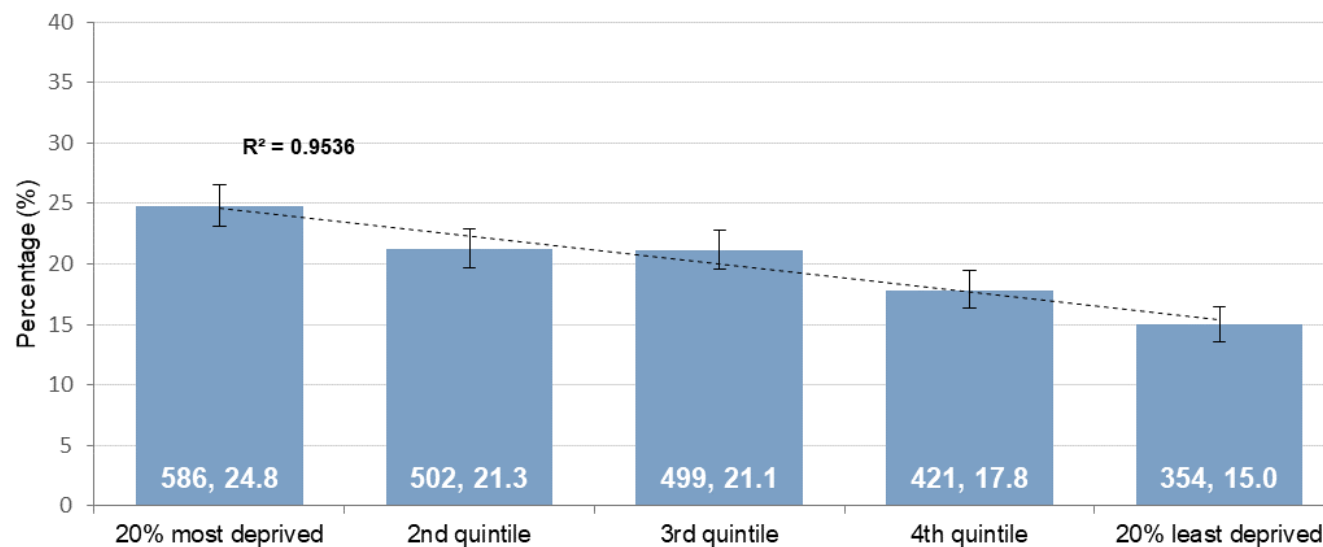


Index of Multiple Deprivation 2019

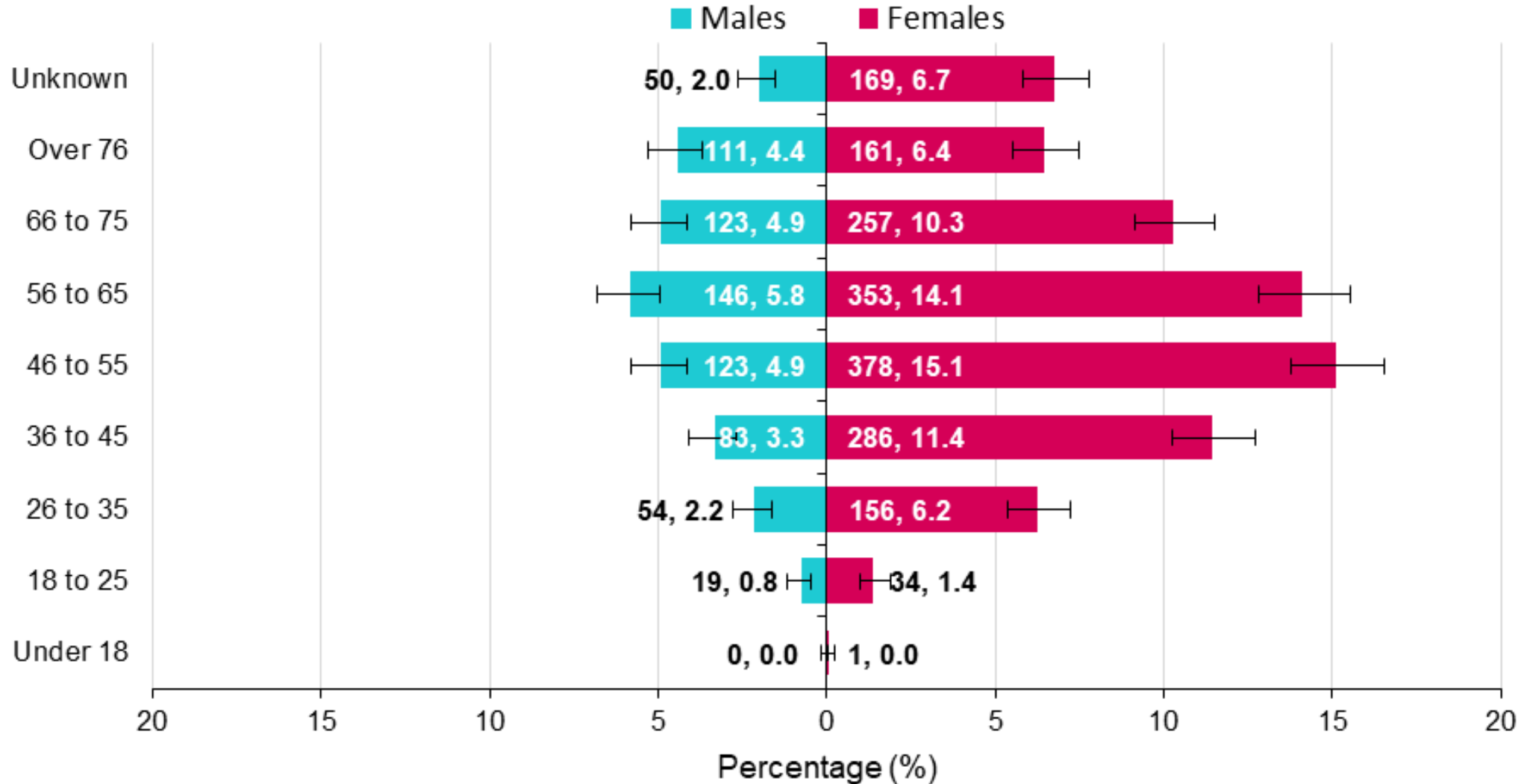


- Differences between the prevalence indicated by the ward and the map, because population is greater spread out across different wards
- For example, the living space in Bevois is lesser than that of Redbridge, therefore whilst the greatest proportion of carers live in Redbridge, the population density of carers is higher in Bevois
- Again, carers appear to be living more commonly in the more deprived wards
- The national deprivation quintiles show a substantial difference between the amount of carers living in the most and least deprived areas
- The local deprivation quintiles show a similar trend of more carers being from deprived areas, but at a lesser scale



Age and gender

- Predominantly more females than males acting as carers
- Age distribution similar across gender, whereby the working age population is most likely caring for their parents and/or children, especially in the upper range of the working age population 46 to 65
- Numbers in the upper age brackets (66 and over) could be people caring for partners, friends and/or family
