To enable integrated neighbourhood health and care delivery, Southampton has been split into six neighbourhoods. They are (mostly) made up of 3 existing electoral wards and range from around 30k to 50k residents.

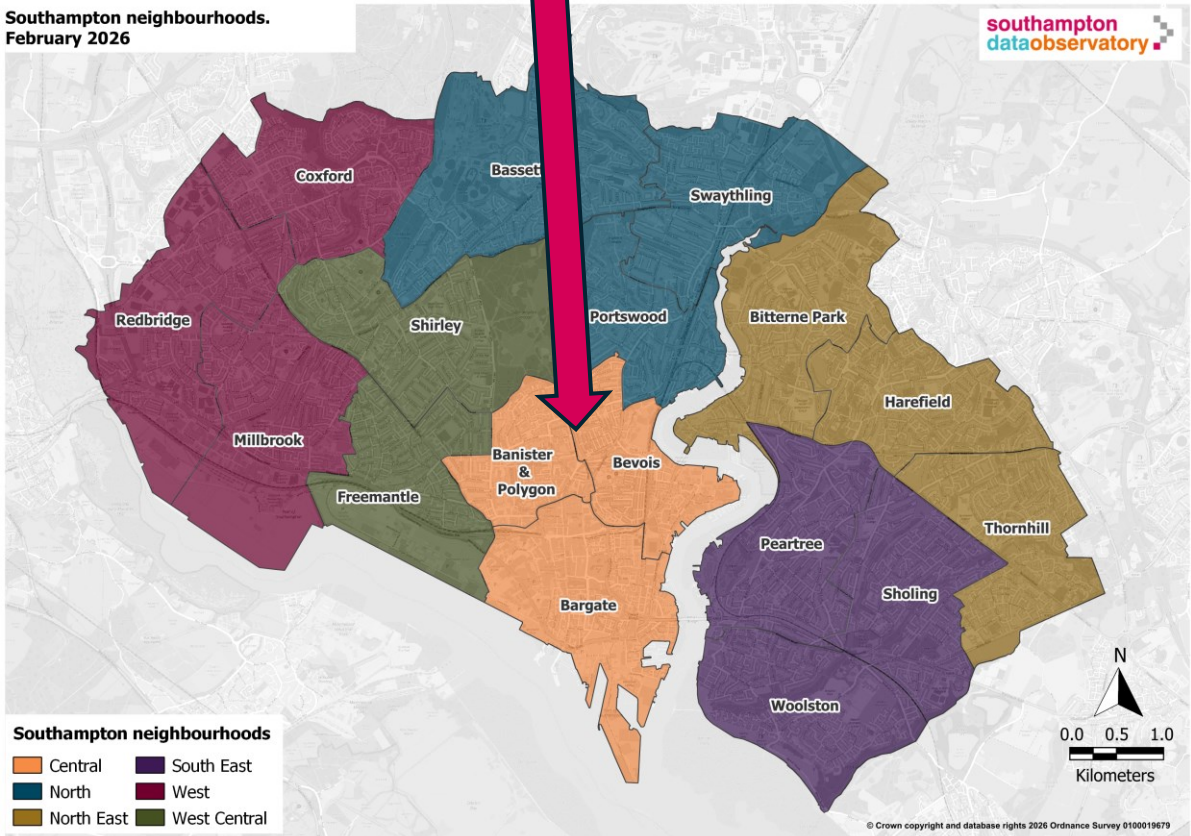
Each neighbourhood has been profiled based on its unique composition and need*. These needs will be used to prioritise and inform service delivery at a local level in Southampton.

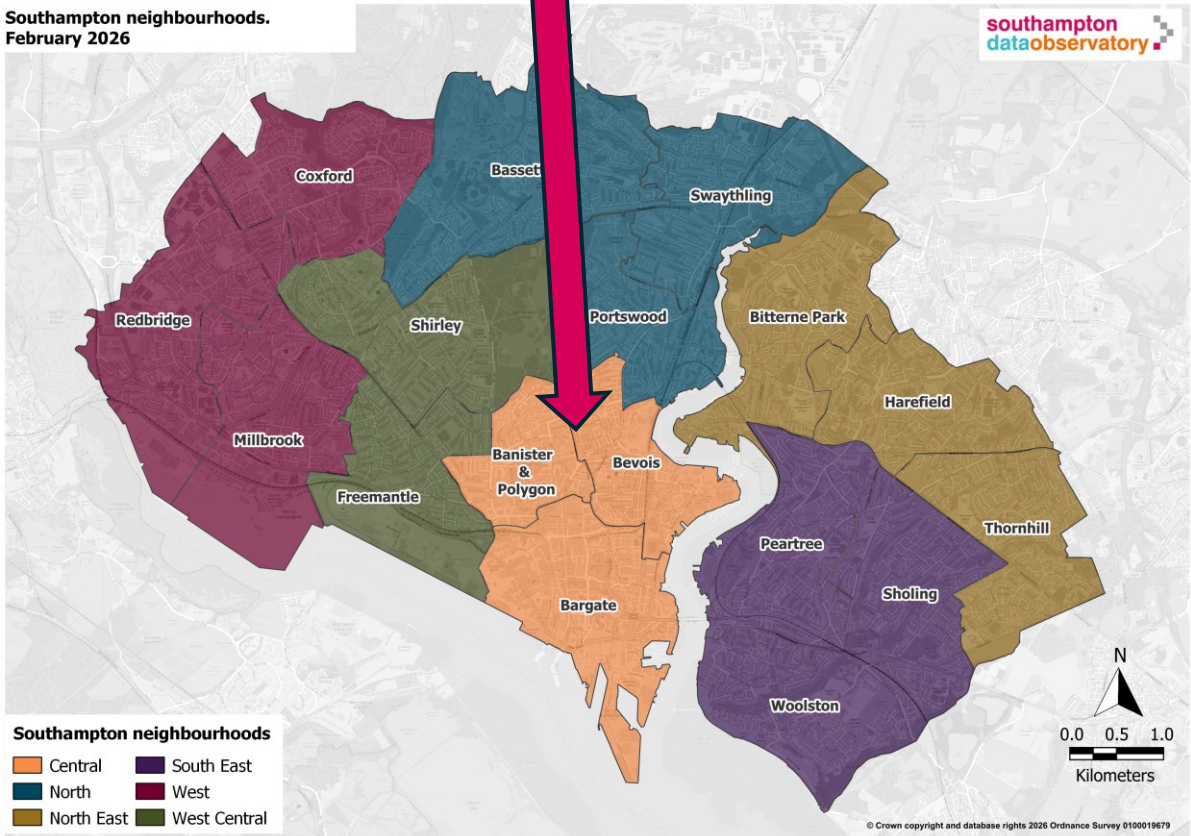

Central Neighbourhood

Pop: 53,459

Southampton's most populated neighbourhood. Central is culturally and ethnically diverse. The population is relatively young and well qualified (with a large student population) however unemployment is significantly higher than the city average. Crime is significantly higher here.

Central has some of the most deprived areas of the city. 29% of residents here live in IMD1 (England's most deprived 20% LSOAs). E01032755 in St Marys is the second most deprived LSOA in Southampton.

There is stark inequality within this neighbourhood, E01032748 (Town Quay and Ocean Village at the southern end of Bargate) is one of the least deprived LSOAs in Southampton.

This inequality is also evident in the different life expectancy rates for the wards that make up this neighbourhood. Bargate has the best life expectancy for males and females in the city while Bevois and Banister & Polygon are among the worst.

The population here is growing fast and is forecast to increase by more than 9,000 (17%) by 2030 (43% growth in the 65+ age group).

Central neighbourhood's wards mostly rank in the city's top 5, if not top 3, for many crime rates by ward. Bargate is 1st for all measures of crime in this table.

Central neighbourhood's wards are among the worst in the city for admissions involving drugs, Bevois has the worst rate in Southampton. Central neighbourhood covers the best and worst ward falls rates.

Central neighbourhood's wards cover the full range of life expectancy in the city.

Central neighbourhood contains two wards (Bargate and Bevois) in the top 5 for overall and persistent absence at primary, which are also in the lowest 5 wards for good levels of development. Bevois and Bargate wards are in the top 5 wards for higher SEN and FSM %s.

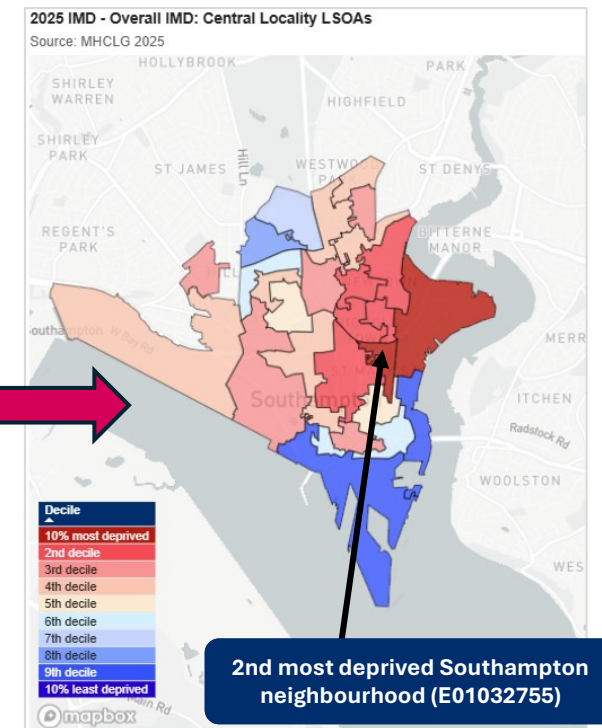


Central neighbourhood has the lowest rate of home ownership in the city (26%) and highest proportion private rented, more than half of homes here are privately rented (53%).

Bevois ranks 2nd lowest and Banister & Polygon 4th lowest for amount of greenspace.

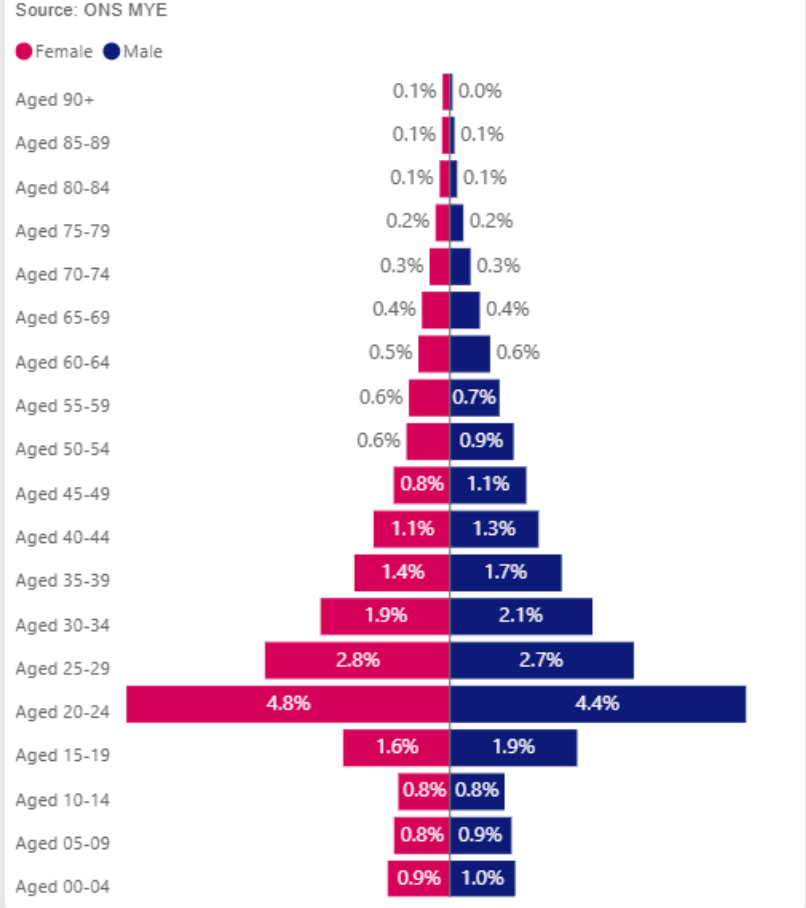

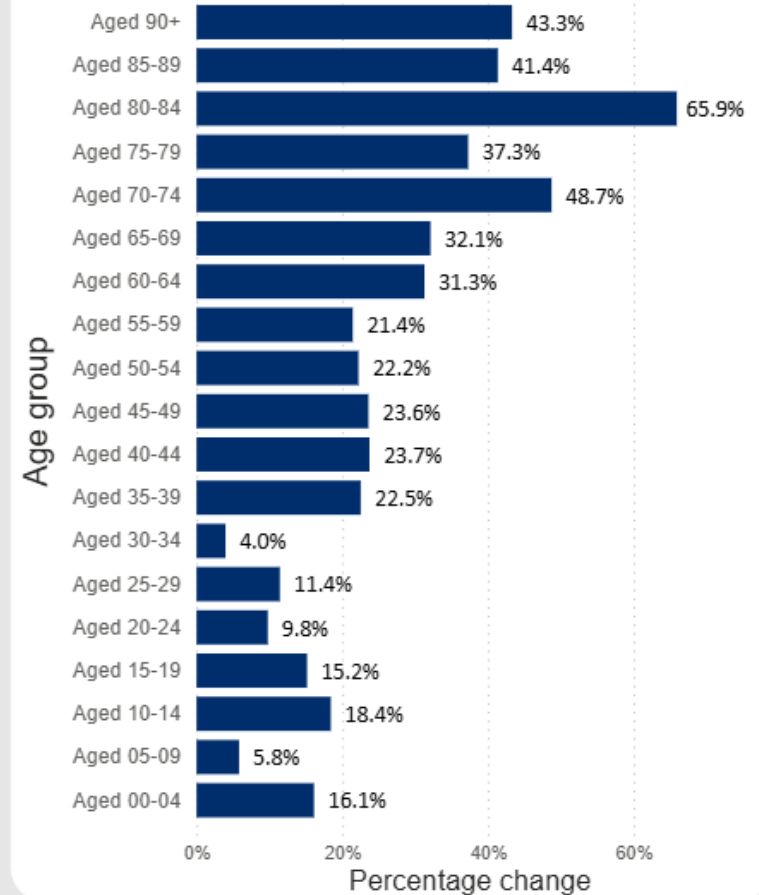

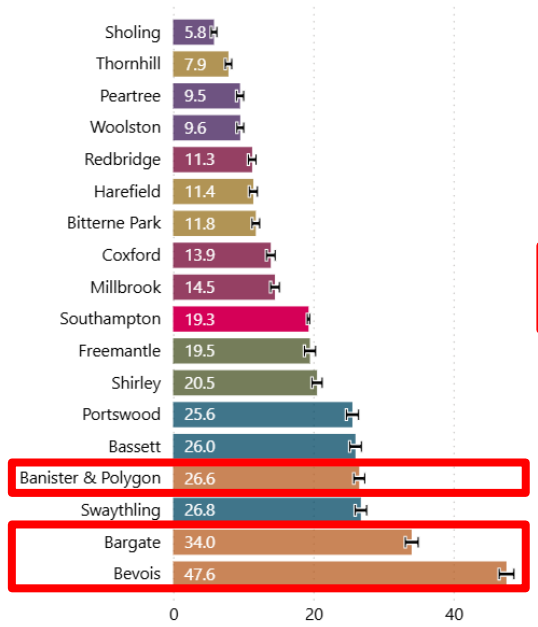

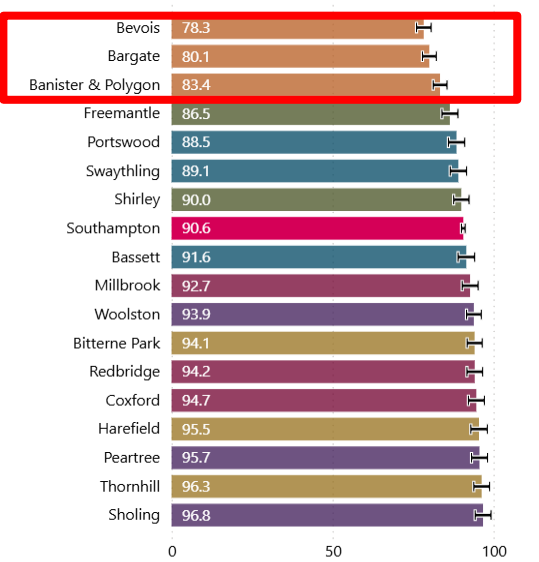

Percentage of households that have one or more persons with English as a main language by Ward: 2021



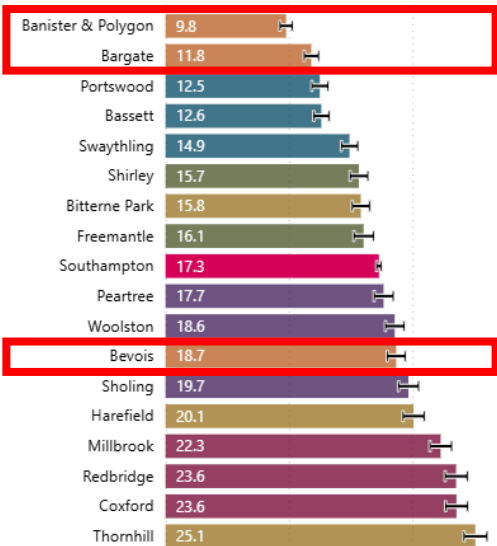

High ethnic and cultural diversity, with significant population change forecasted

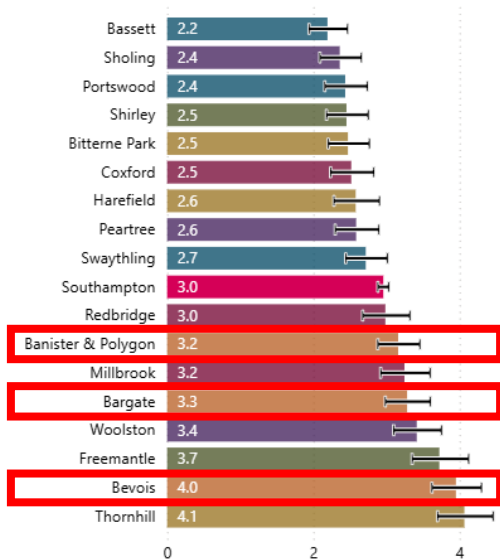
- Central neighbourhood has high ethnic and cultural diversity, with all 3 wards having a much higher proportion of minority ethnic residents than the Southampton average, with Bevois at nearly 50%. All 3 wards have the lowest percentage of households that have one or more persons with English as a main language.
- Central neighbourhood contains the wards with the highest percentages of population change forecasted across the different age groups.

A mix of unemployment levels and qualifications

- Banister & Polygon has a more stable working-age population with lower levels of unemployment and residents with no qualifications.
- Bevois in contrast faces a more pronounced disadvantage, higher unemployment among those economically active and large proportion with no qualifications. Qualifications will be impacted by student residents in Bargate and Banister & Polygon

Mix of health outcomes

- Bargate shows the strongest health outcomes, with life expectancy significantly higher than the city for both males and females and lower premature mortality, a likely reflection of a younger population and pockets of low deprivation.
- Bevois have notable health inequalities, with premature mortality significantly worse than the city average.
- Bargate has the highest life expectancy for both male and females, whilst Bannister & Polygon has the lowest for females, and Bevois has the lowest for males.

Different levels of vulnerability for hospital admissions

- Hospital admissions in Bannister & Polygon are higher for drug admissions and falls in ages 65+, but lower admissions for children’s injuries.
- Bargate has the lowest rate of fall admissions, a reflection of a high student population.
- Bevois has the highest hospital admission pressures of the 3 wards, particularly in drug poisoning admissions and falls in people 65+.

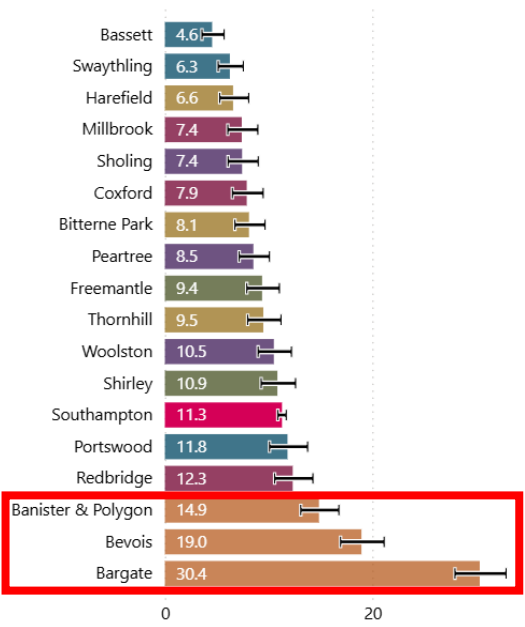

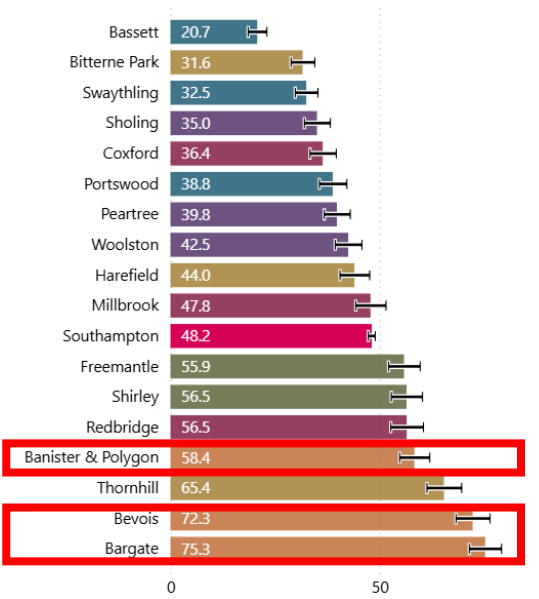

Rate of violent crime per 1k population by Ward: January 2023 - December 2023



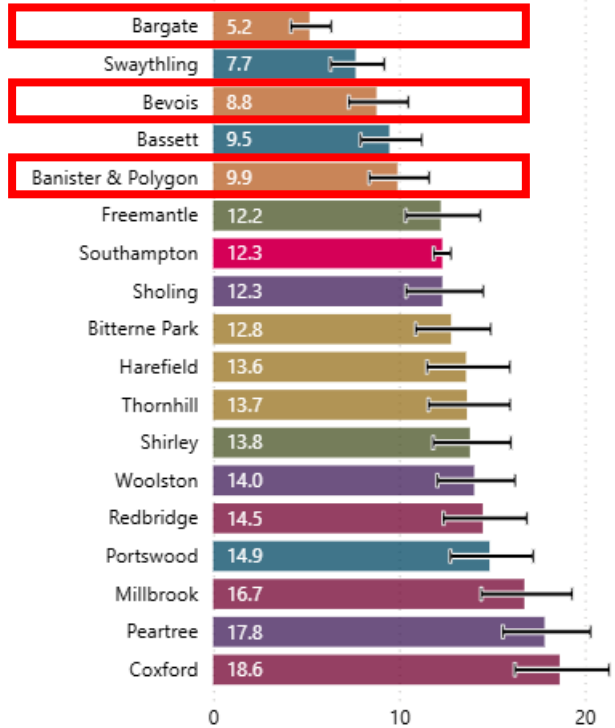

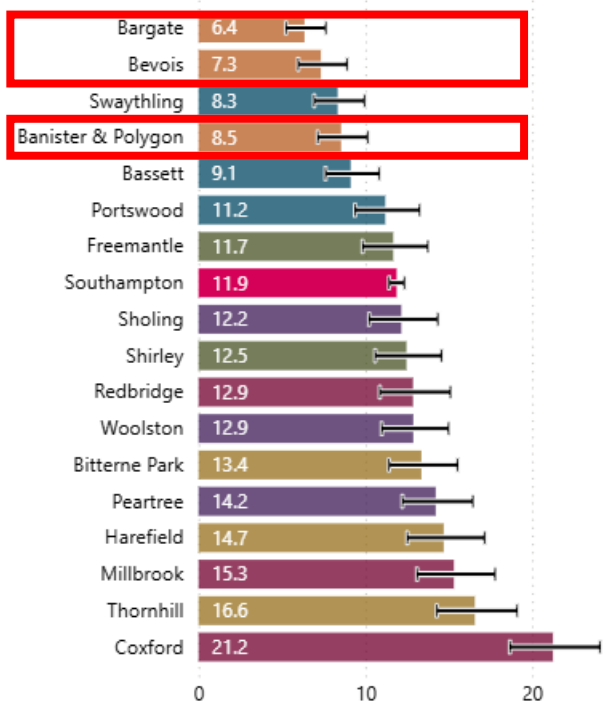

Rate of new care request contacts where one of the three outcomes was Care Act Assessment Required per 1k population aged 18+ by Ward: March 2023 - February 2024



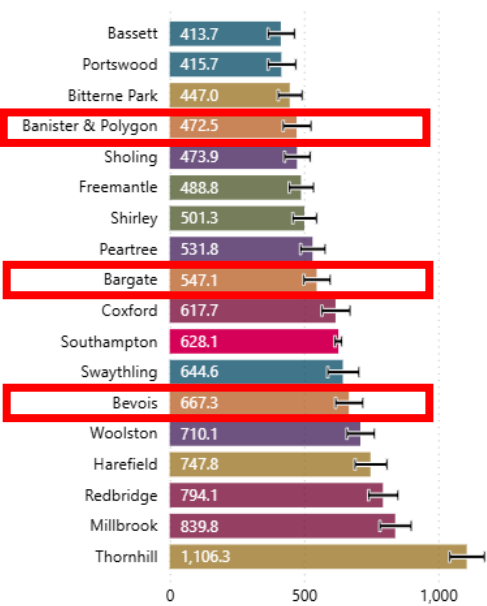

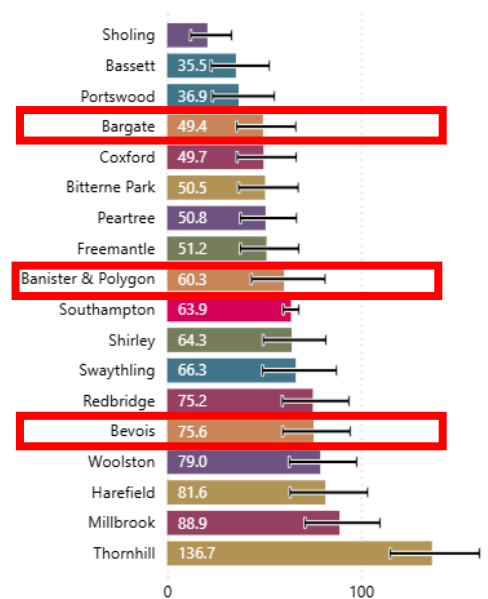

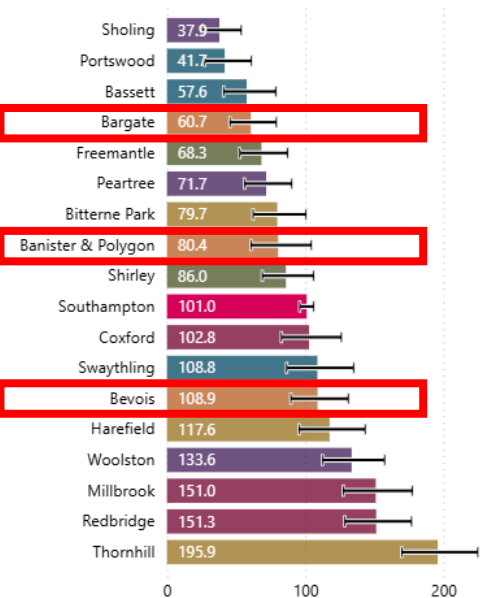
Rate of Children In Need per 10k 0-17 population by Ward: 2020/21 - 2022/23

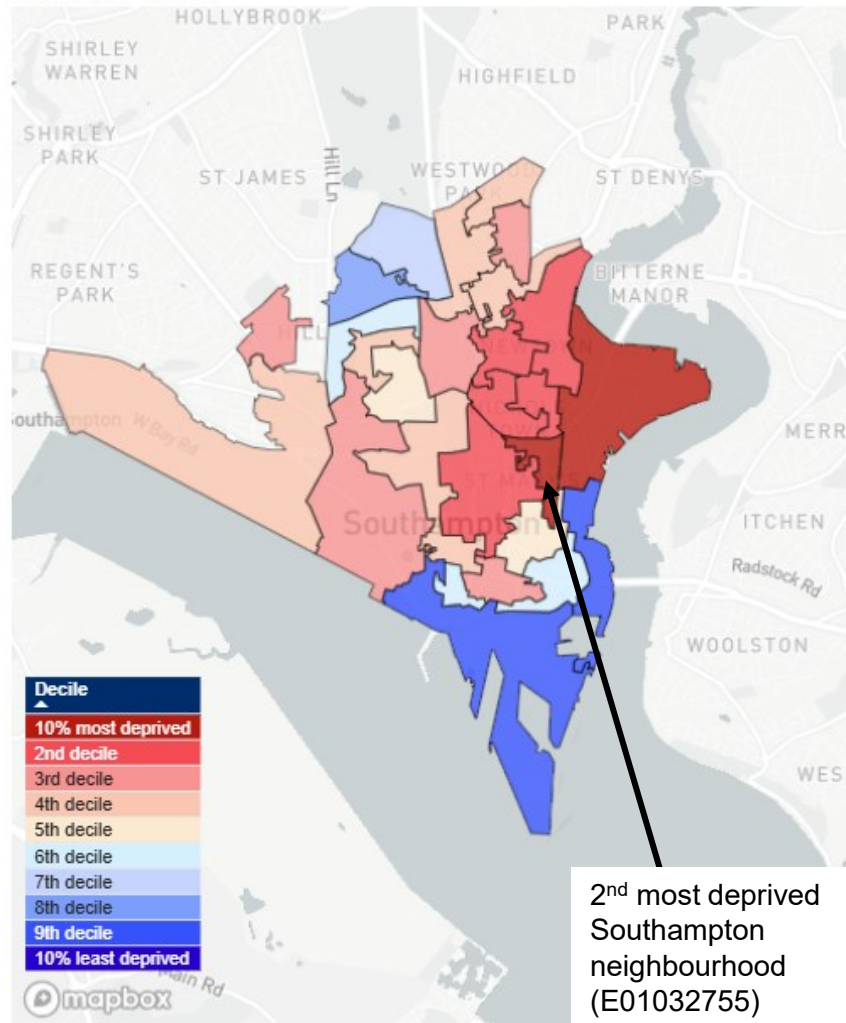
Mixed level of Children Social Care (CSC) involvement

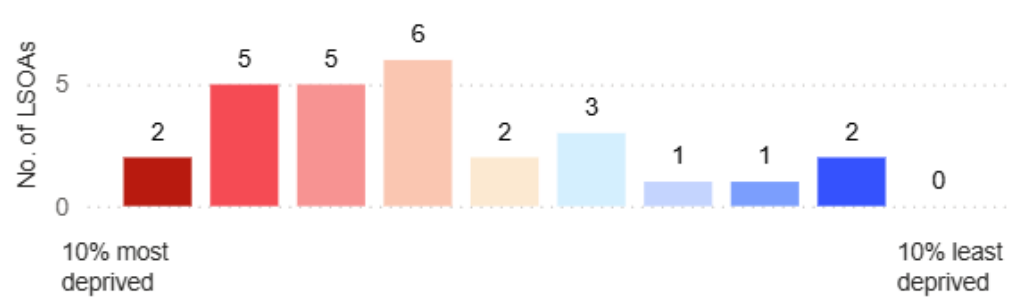


The map shows deprivation deciles by neighbourhood within the Central neighbourhood. There is a mixed picture across the area, with pockets of deprivation and affluence.

Number of LSOAs by decile - Central Locality: Overall IMD (2025)

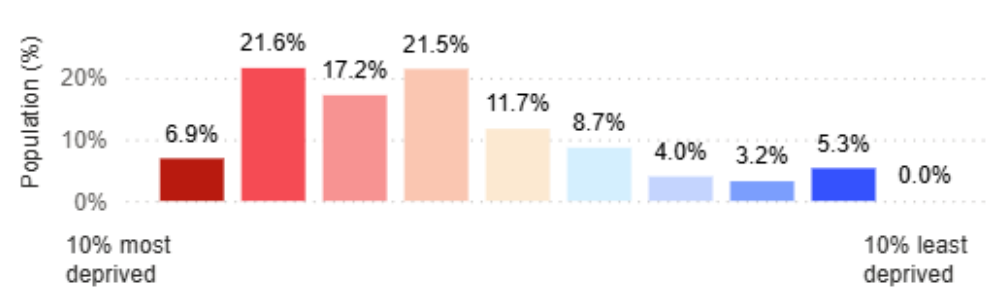

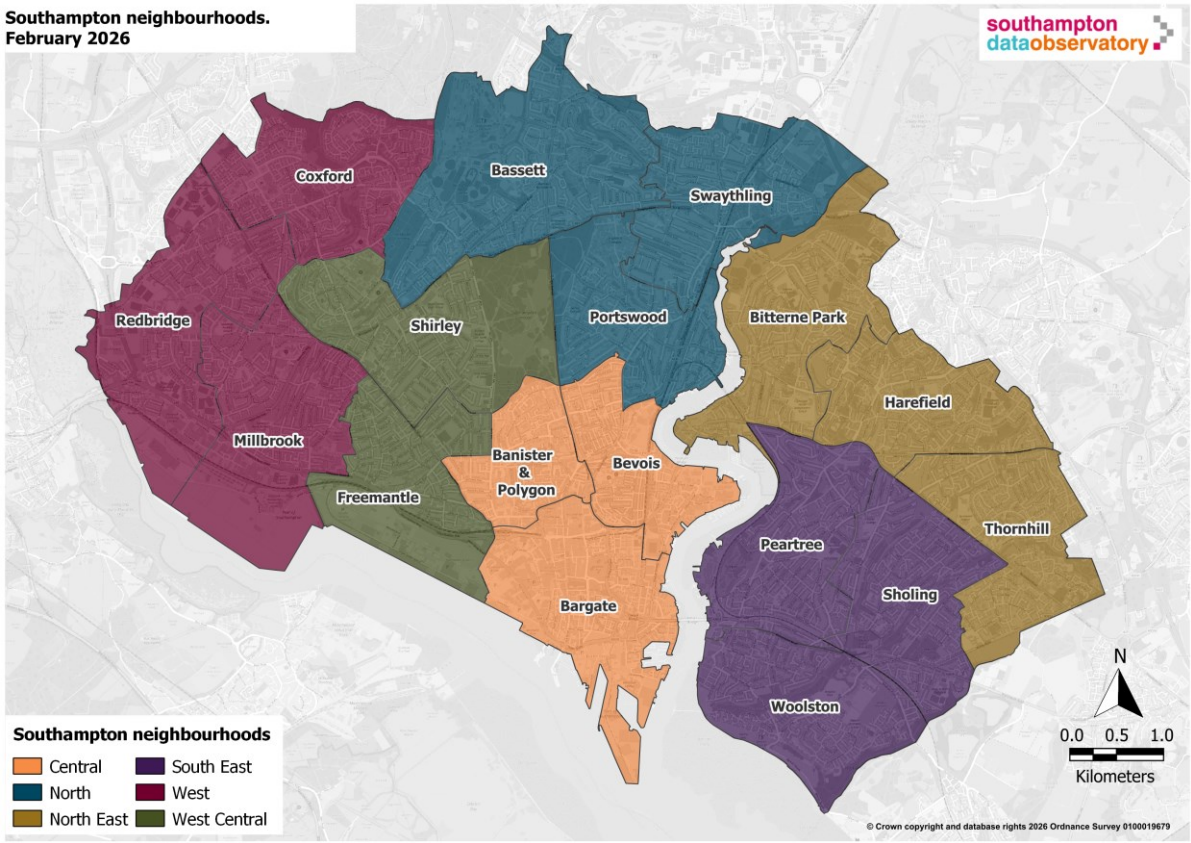


Housing tenure
