

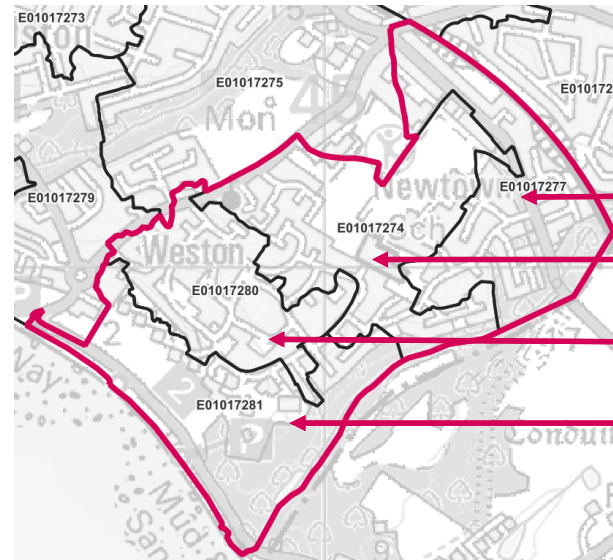
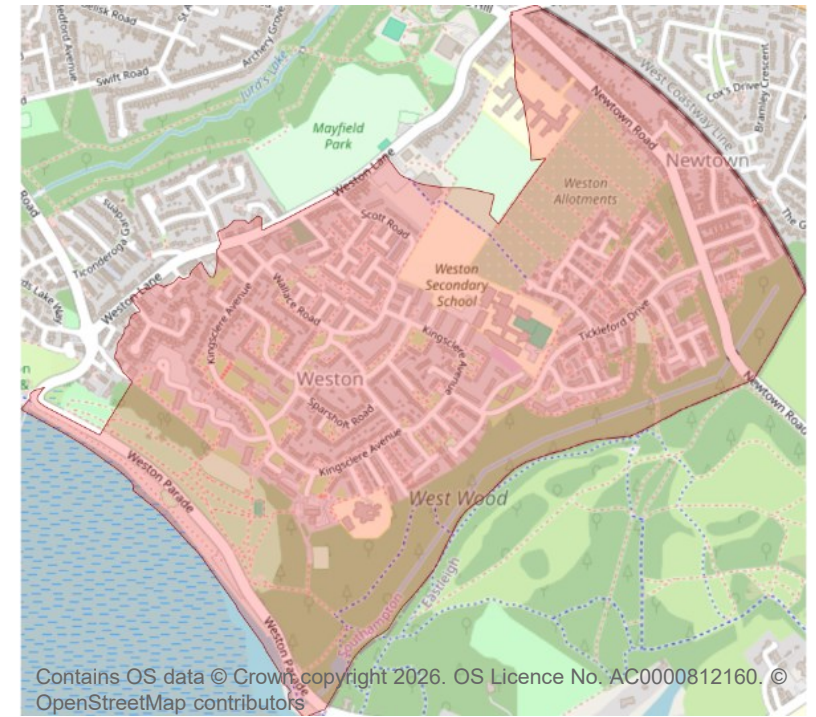

Key challenges for children include high child poverty (including free school meal eligibility), childhood obesity, school absence, rising demand for children’s social care, and child hospital admissions.



Challenges for adults include lower life expectancy, higher food costs, poor health and disability, increased hospital admissions and deaths linked to behavioural risks (smoking and alcohol), poor mental health, and social isolation.



More deprived (overall) with significant challenges in Education, Skills & Training and Crime and Income and Employment and Health & Disability domains

More adults have **low qualifications**. **Employment rates are lower**, with **more people out of work** or who have never worked. **Benefit reliance is higher** among both working and non-working adults.



Areas with **more social-rented housing**, typically EPC band C and built in the 1950s–1970s. Experience **higher rates of offences** including criminal damage and arson, other crime, weapons possession, and violence and sexual offences.

Profiles describe area-level patterns and do not reflect individual residents.

Population in Weston

Nearly a quarter of Weston's population (24%) are aged 0 to 15 years, higher percentages are under 10 years, suggest a higher number of families

Around 1 in 5 (22%) of residents are aged 30 to 44 years, making this age group more common among working-age residents

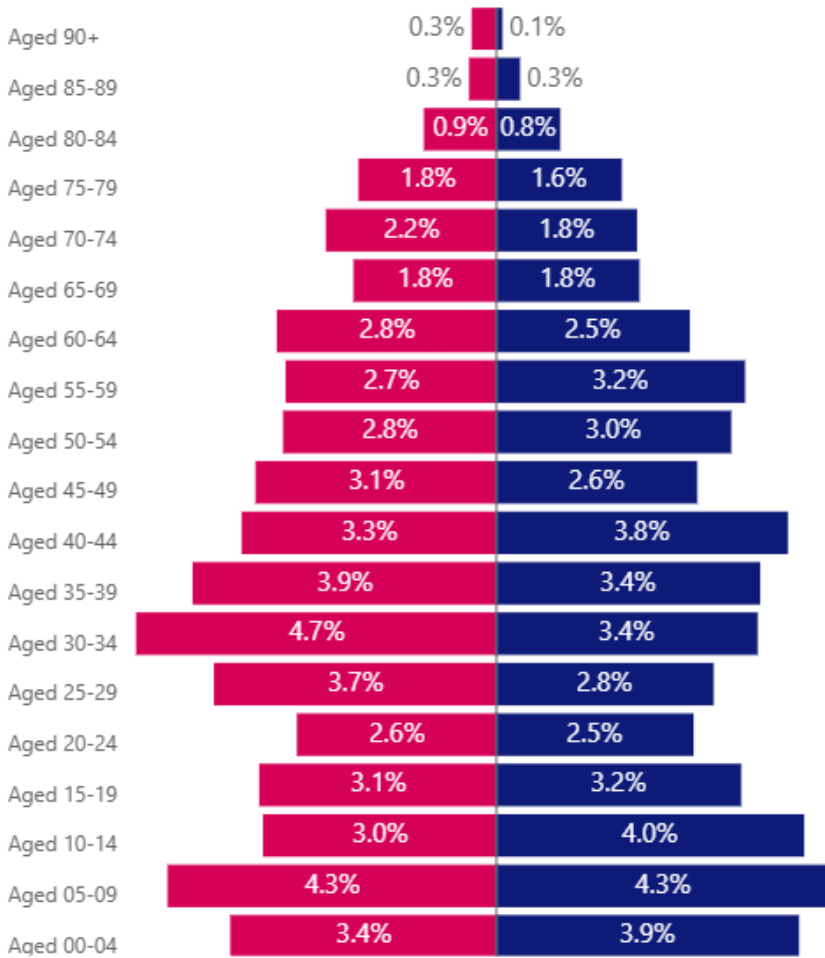
Around 1 in 7 or 14% of residents are aged 65+, by 5 year age band, this tails off as numbers approach 75 years (male life expectancy) and 80 years (female life expectancy)

76.58% of residents live in IMD1 (England's most deprived 20% LSOAs).

Weston is set to have a growing population across all age groups but particularly in those aged 65+ where demand for health and social care will greatest

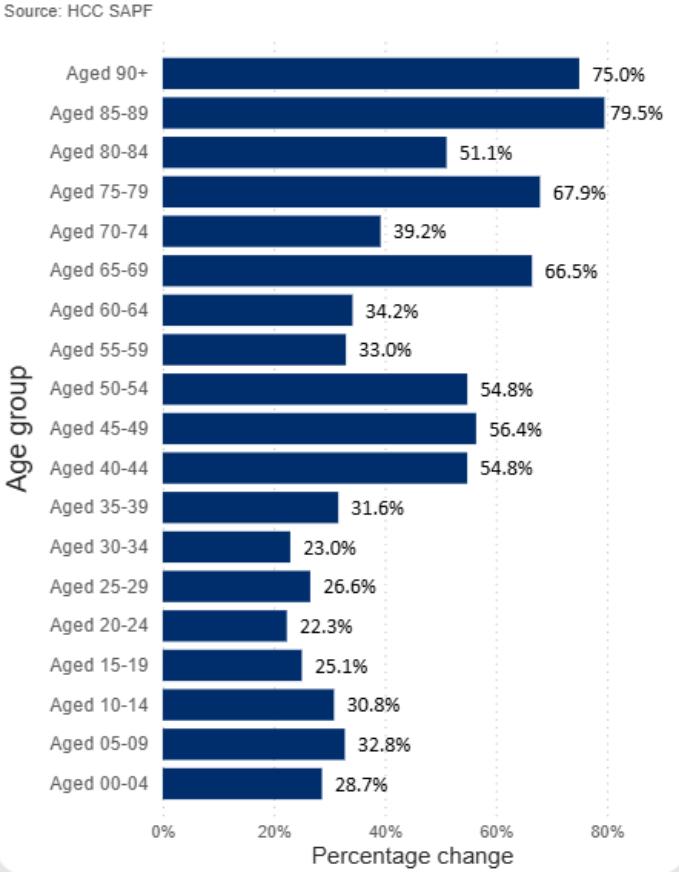

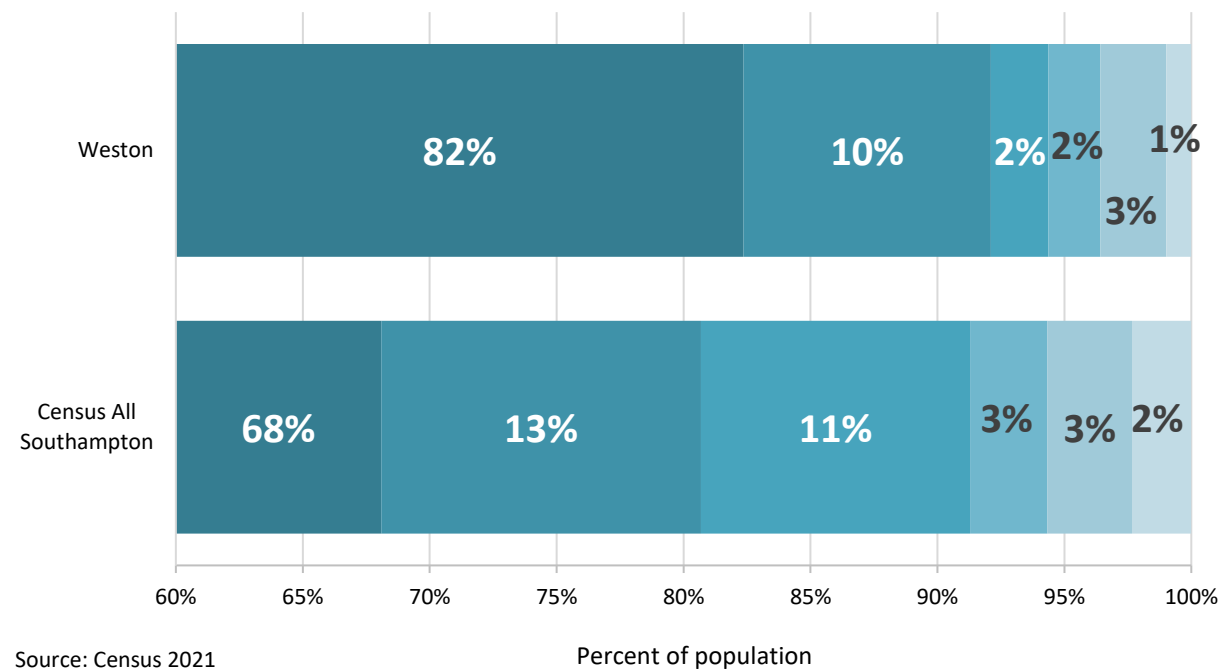

Eight out of 10 people in Weston are White British, higher than 7 out of 10 for the city. Weston has a lower percentage of White other (10%) than the city average (13%)

Weston – Children & Young People



Weston MSOA has the **highest fertility rate** of all 33 MSOAs in the city; 71.4 per 1k, **significantly higher** than Southampton (48.3 per 1k) and England (54.6 per 1k)

In Weston, **1 in 10 live babies** (9.6%) are **low birth weight, significantly worse** than 1 in 14 for both Southampton (7.1%) and England (6.8%), ranking Weston **4th worse MSOA**

Weston has **higher rates of childhood obesity** than Southampton and England. **Overweight including obese % in Year R** is both **significantly higher** in Weston than Southampton and England averages, ranking **4th in the city's 33 MSOAs**

Weston has **significantly higher rates** than England and Southampton for children and young people admissions; ranked **worst** in the city for all cause emergency admission in under 5 years. For **Unintentional and deliberate injuries** emergency admissions, Weston is the **4th worst** for under 5s, **3rd worst** for under 15s and **9th worst** for 15 to 24 yrs.

Weston – Adult Hospital Admissions



Out of the 31 MSOAs where emergency admission rates were available, **Weston** has the **2nd highest** rate in the city for **all cause** and **stroke** admissions, the **3rd highest** rate for **COPD** and **self-harm**.

Behavioural risk factors play a large part in the prevention of most of these admissions with **smoking, obesity** and a **poor diet** being **major risk factors**.

Intentional self harm is linked with importance of **good mental health** and **well-being**

Males and females in Weston have significantly lower life expectancy (75.2 years and 80.0 years respectively) than for the city average (78.1 years and 82.3 years) or the England average (79.1 years and 83.0 years)

Weston males die 2 years 10 month before the average Southampton male and 3 years 11 month before the average England male. Weston females die 2 years 3 months before the average Southampton female and 3 years before the average England females

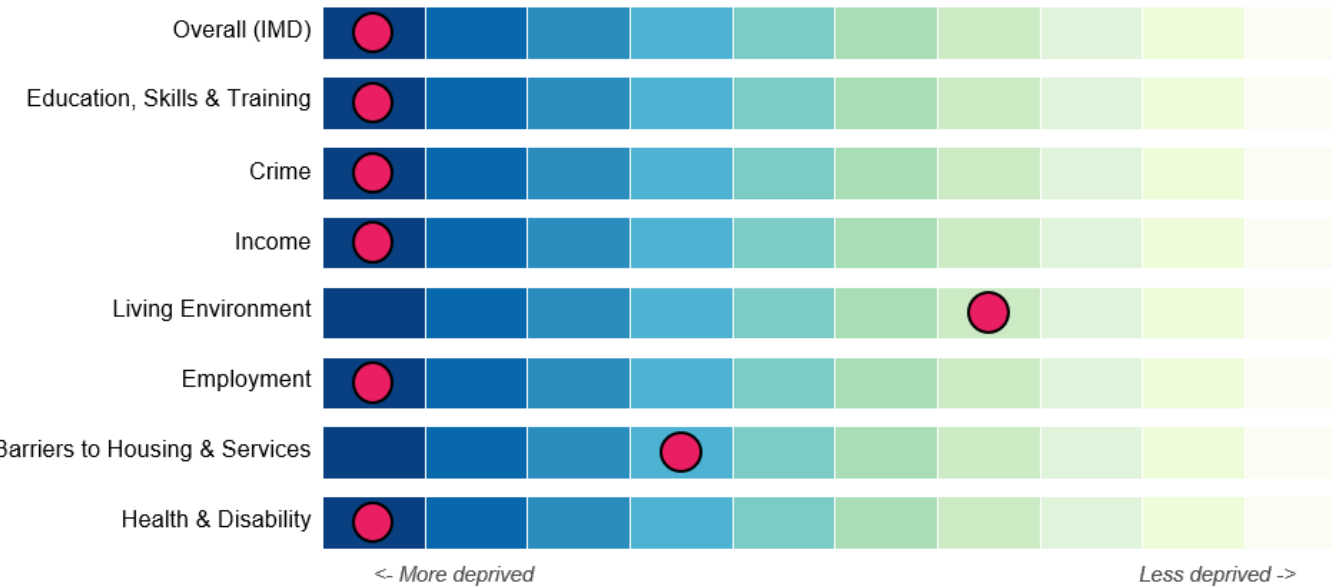
Weston's rate of deaths from different causes ranges from 1.4x to 1.8x higher than England

Weston ranks in the top 20% highest death rates for the 33 MSOAs, with higher rates for deaths in those under 75 years including specifically U75 cancer deaths (1.6x higher than England rate) and U75 cardiovascular deaths (1.6x higher than England rate).

Weston is also the 2nd highest in the city for all age cancer deaths (1.5x higher than England rate) and the 4th highest for all age respiratory deaths (1.8x higher than England)

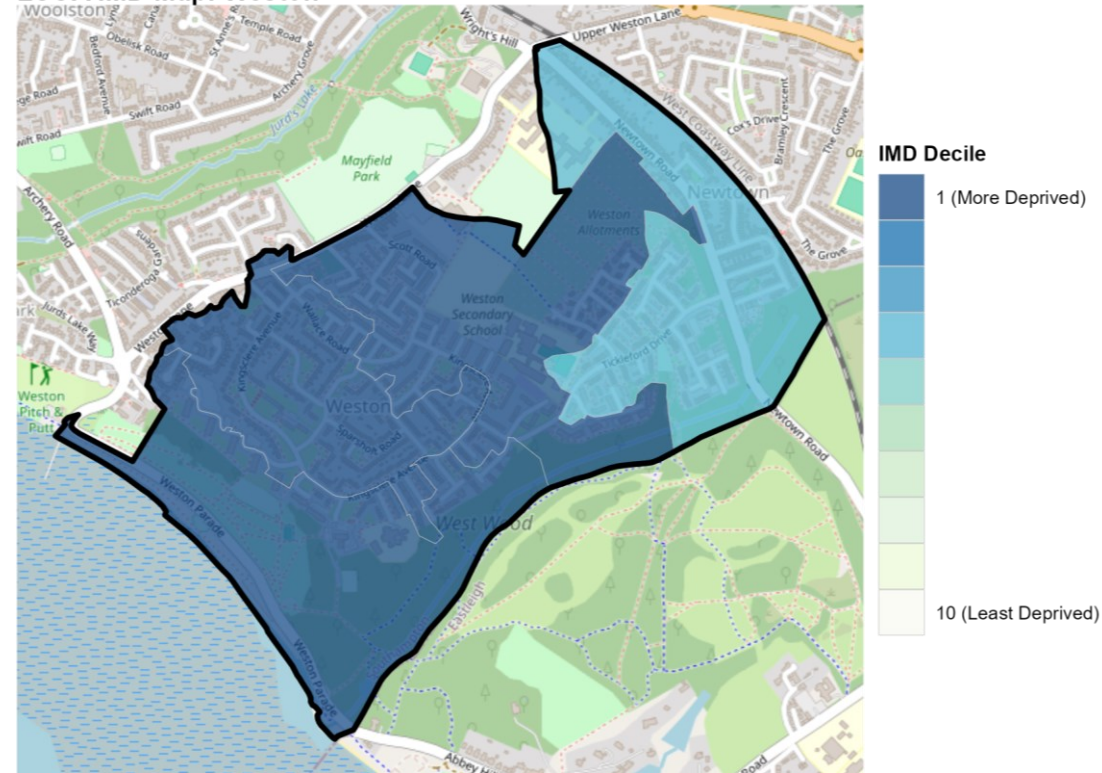
Deprivation - MSOA



Weston comprises of 4 LSOAs. Overall, these fall into Decile(s) 1 (3x LSOA) and 4 (1x LSOA). The area faces significant challenges in Education, Skills & Training and Crime and Income and Employment and Health & Disability

This chart illustrates the relative level of deprivation for Weston in comparison to all other MSOAs nationally. Scores range from 1 (most deprived) to 10 (least deprived) across various domains. These figures have been recalculated and population-weighted from the standard LSOA-level Index of Multiple Deprivation to provide an aggregated MSOA score.

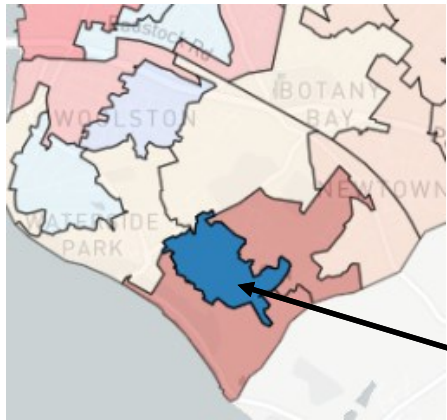

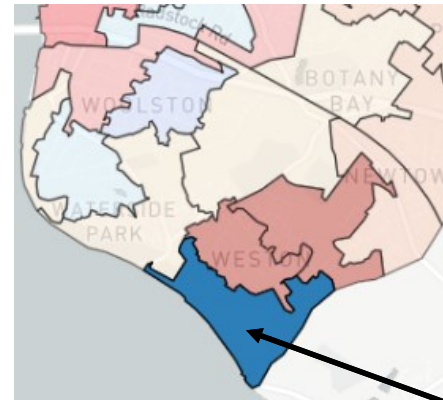

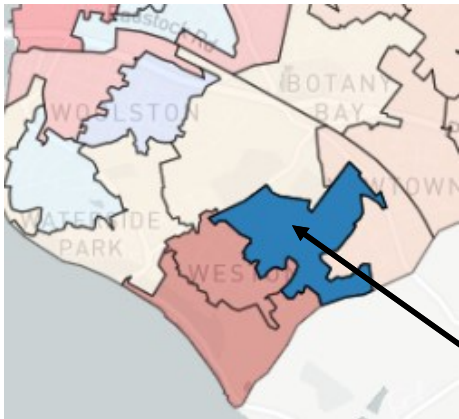

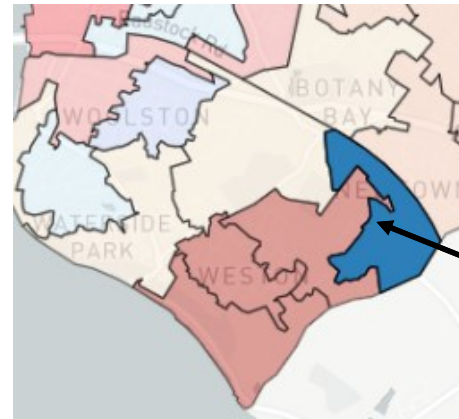

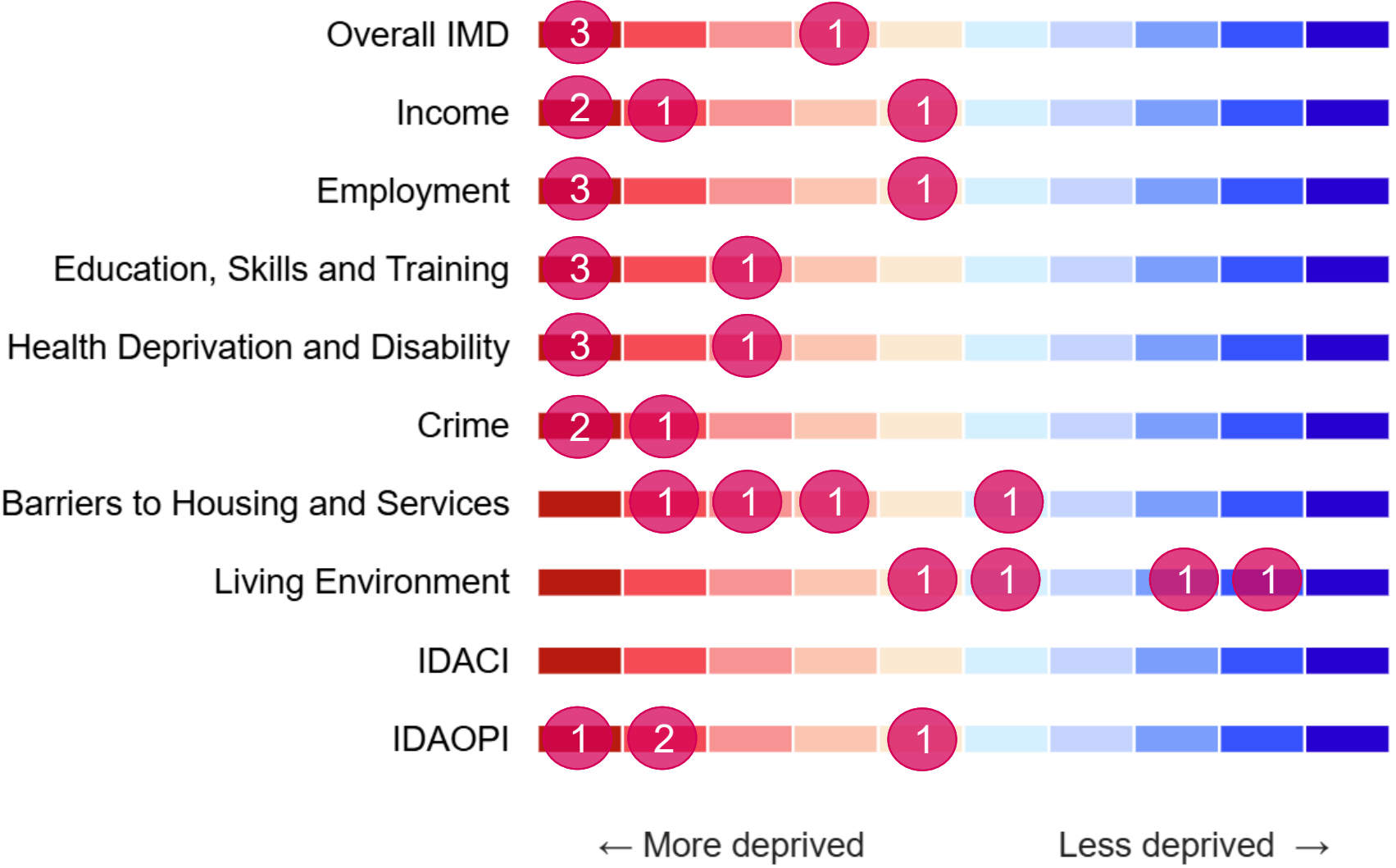

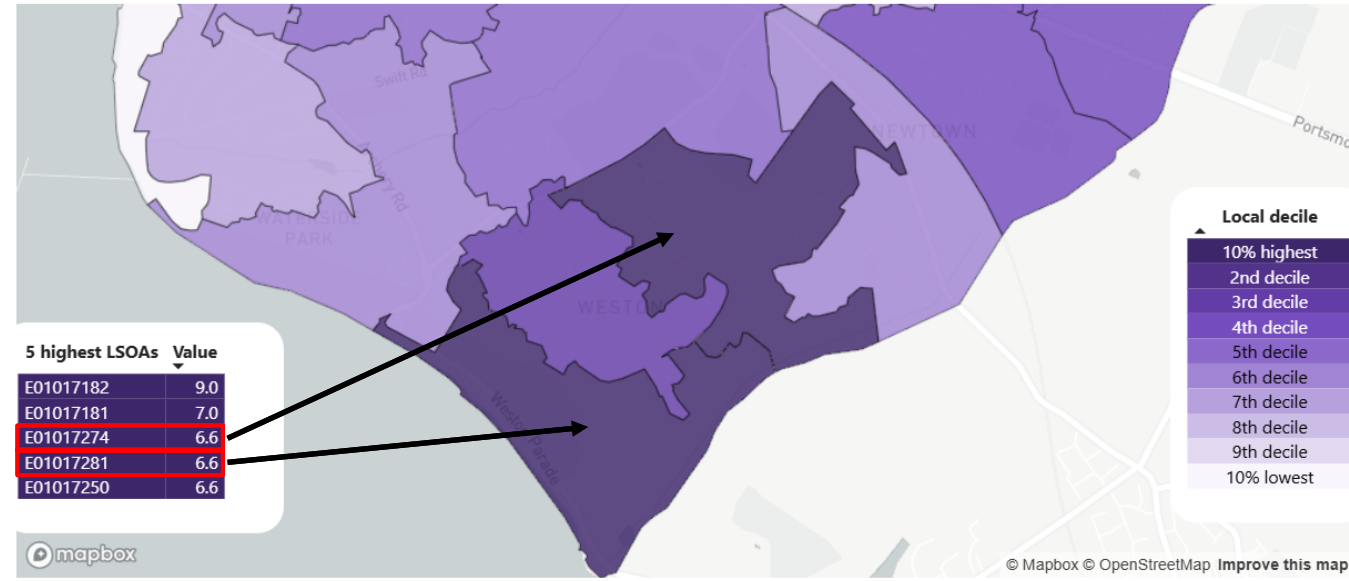

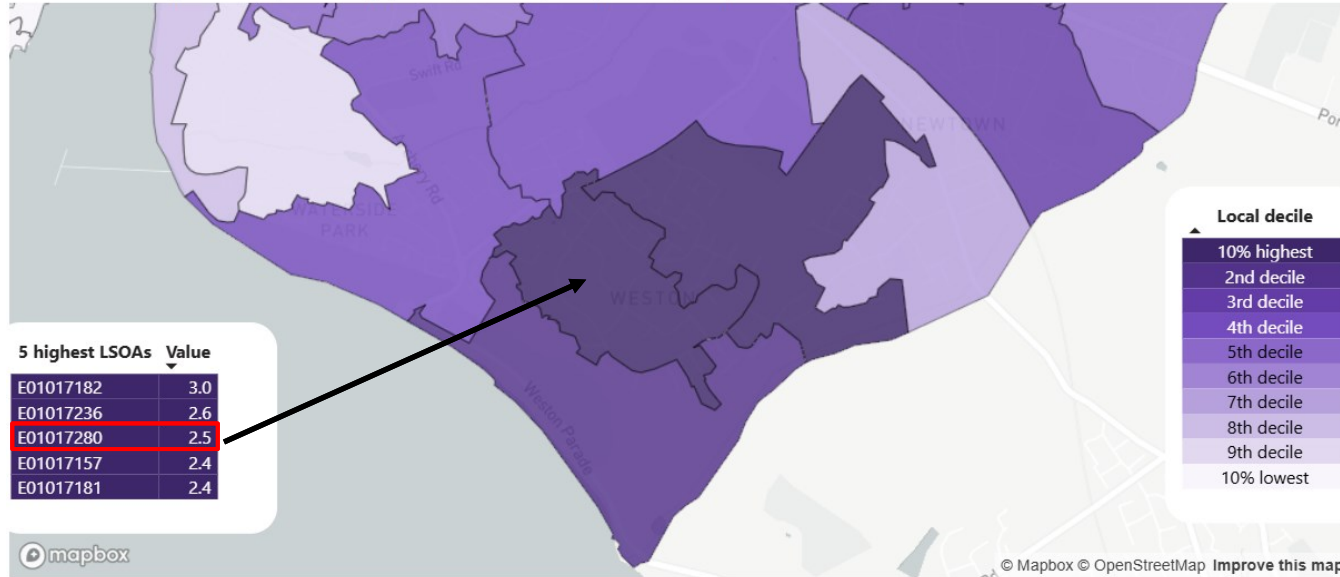

General health: Very bad health, deciles of population, Southampton by lower layer super output areas (LSOAs): Census 2021

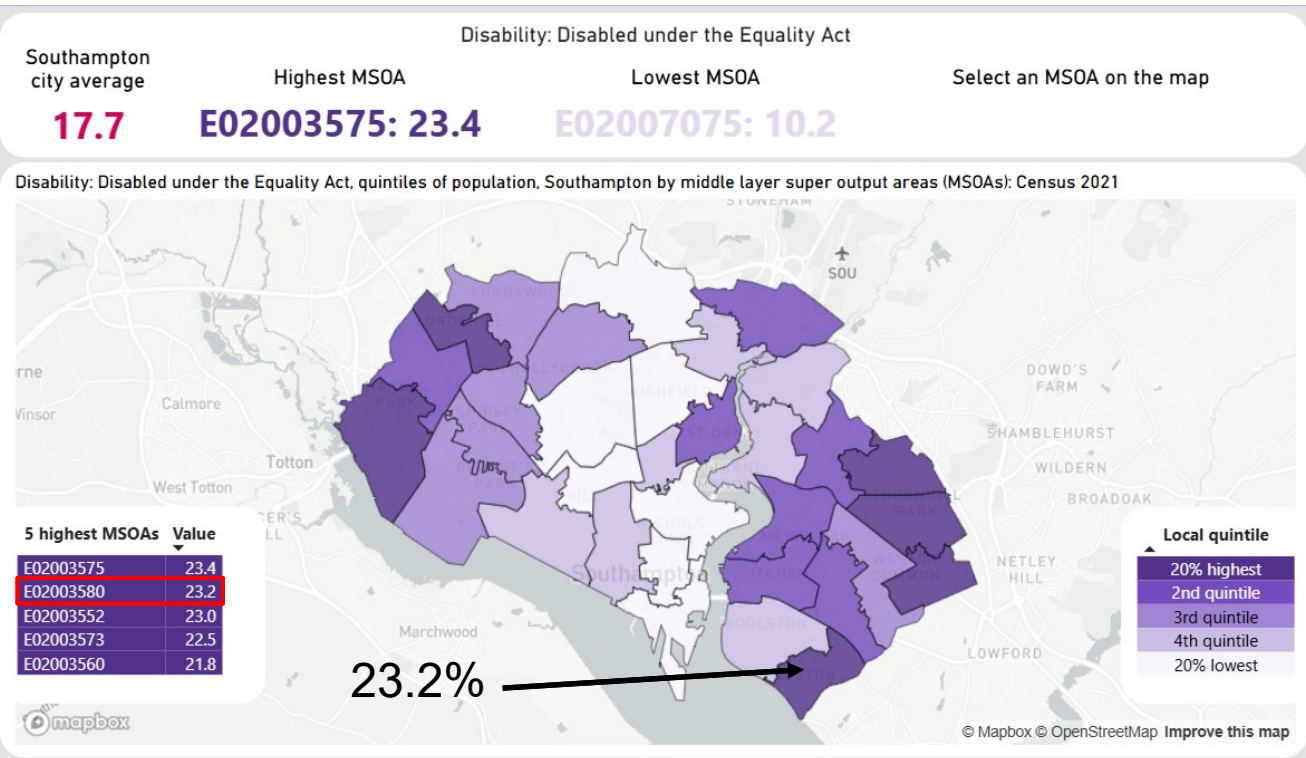

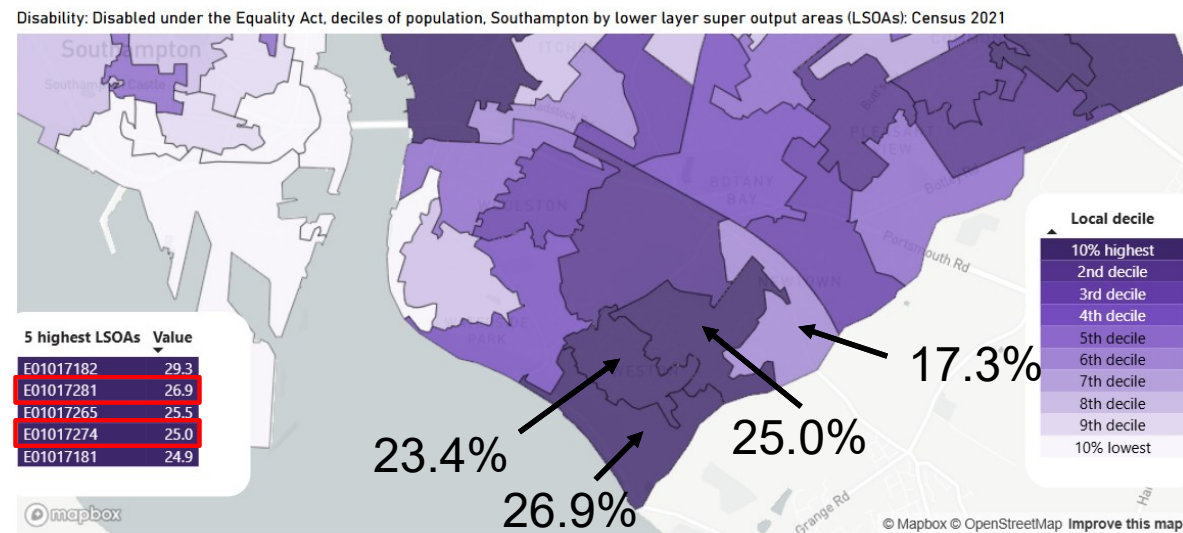

2 of the 4 LSOAs in Weston are in the **top 5** across Southampton.

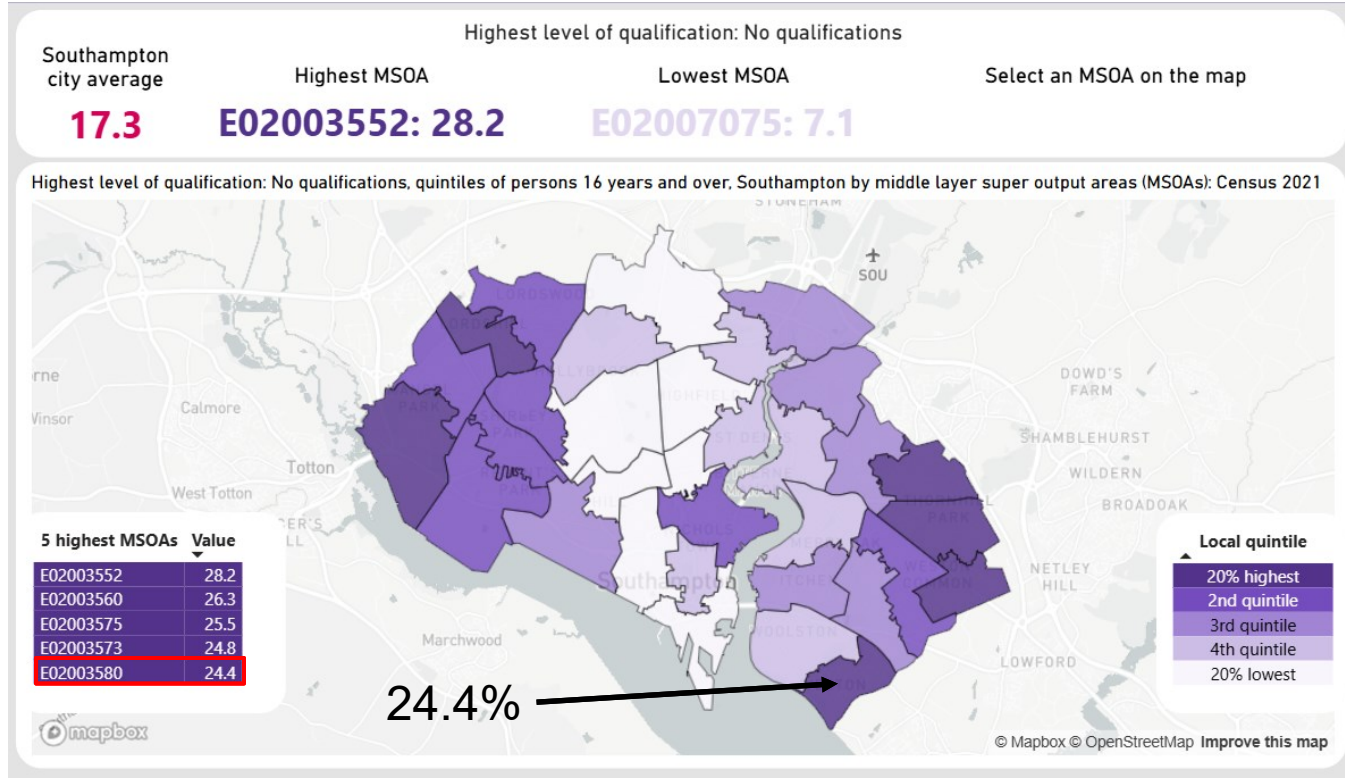

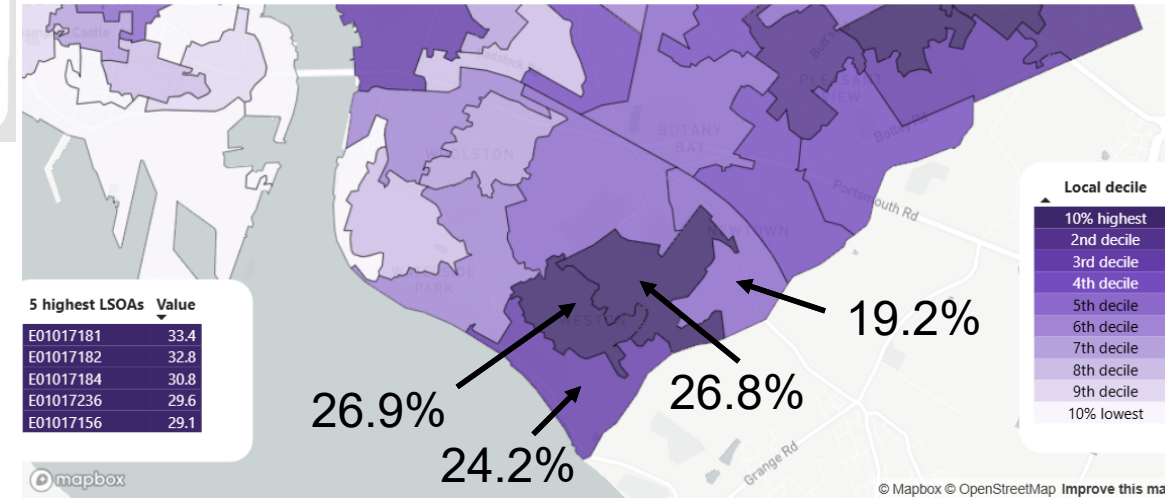

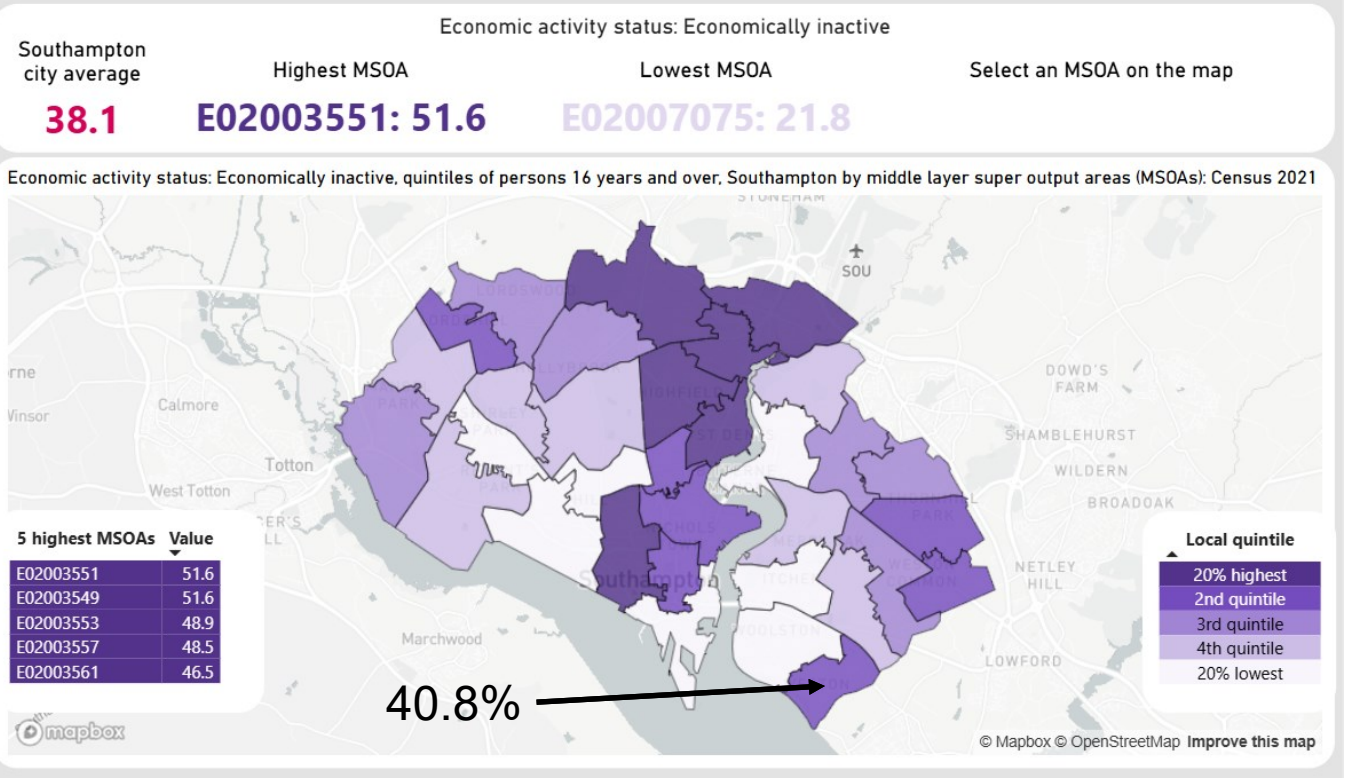

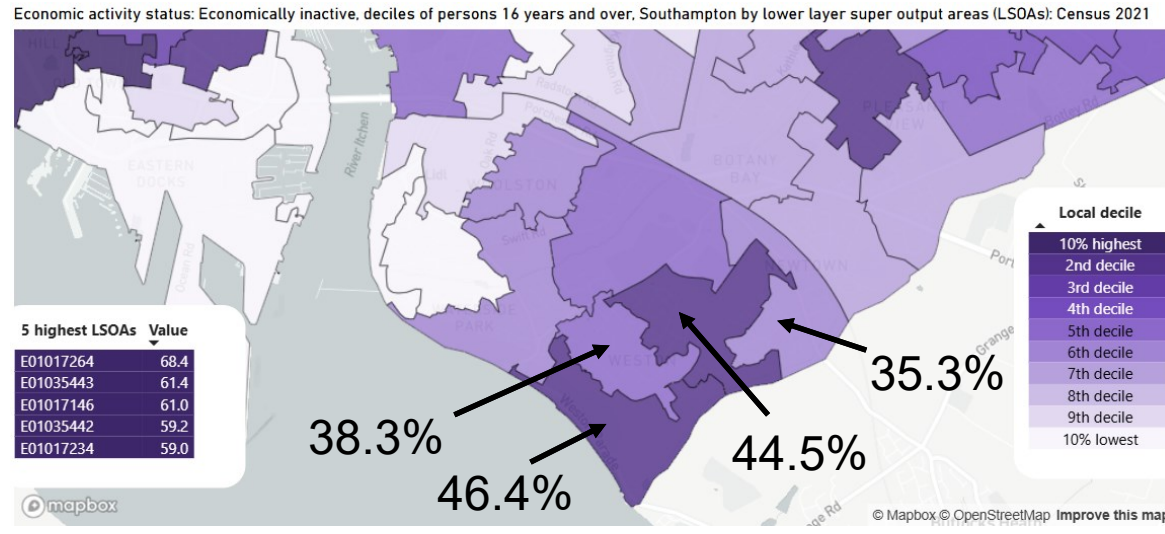

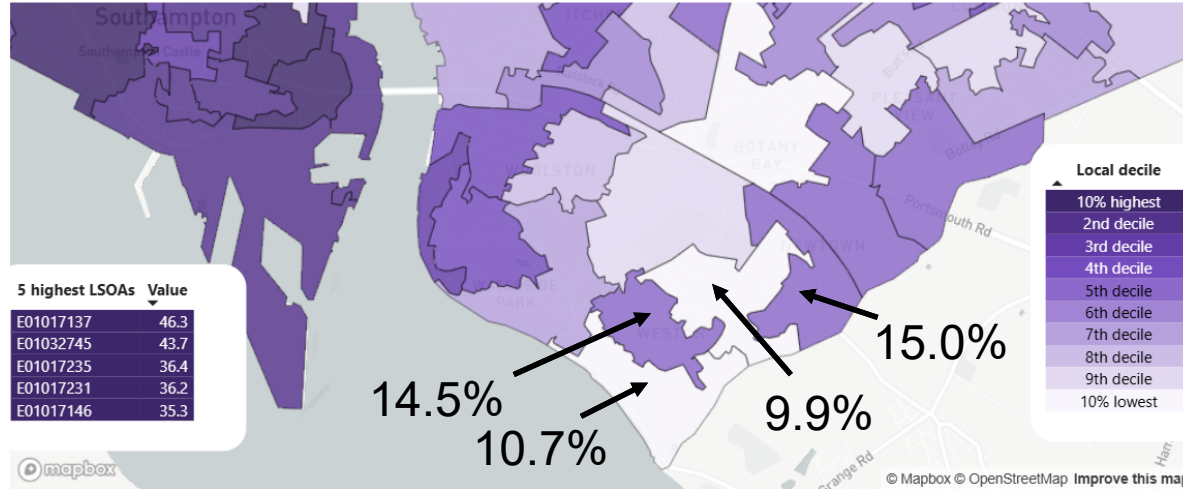

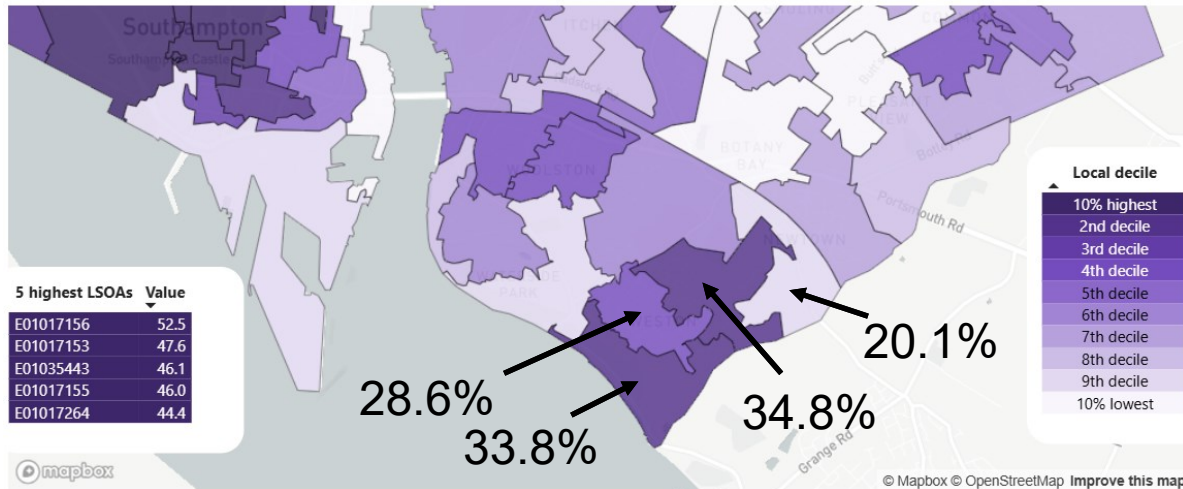

Of Weston residents that are **not in employment**, **12.5% worked in the last 12 months**, significantly lower than the Southampton average of **18.8%**.

57.8% of those not in employment **did not work in the last 12 months**, significantly higher than the Southampton with **53.2%**.

29.7% of unemployed residents **never worked**, higher, but not significantly than Southampton (**27.9%**).

The **same 2 LSOAs** in Weston are in the **2nd decile** for highest percent of residents who are not in employment have **never worked** and the **10% lowest decile** for having worked in the last 12 months.

Overall, this points to **longer periods out of employment** among Weston residents, highlighting the need for **sustained employment and health-related support**.

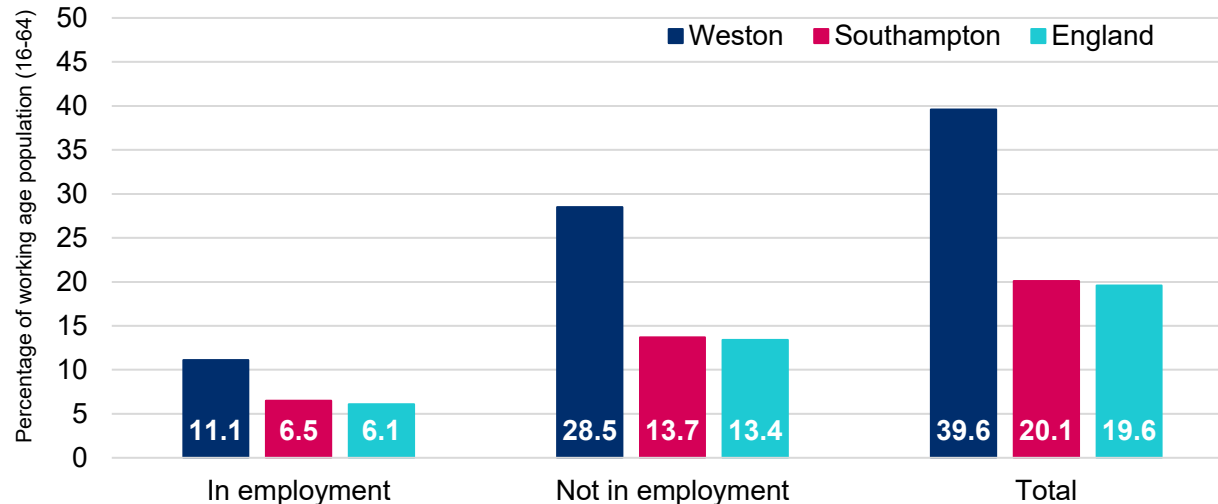

Universal Credit claimant rates in Weston are **substantially higher** than both Southampton and England averages. Nearly **2 in 5 working age residents (39.6%)** are claiming Universal Credit, compared with **20.1%** across Southampton and **19.6%** England.

Universal Credit claims among those in **employment (11.1%)** are **almost double** the Southampton and England rates, indicating a **high prevalence of in-work poverty**.

Rates among working age residents **not in employment (28.5%)** are also **more than twice** the city and England averages.

Together, this highlights **significant financial vulnerability in Weston**, affecting both working and non-working households.

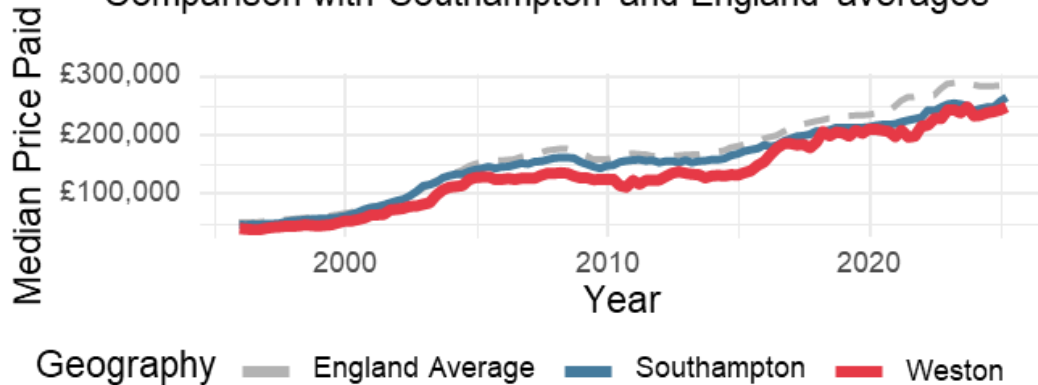
Housing tenure

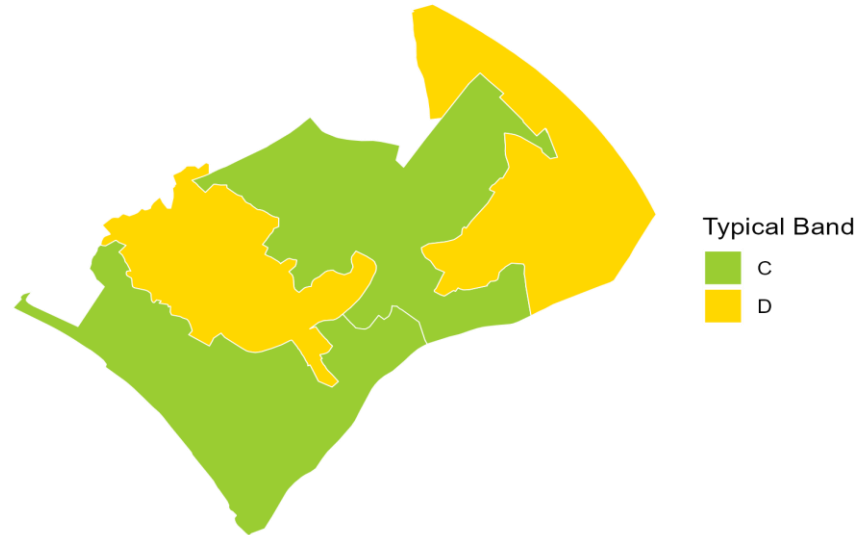

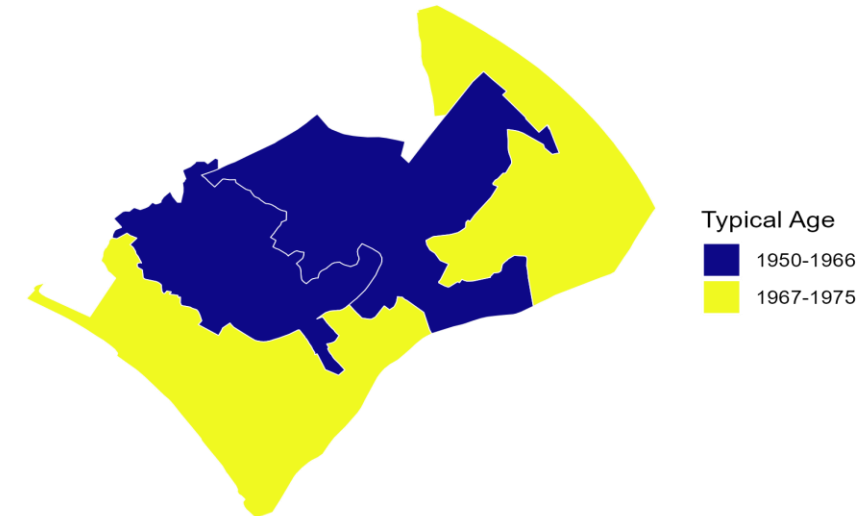

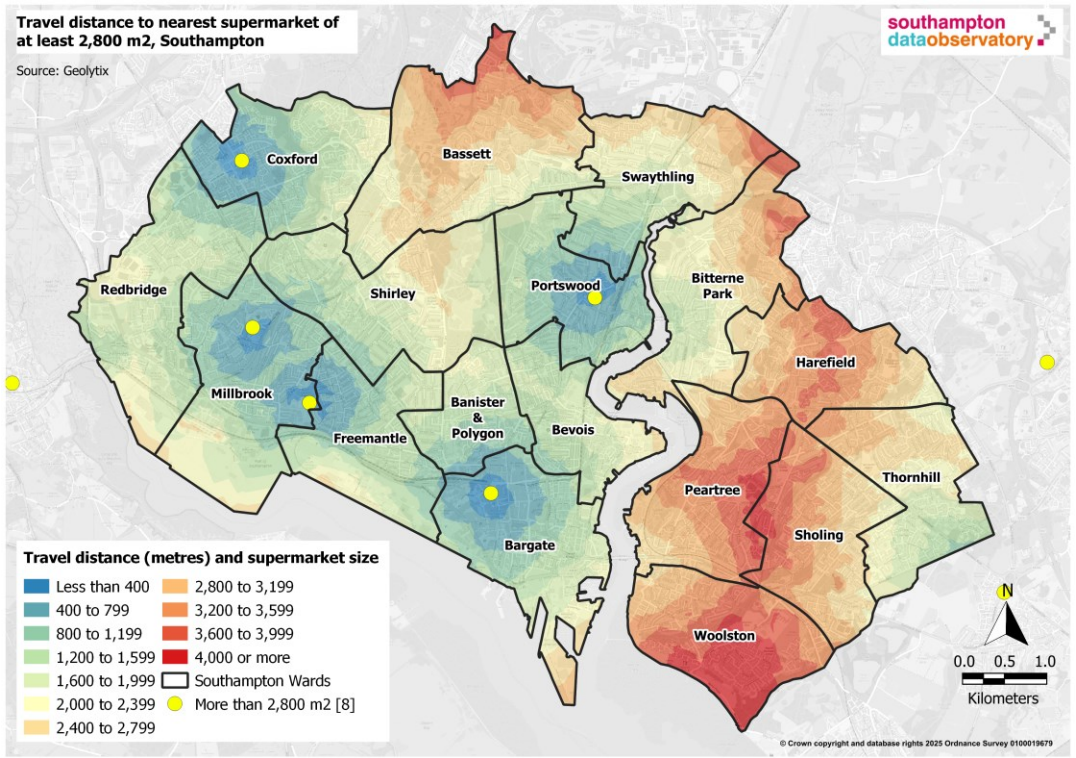
Most Common Property Age

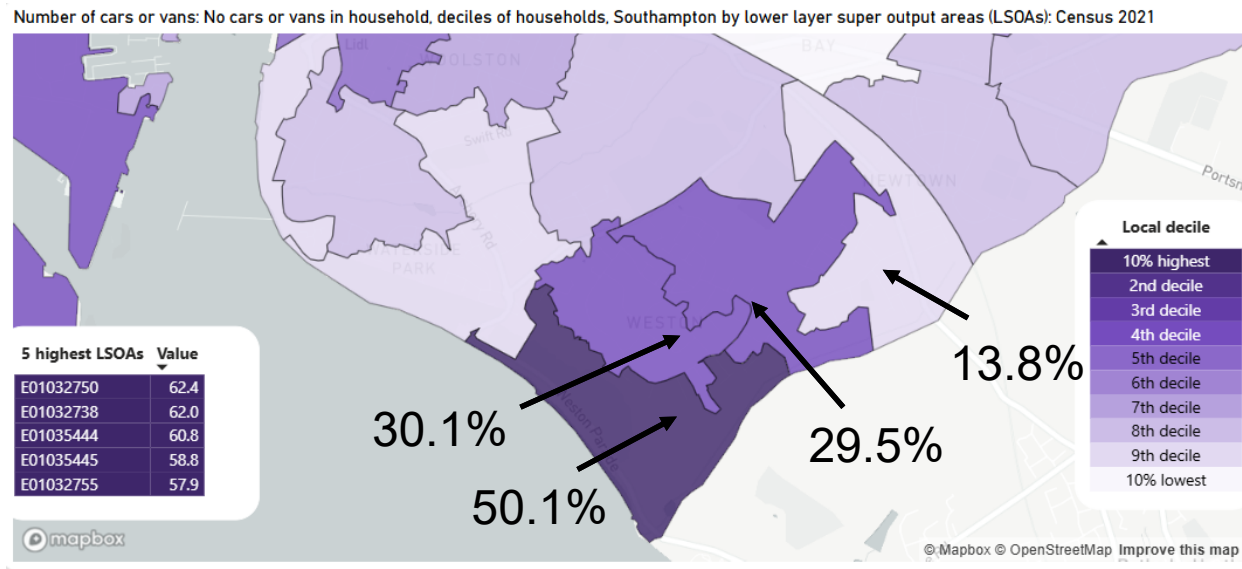
Weston does have faster travel times than the England average to access to Food Store, GP Surgery, Primary School however access to cheaper healthier food is worse.



The most popular employment destination for residents in Weston is City Centre & The Polygon (Southampton) (21.9%), followed by St Mary's (Southampton) (18.1%) which are within a 20 minute journey time

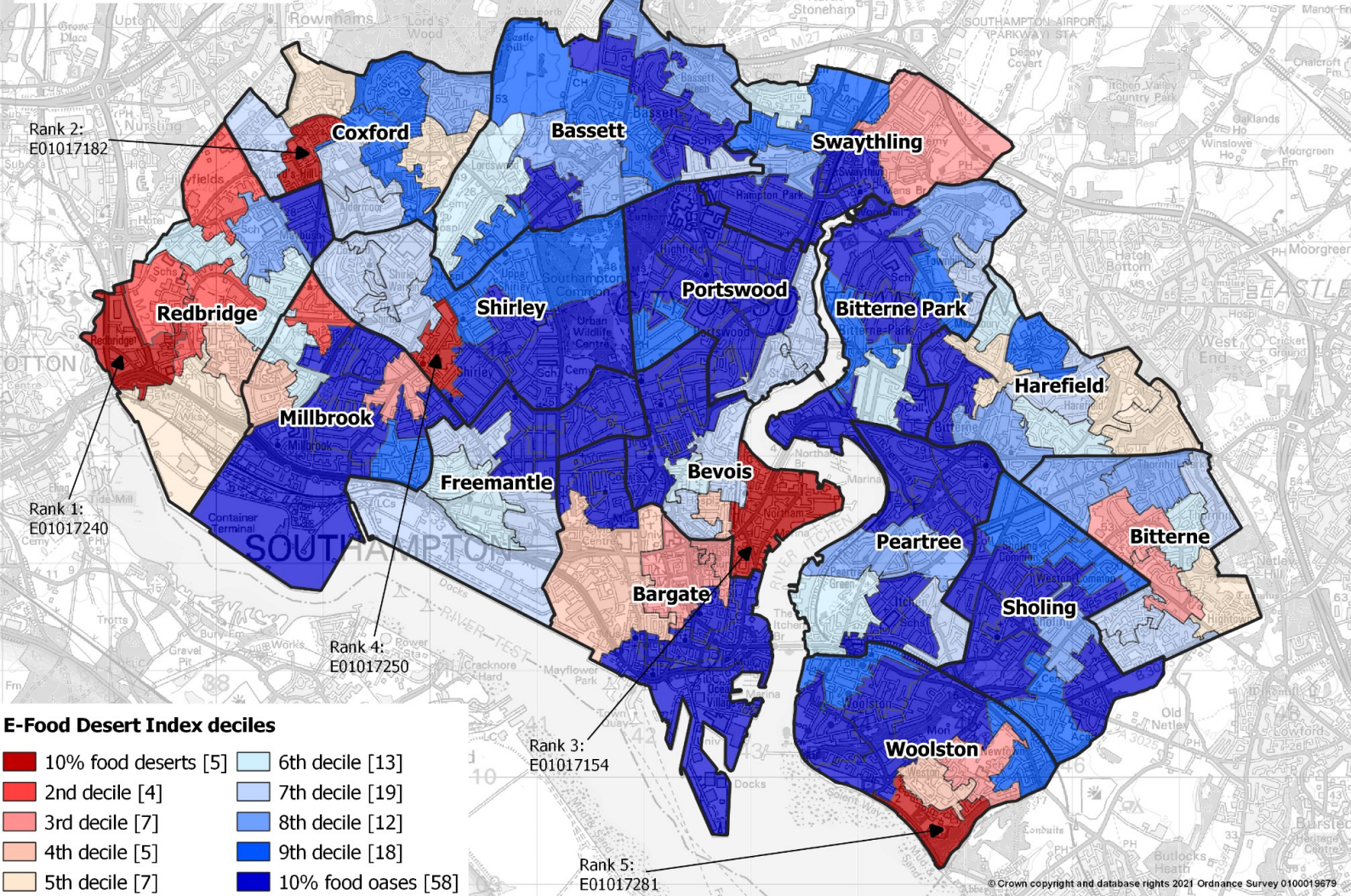
31.7% of Weston residents have no cars or vans in their household, significantly higher than the Southampton average of 27.4% and England's average of 23.5%. LSOA 032D is the highest LSOA outside of Central locality with 50.1% of residents without a car or van.

Research in 2021 showed locally cost of a 20 item basket of goods varied from £16.27 at a large Tesco to £38.70 at a Tesco Express. The same difference persisted in 2023



E-Food Desert Index

E-food Desert Index deciles, Southampton LSOAs



National index by LSOAs was produced by University of Leeds in 2020 and measures the extent to which LSOAs exhibit characteristics associated with food deserts, whilst also considering the online shopping behaviours – by four key drivers:

- Proximity and density of grocery retail facilities
- Transport and accessibility
- Neighbourhood socio-economic and demographic characteristics
- E-commerce availability and propensity

Majority of Southampton is classed as food oases, however LSOAs within Weston are within the food deserts, with LSOA E01017281 ranked 5th of all 152 LSOAs in Southampton.

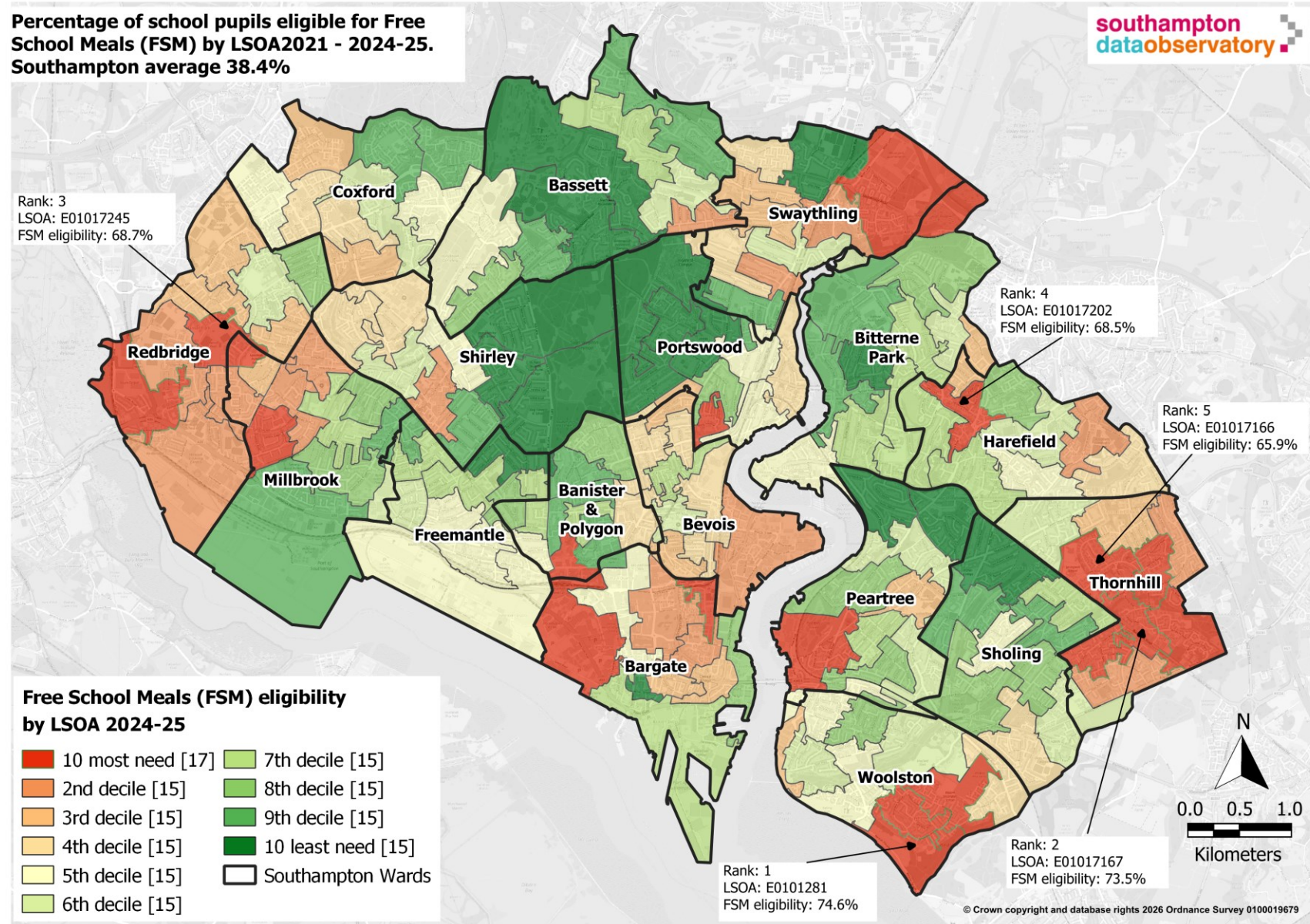

Percentage of school pupils eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) by LSOA2021 - 2024-25. Southampton average 38.4%

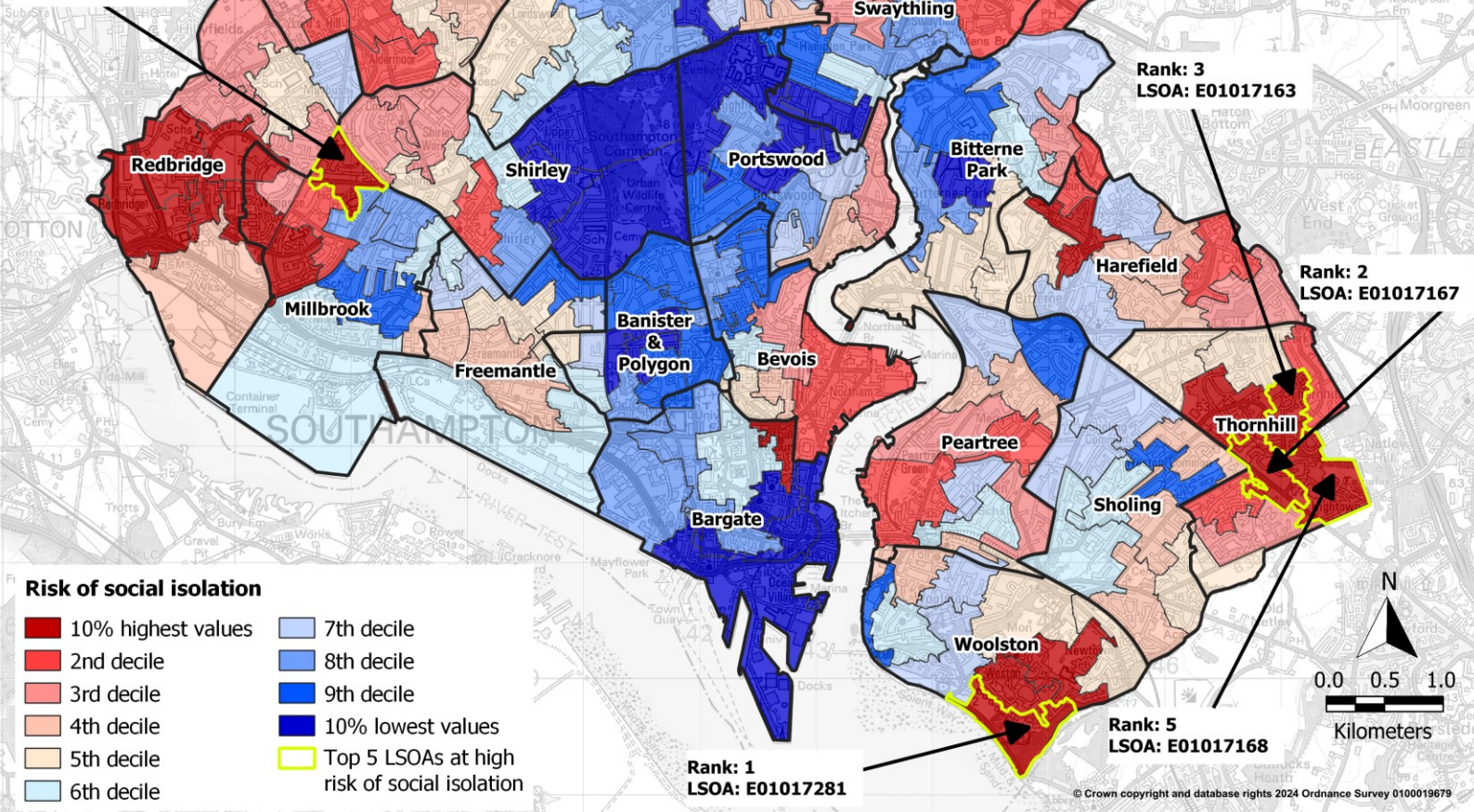

Safety, Security and Cohesion

Crime rates in Weston are higher than the England average for 7 categories, specifically: Burglary, Criminal damage and arson, Other crime, Other theft, Possession of weapons, Public order and Violence and sexual offences. Compared to the local authority average (Southampton), this area sees higher rates of Criminal damage and arson, Other crime, Possession of weapons and Violence and sexual offences.

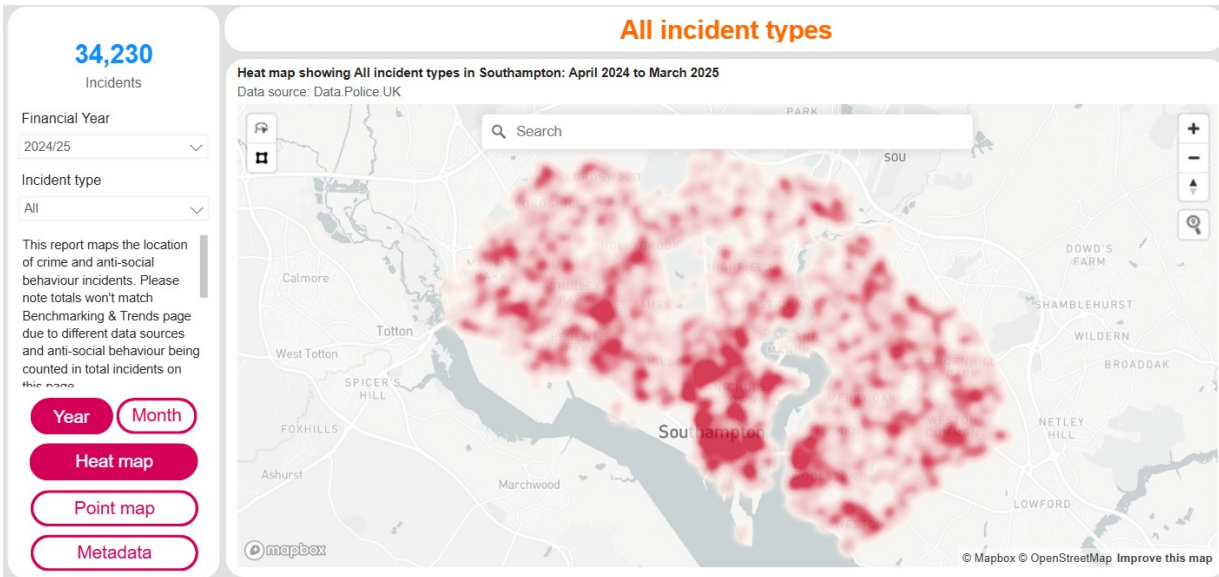

Net social trust is defined as the estimated proportion of people who say they generally trust others. According to Onward (2023), Weston has a social trust score of -24.6%, which is lower than the England average of -3%.



Community Assets

In the Weston MSOA, there GP; Living Well Partnership: Weston Lane is sited with a Pharmacy Direct pharmacy.
