## West


To enable integrated neighbourhood health and care delivery, Southampton has been split into six localities. They are (mostly) made up of 3 existing electoral wards and range from around 30k to 50k residents.

Each locality has been profiled based on its unique composition and need\*. These needs will be used to prioritise and inform service delivery at a local level in Southampton.

*\*Broad generalisations have been made about what makes each locality different. There are many individual residents in each locality who do not fit the profile.*

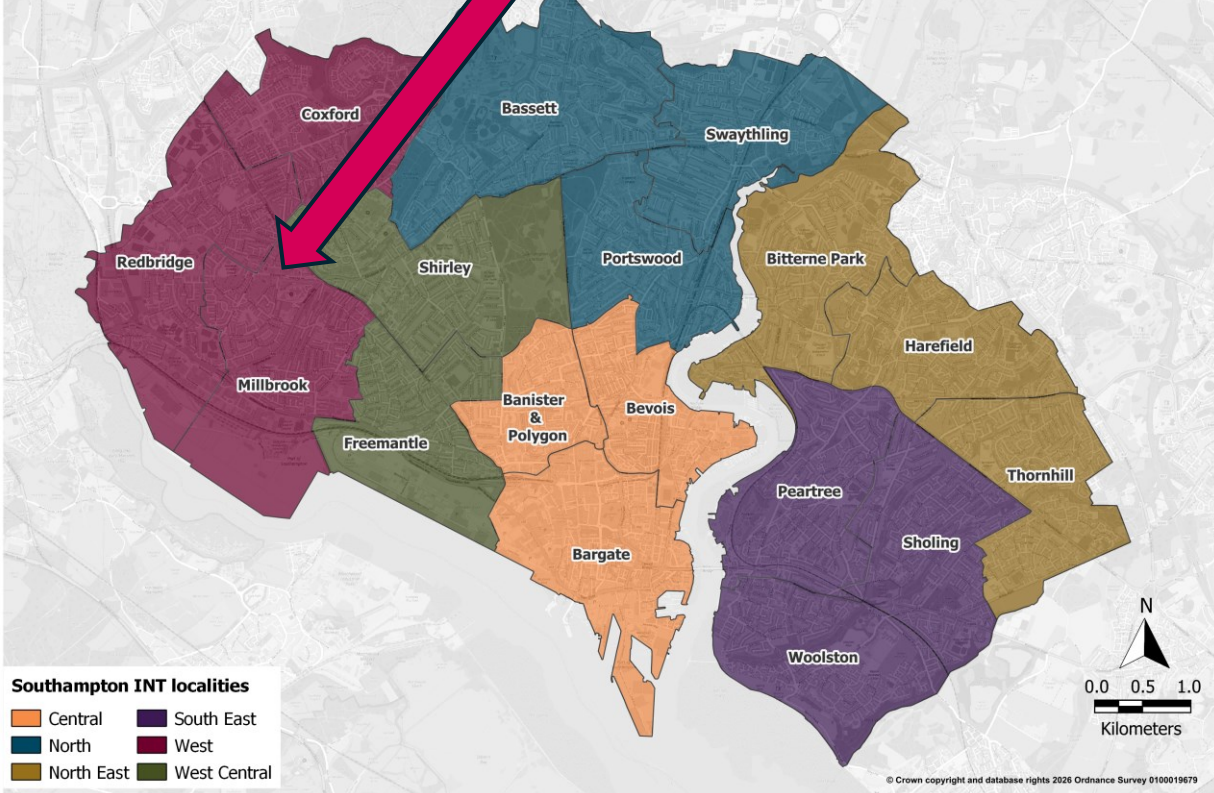

# West Locality

Pop: 42,069

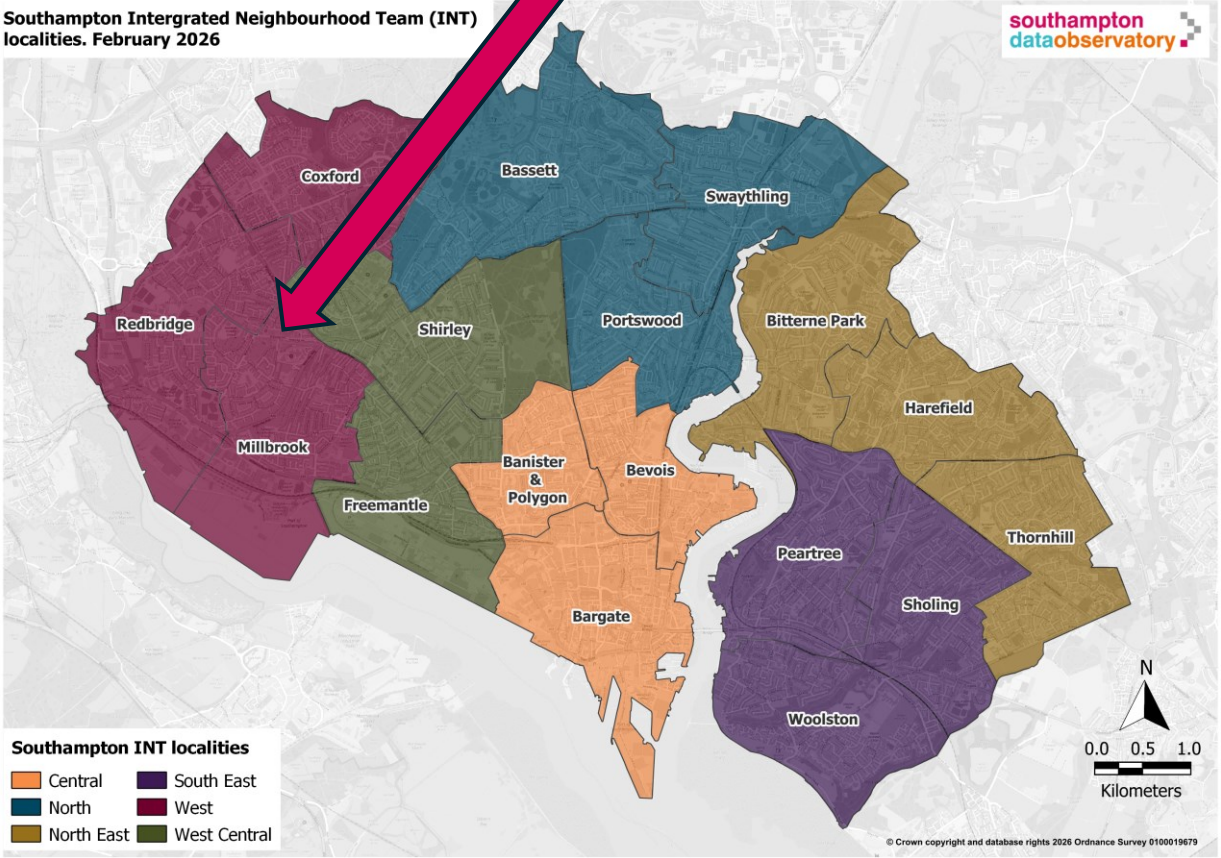
Nearly half (47.3%) of residents in the West locality live in IMD1 (England's most deprived 20% LSOAs). By this measure it is Southampton's most deprived locality by far.

Millbrook and Redbridge have among the highest proportion of young people (0-16 years) in the city. These wards also have the highest rates of children in need.

Coxford is slightly less deprived than the rest of the neighbourhood but has an acute need for adult social care, new care requests are higher than almost anywhere else in the city.

The adult population here has significantly fewer qualifications than the rest of the city, however employment is around the city average. Health outcomes are also around the city average, but self reported poor health and disability is significantly higher here.

The population in the West locality is growing very slowly, forecast to increase by fewer than 80 people (0.2%) by 2030.

The West locality has above city average levels of English spoken as a main language and a significantly higher % of residents aged under 16 or over 65.

All cause mortality is significantly better than the city average in Millbrook but significantly worse in Coxford. Average life expectancy for males and females is similar to the city average. Other health measures are also around the average for the city.

Coxford has some acute adult social care needs, it has the highest rate of new care requests in the city and the second highest contacts for adult social care assistance.

Redbridge and Millbrook have some of the highest rates of domestic abuse in the city. Violent crime is also significantly higher in Redbridge. Coxford has significantly less violent crime than the city average.

Self reported bad health and disability is significantly higher in all three wards within the West locality.

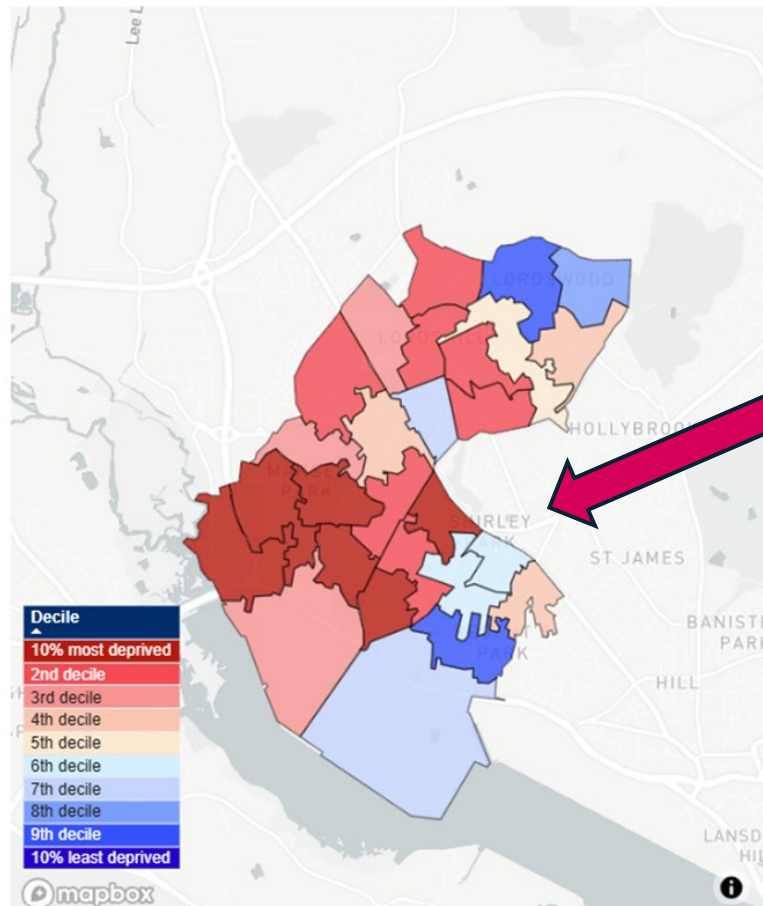

- 47.3% (20,244) of residents within the West locality live within the 20% most deprived LSOAs nationally, which is significantly higher than the Southampton average (24.3%).



West locality has the highest rate of social housing in the city (32%). Half of homes here are owned. Only 17% of homes are privately rented, the joint lowest rate in the city.



16.4% of Redbridge is greenspace, 5<sup>th</sup> highest in the city. Millbrook and Coxford have much less greenspace, Coxford has less than 3% (the city average is 7.1%).

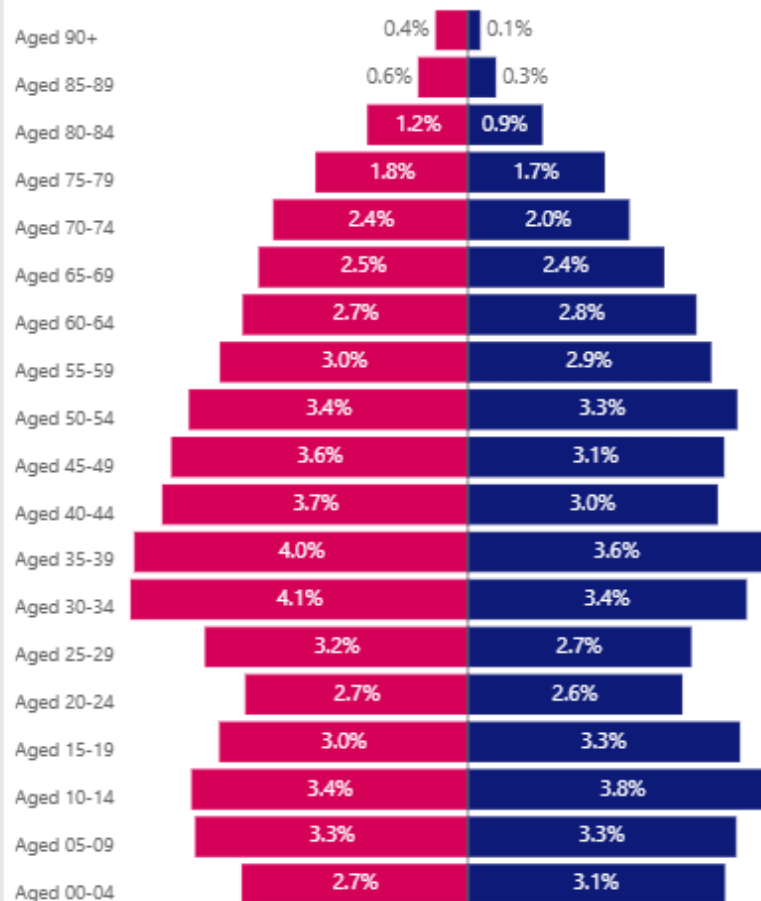

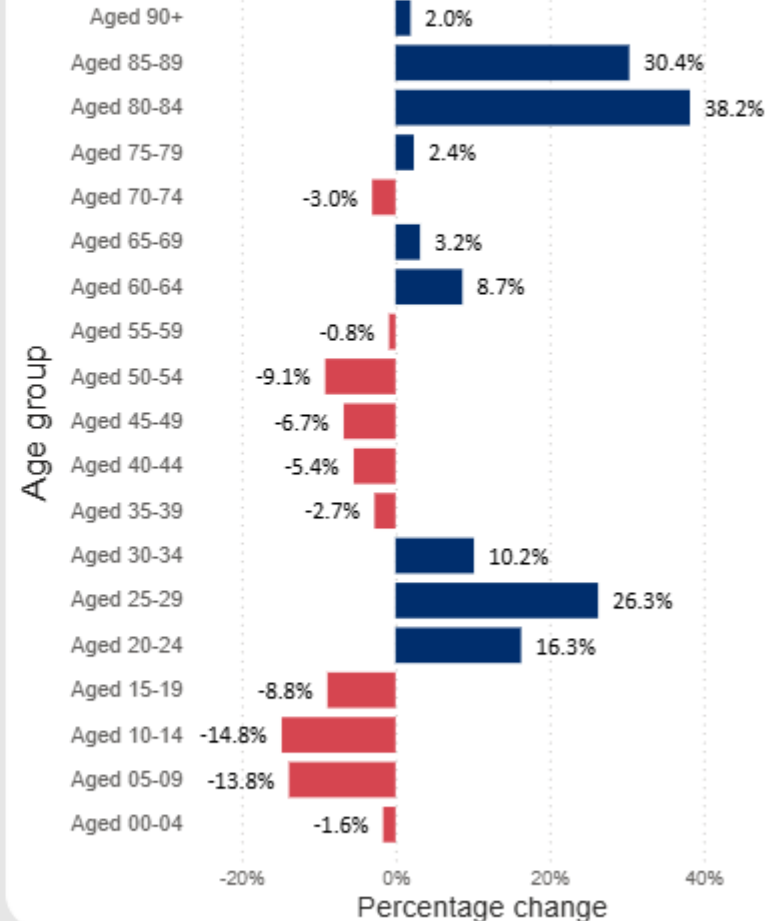

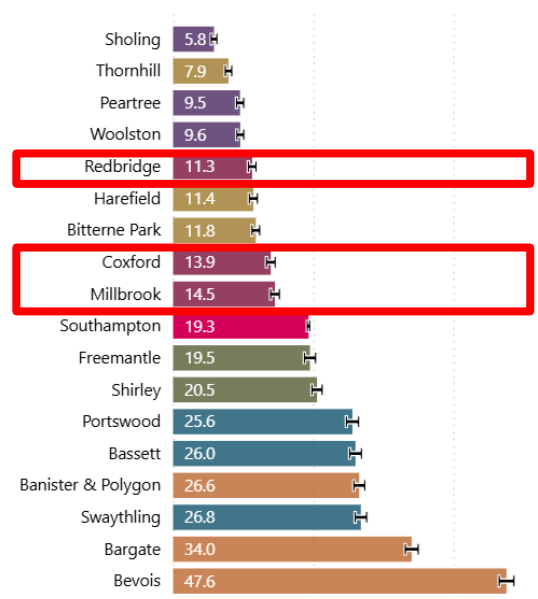

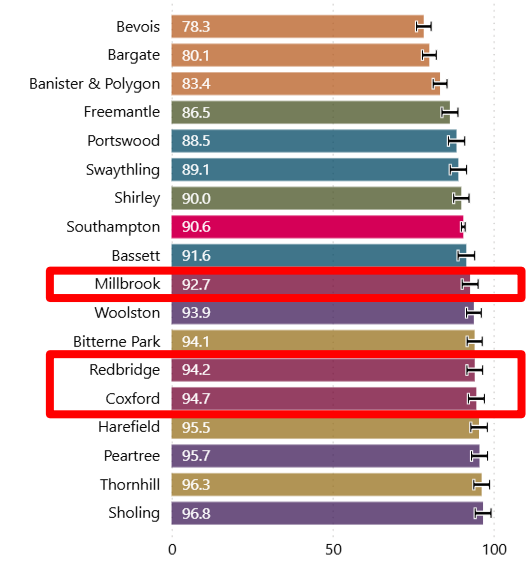

Percentage of households that have one or more persons with English as a main language by Ward: 2021



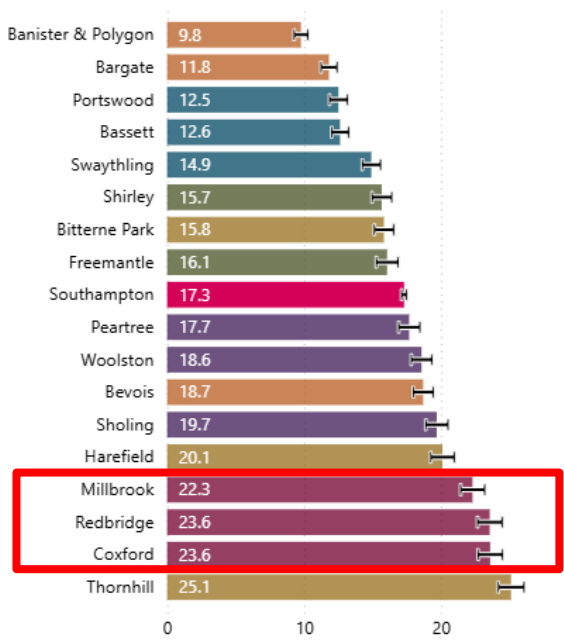

## High dependency and family pressures

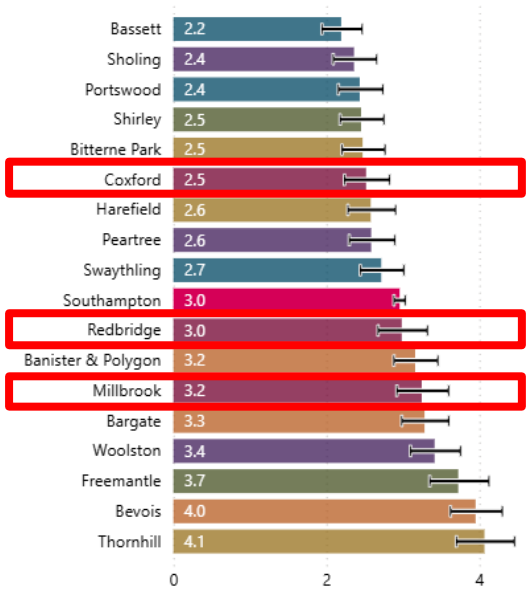
- The West neighbourhood has a higher proportion of residents under 16 and over 65+, and a lower proportion of working age population 16-64, this age profile may (in part) explain the higher demand for support services here.
- All 3 wards have a higher percentage of households where English is the main language, with Redbridge and Coxford significantly higher than the Southampton average.
- Redbridge and Millbrook have some of the highest lone parent families with dependant children in the city, placing them among the top 3 wards.

## Highly economically active despite low qualification levels

- All 3 West locality wards are among the top 5 in the city for residents 16+ with no qualifications, significantly worse than the Southampton average.
- Despite low qualification levels, all 3 wards have significantly better economically active residents 16+ are than the average suggesting a community reliant on roles requiring fewer formal qualifications.
- Coxford has a significantly better unemployment rate than the Southampton average. Unemployment in Redbridge and Millbrook is slightly better than the city average (but not significantly).

## Health inequalities

- Health outcomes are (mostly) similar to the city average. Self reported bad health and disability is significantly higher in all three wards.
- Life expectancy is similar to the city average across the West locality. Millbrook and Redbridge have higher male and female life expectancy than Coxford, which sits below the city average.
- All three wards are among the bottom five in the city for healthy-weight children in Year R, with Redbridge also among the bottom five for Year 6, highlighting early years health concerns across the neighbourhood.

## High hospital admission pressures

- Redbridge has the highest hospital admission pressures of the 3 wards, particularly in drug poisoning admissions and falls in people 65+.
- All 3 wards have significantly worse hospital admissions caused by unintentional and deliberate injuries in children 15-24 years, with Coxford and Redbridge also significantly worse for ages 0-14 years, reflecting their larger under 16 population.
- The West locality experiences high health and safety pressures, with consistently elevated hospital admissions.

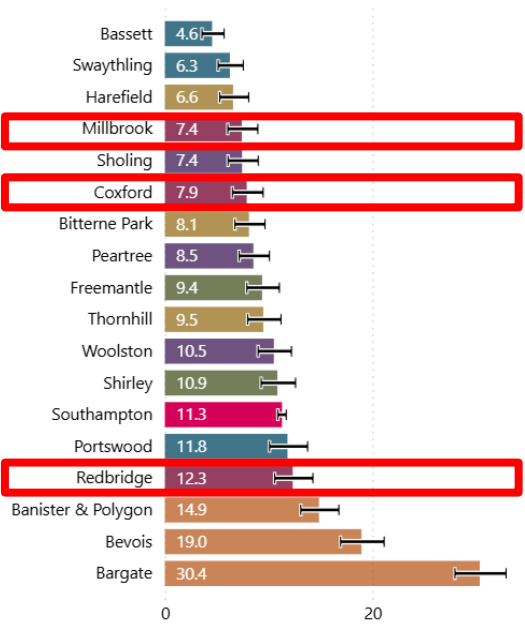

## Elevated education needs

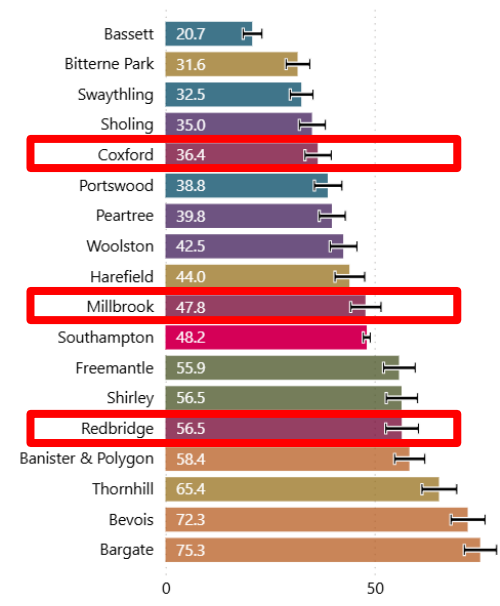
- Coxford and Millbrook are below the Southampton average for the percentage of children achieving a good level of development at the end of Reception.
- Redbridge has the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest percentage of pupils eligible for Free School Meals in the city, while Millbrook and Coxford sit close to the Southampton average.
- All three wards have high levels of Special Educational Needs, with each in the top four wards in Southampton.
- Suspension rates are significantly better than the Southampton average, although overall and persistent absence are higher across the West locality.

Rate of violent crime per 1k population by Ward: January 2023 - December 2023



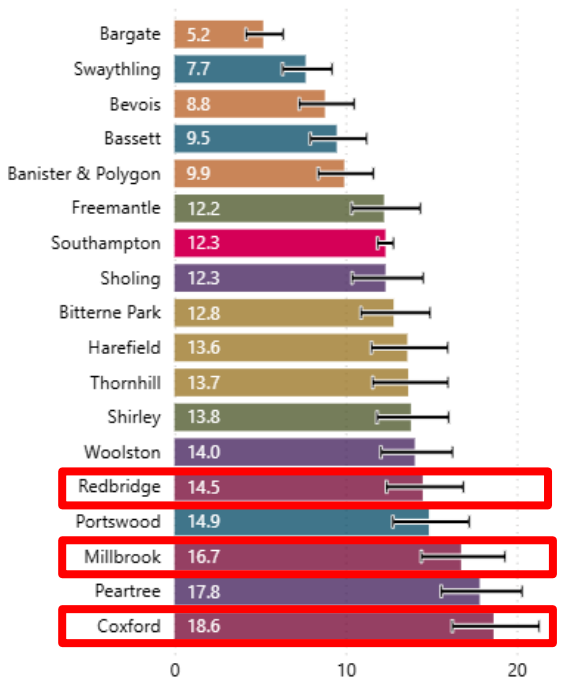

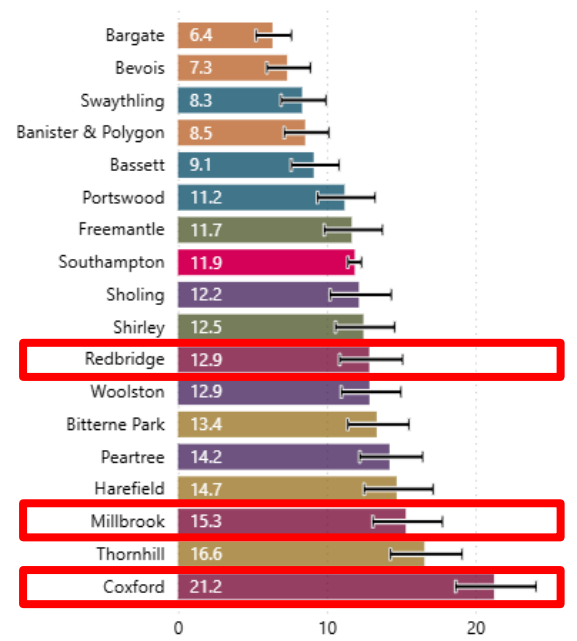
- Alcohol affected crime is significantly lower across all three West locality wards.

Rate of new care request contacts where one of the three outcomes was Care Act Assessment Required per 1k population aged 18+ by Ward: March 2023 - February 2024



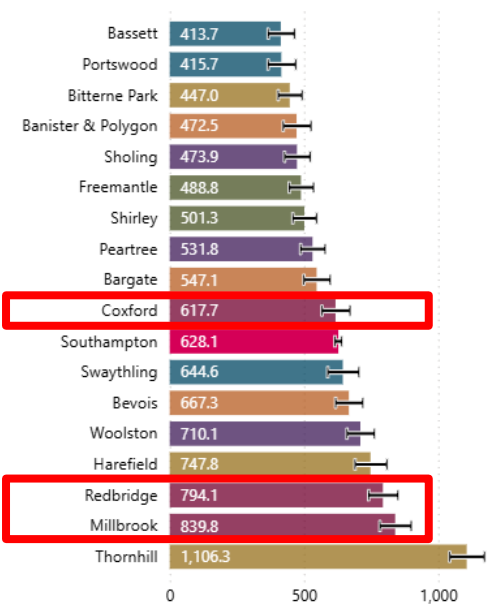

## High Adult Social Care (ASC) demand

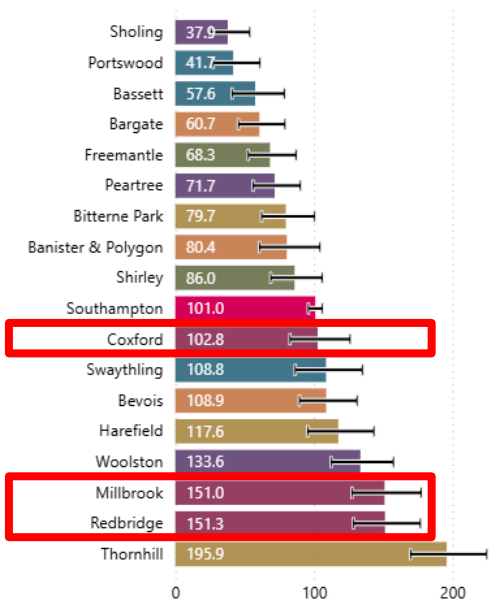
- Coxford has some of the highest ASC needs in Southampton, with significantly higher rates of new Care Act assessment requests, contacts with an outcome of Information, Advice and Guidance and current ASC involvement compared with the city average.
- Safeguarding pressures are greatest in Coxford of the 3 wards, which has higher safeguarding concerns and Section 42 enquires while Millbrook and Redbridge are just below the average.
- Overall, the West locality shows increased adult social care need, with particularly high and complex demand centred in Coxford, indicating greater reliance on ASC support in parts of the area.

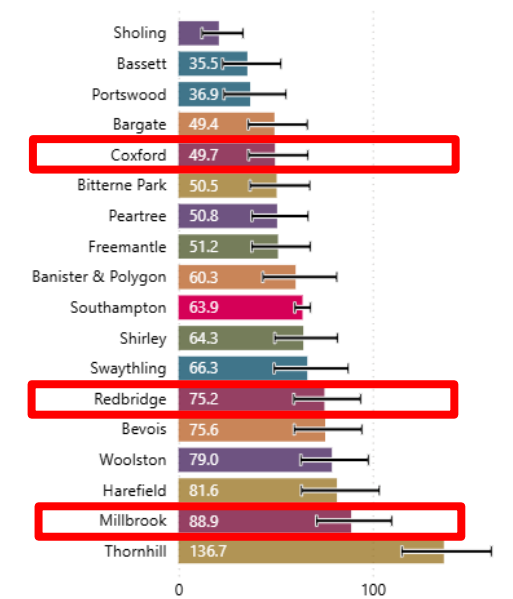
Rate of Children In Need per 10k 0-17 population by Ward: 2020/21 - 2022/23

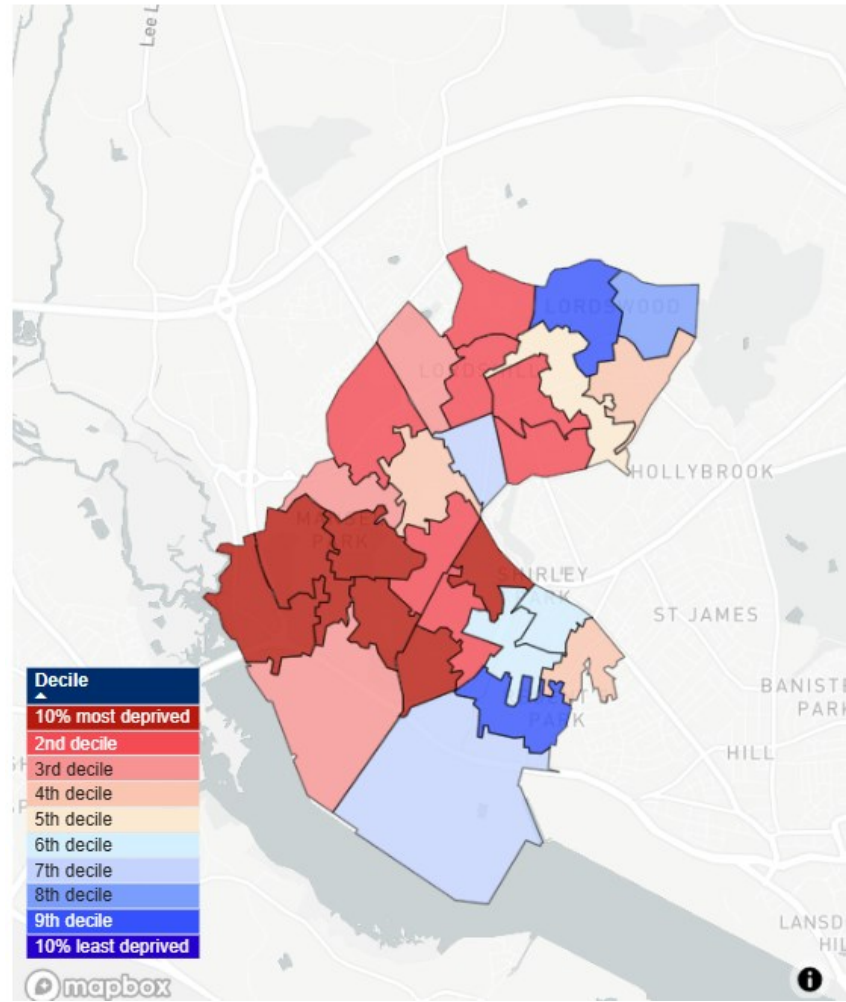
## High levels of Children’s Social Care (CSC) involvement

- Millbrook and Redbridge have very high levels of CSC need, with significantly higher rates of Children in Need and Child Protection Plans than the Southampton average, both sitting among the top three highest-need wards in the city.
- Millbrook shows the greatest level of statutory intervention, with the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest Children Looked After rates in the city, indicating substantial and complex safeguarding needs.
- Coxford has lower CSC need (similar to the Southampton average), children’s social care pressures in the West are concentrated specifically in Millbrook and Redbridge.

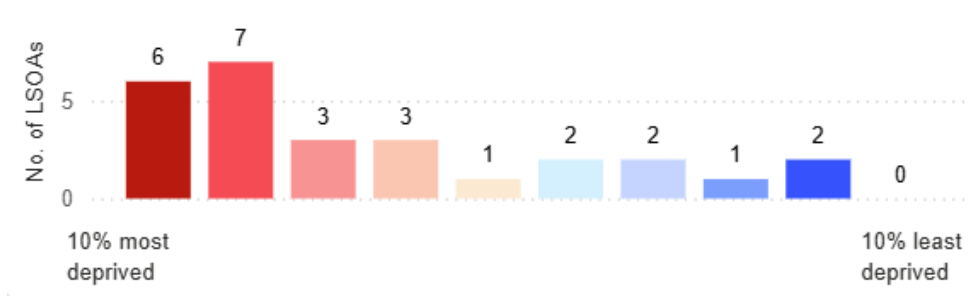

Number of LSOAs by decile - West Locality: Overall IMD (2025)

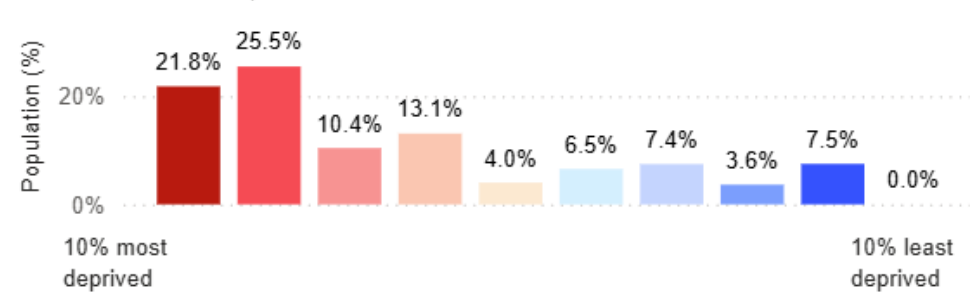

Percentage of population by decile - West Locality: Overall IMD (2025)

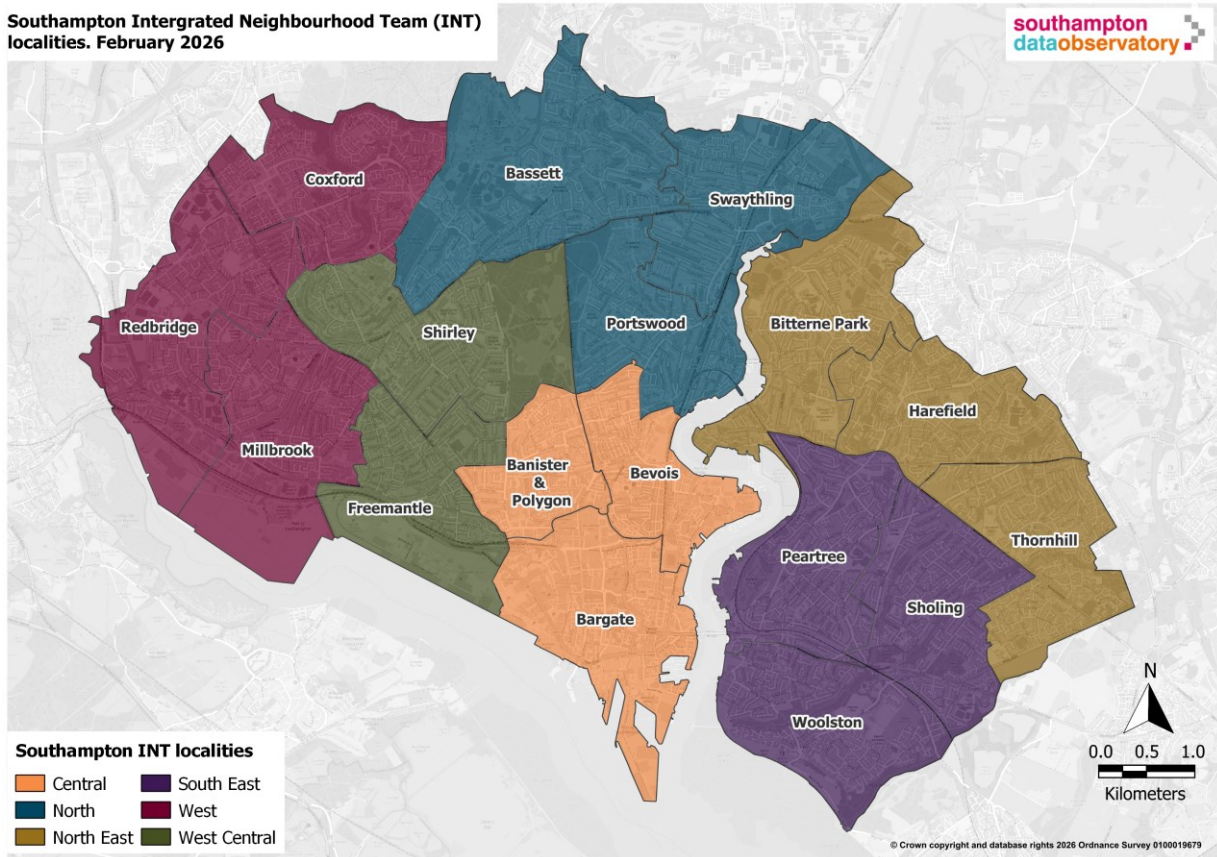
