North

To enable integrated neighbourhood health and care delivery, Southampton has been split into six neighbourhoods. They are (mostly) made up of 3 existing electoral wards and range from around 30k to 50k residents.

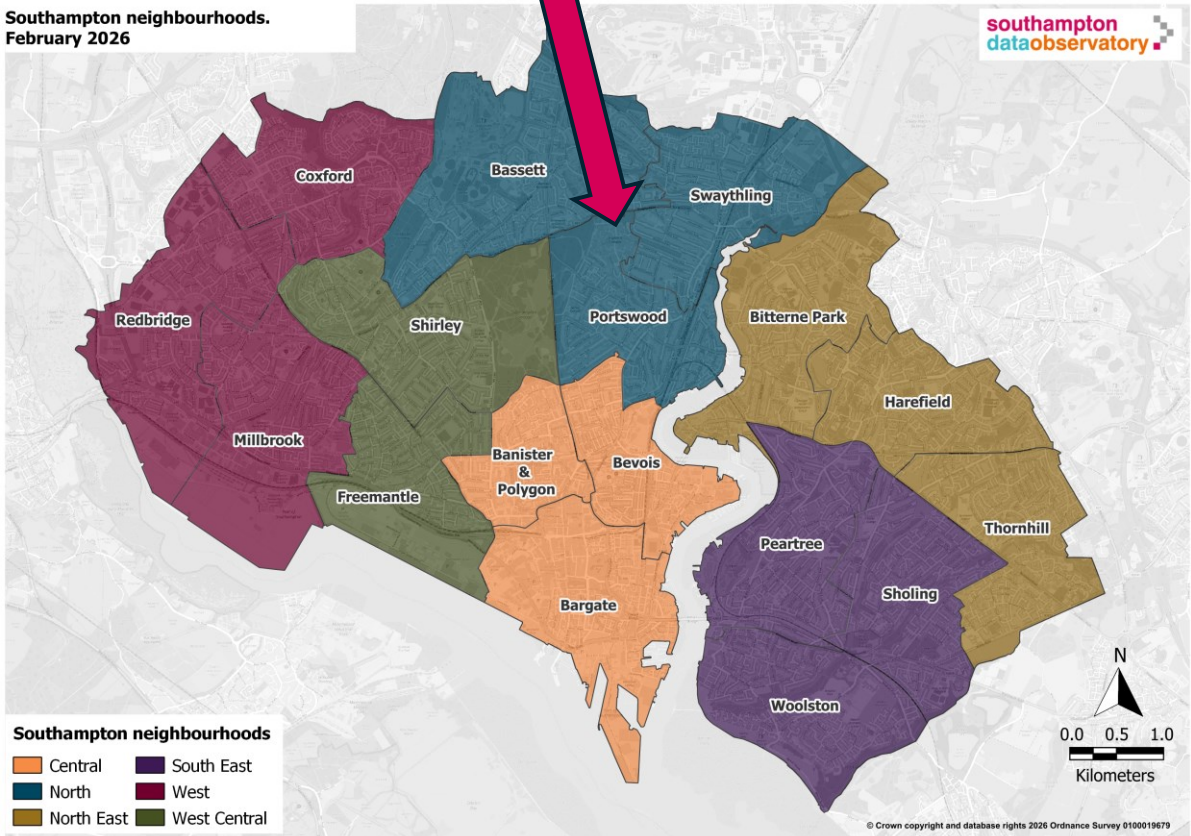
Each neighbourhood has been profiled based on its unique composition and need*. These needs will be used to prioritise and inform service delivery at a local level in Southampton.


**Broad generalisations have been made about what makes each neighbourhood different. There are many individual residents in each neighbourhood who do not fit the profile.*

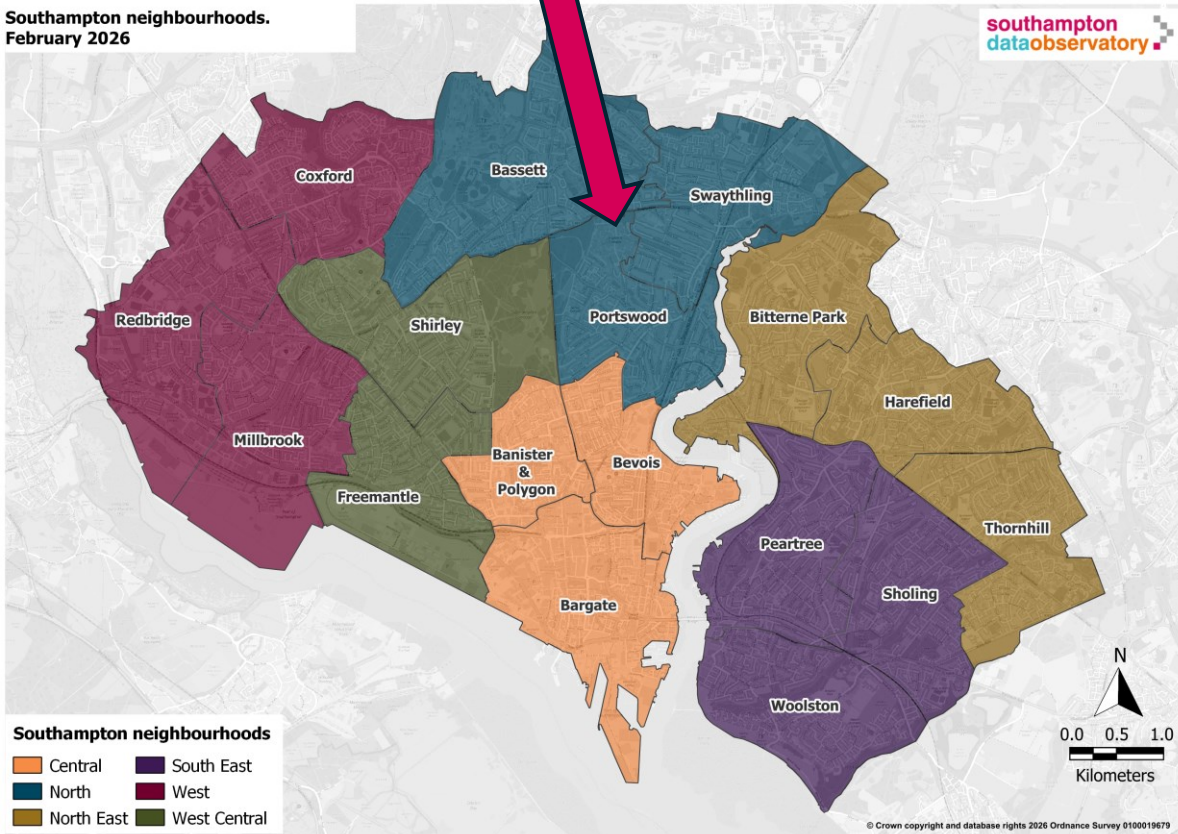

Southampton's North neighbourhood is one of the least deprived parts of the city, with 6.3% of residents living in IMD1 (England's most deprived 20% LSOAs).

Some of the least deprived areas in England are in the west half of this neighbourhood (Bassett and the west half of Portswood). E01017226 adjacent to Southampton Common is the least deprived LSOA in the city (one of the least deprived 10% LSOAs in England).

In contrast, most of Swaythling and the east half of Portswood is more deprived than the England average. This inequality is evident in some health and education measures.

The population here is culturally and ethnically diverse. All three wards that make up this neighbourhood are in the city's top six for ethnic diversity (% of population that are minority ethnic groups).

The population is relatively young and is expected to grow by less than 1% (around 300) by 2030.

Discussion points

How do these insights impact priorities?



Greater ethnic and cultural diversity here, higher rates of non-white residents and lower levels of English as main language (in Bassett and Portswood). There is a significantly higher working age population.

Female life expectancy for two wards is better than the city average. Under 75 mortality has Swaythling's rate ranked the worst ward for respiratory and Portswood the 2nd worst for cardiovascular.

Disparities in education outcomes are clear. Bassett holds some of the city's best rates in terms of absence and suspensions combined (already meeting the new national target for end of reception good level of development). Swaythling is among the worst 5 wards for absence and end of reception good level of development.

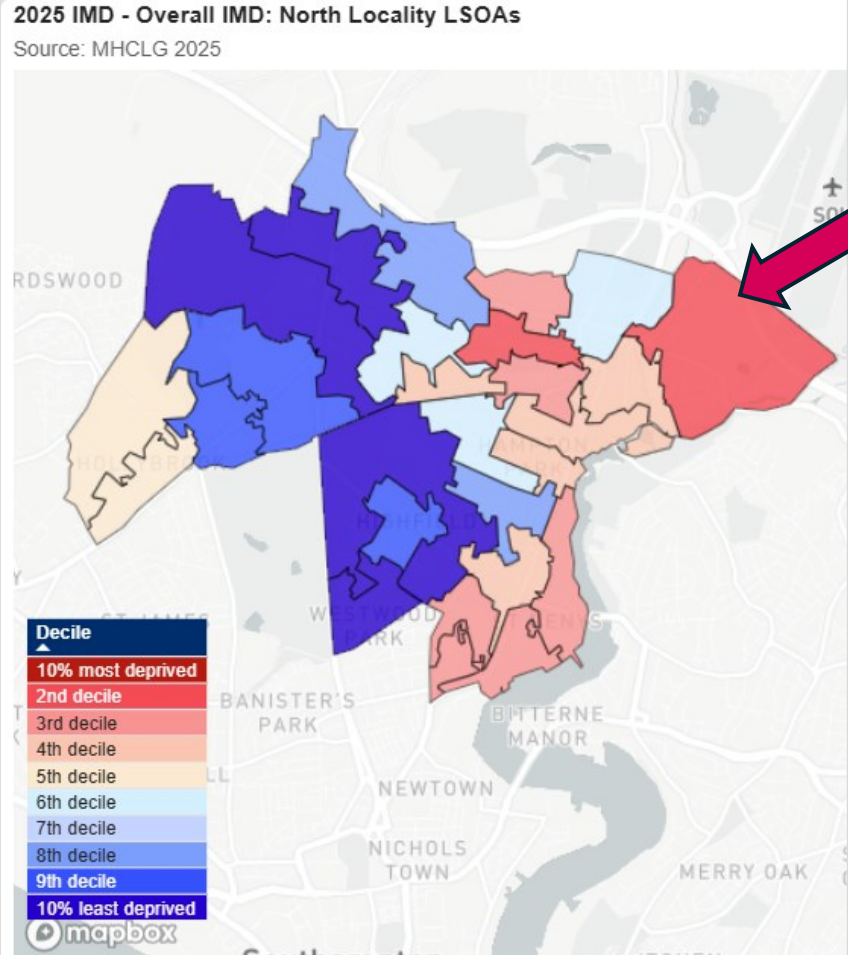
Swaythling and Bassett are in among the 3 worst wards for mental health admission rates in under 18s.

North neighbourhood

- 27 LSOAs in this neighbourhood
- 2 LSOAs in 20% most deprived
- 6.3% (2,992) of residents within North neighbourhood in 20% most deprived (significantly lower than Southampton average (24.3%))
- 7 LSOAs with 13,499 residents in the 20% least deprived



North neighbourhood has the second lowest proportion of properties owned at 47% and second highest proportion of private rented (35%) across all neighbourhoods.



Bassett has the second highest greenspace in the city (nearly 30% of the ward). Swaythling and Portswood have significantly less greenspace compared to Southampton as a whole.

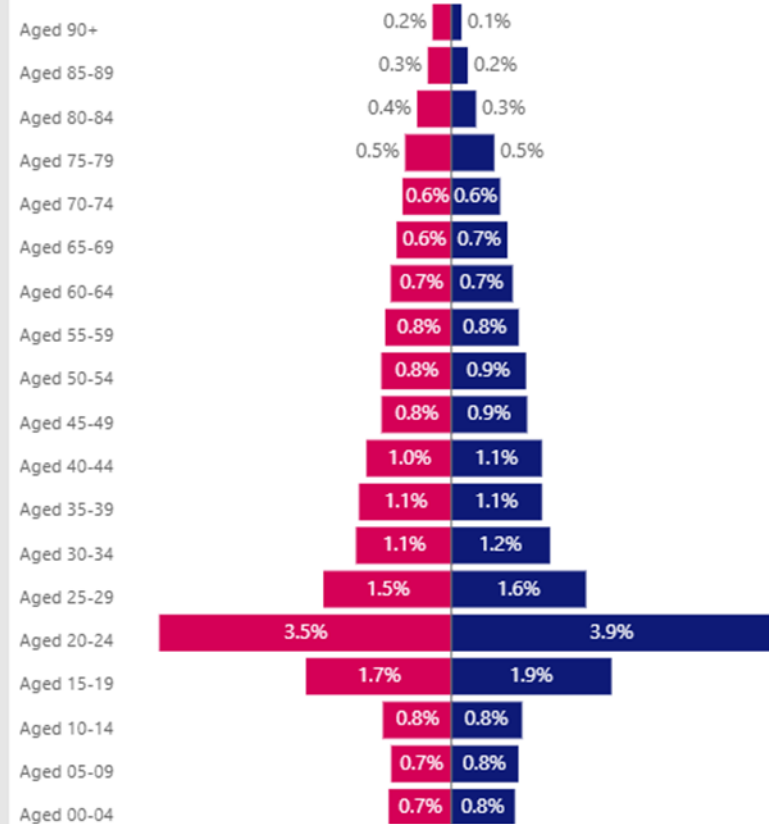

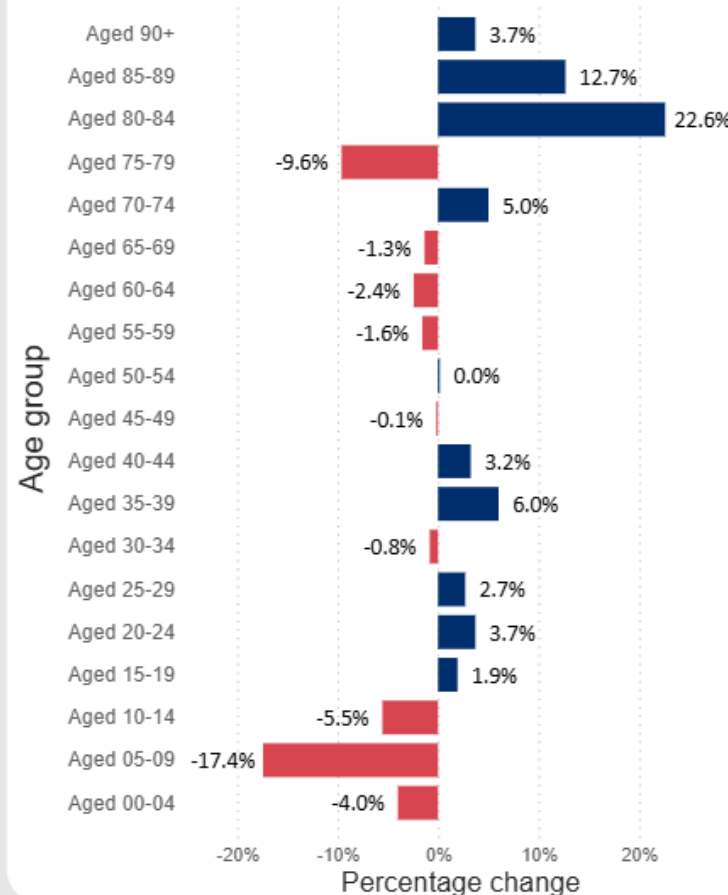

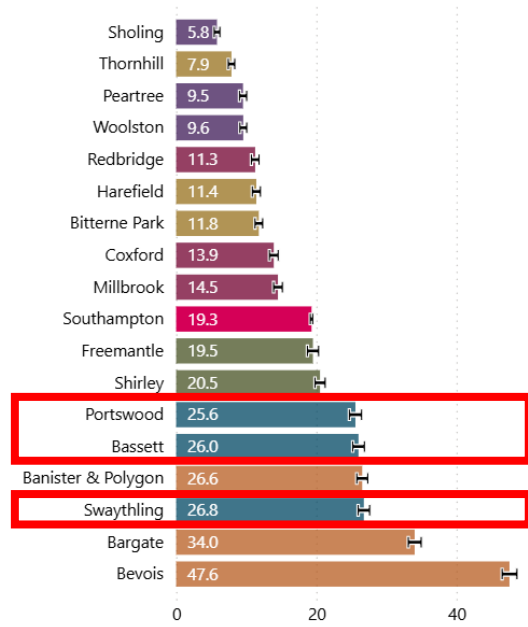

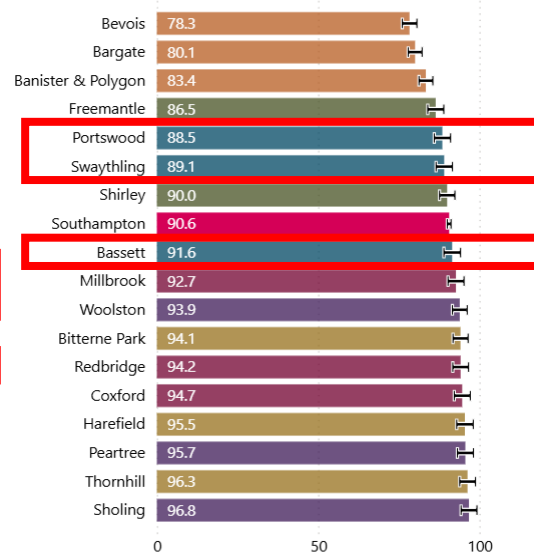

Percentage of households that have one or more persons with English as a main language by Ward: 2021



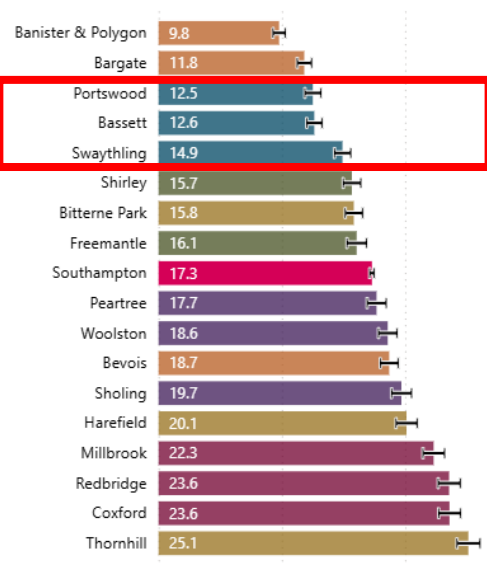

High ethnic and cultural diversity, with significant population change forecasted

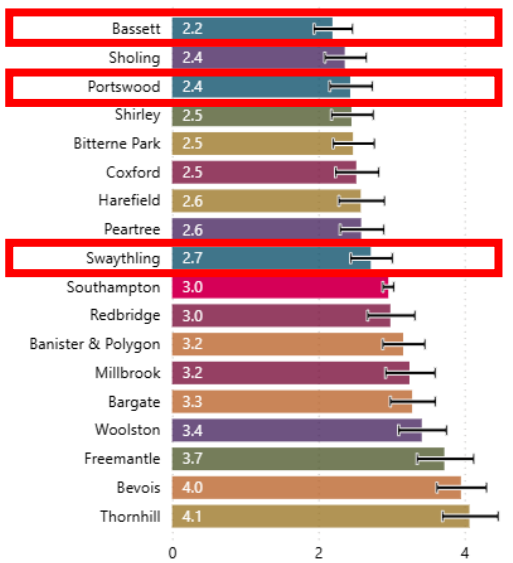
- North neighbourhood has high ethnic and cultural diversity, with all 3 wards having a much higher proportion of minority ethnic residents (more than 1 in 4 residents) than the Southampton average. Portswood and Swaythling have the 5th and 6th lowest percentage of households that have one or more persons with English as a main language.
- All 3 wards are forecasted to see a declined population change for under 16s. Swaythling is forecasted to have the highest growth in ages 65+ (although still lower than the city average), while Bassett is forecasted the highest growth in the working age population (16-64).

Low unemployment levels and qualifications

- Bassett and Portswood has a more stable working-age population with lower unemployment rates and fewer residents with no qualifications.
- Swaythling has the highest proportion of residents aged 16+ with no qualifications among the 3 wards and its unemployment rate is slightly higher but similar to the Southampton average.

Health outcomes vary

- Bassett showed lower mortality rates and higher life expectancy, while Swaythling experiences higher mortality for respiratory and Portswood for cardiovascular.
- Reported poor health and disability levels are generally low in Bassett and Portswood, but notably higher in Swaythling, which also sees higher levels of bad/very bad health, but still better than the city average.
- Childhood healthy weight outcomes are better in Bassett and Portswood, both showing low Year 6 obesity, whereas Swaythling has worse child obesity levels, making it the worst of the three on early years health.

Varying vulnerability to hospital admissions

- Bassett and Portswood have lower drug poisoning admissions and better than the Southampton average, whilst Swaythling has higher admissions and similar to Southampton.
- Bassett experiences a higher falls burden compared to Portswood and Swaythling and is higher than the Southampton average. A likely reflection of a higher population aged 65+.
- All 3 wards have significantly better hospital admissions caused by unintentional and deliberate injuries in ages 15-24 years. For ages 0-14, Portswood is significantly better than the Southampton average. Bassett and Swaythling are statistically similar.

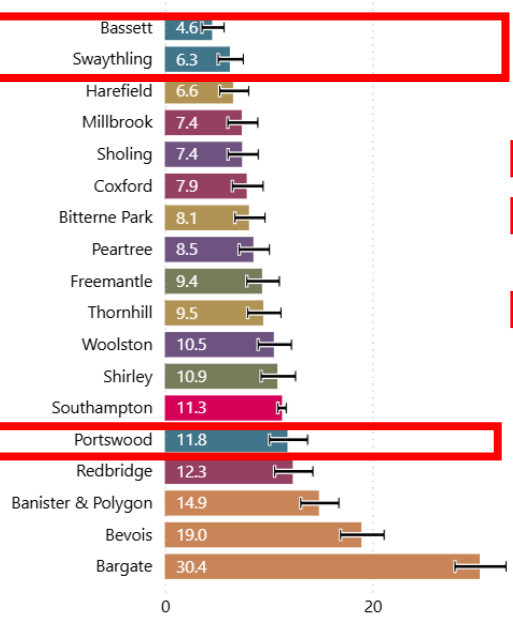

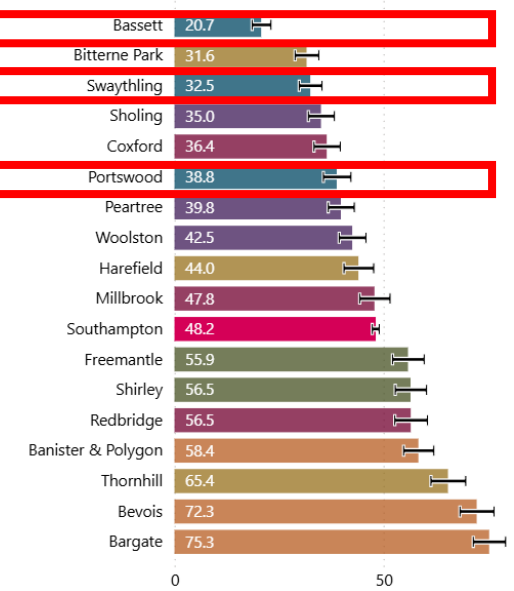
- Bassett and Portswood demonstrates consistently stronger outcomes in education with significantly better absence and suspension rates and significantly lower free school meal eligibility reflecting the lower levels of deprivation compared to Swaythling.
- Compared with Bassett and Portswood, Swaythling has higher indicators of vulnerability in education, including greater pupil absence, higher suspension rate and higher free school meal eligibility, alongside lower attainment results.

Rate of violent crime per 1k population by Ward: January 2023 - December 2023



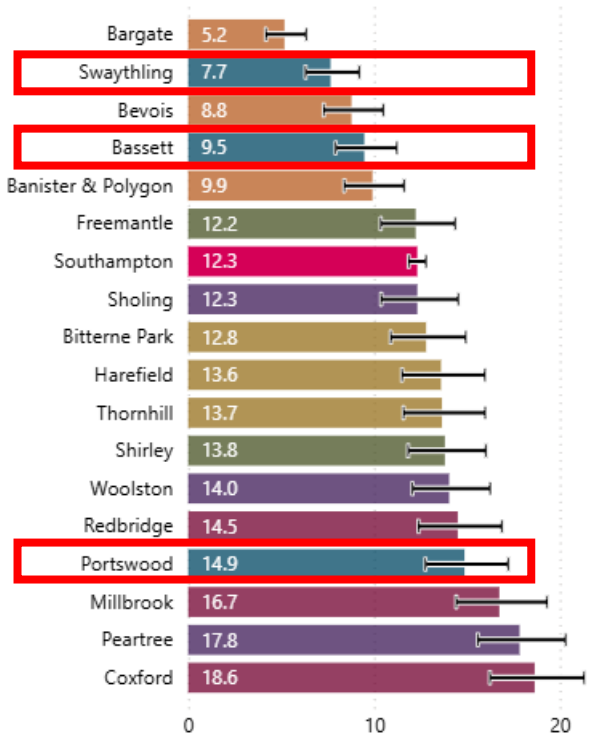

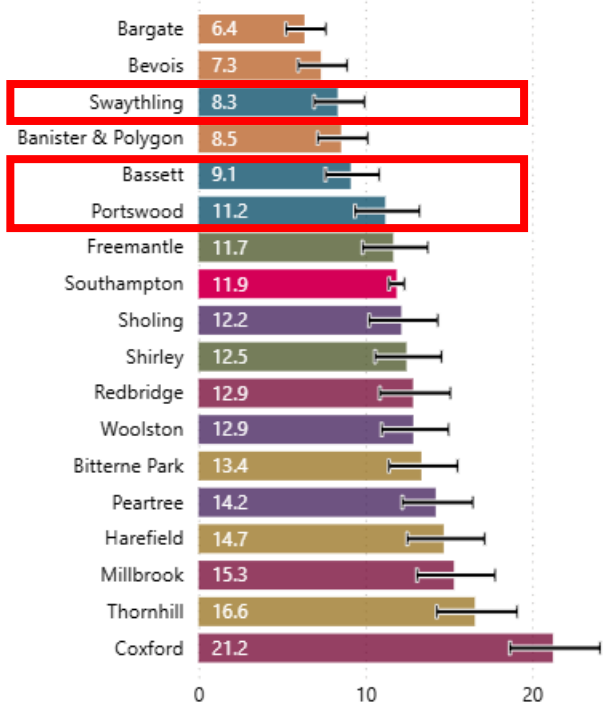
- Basset ward has the lowest crime rates across almost all indicators, with only theft offences being marginally higher than Swaythling, which is the lowest.

Rate of new care request contacts where one of the three outcomes was Care Act Assessment Required per 1k population aged 18+ by Ward: March 2023 - February 2024



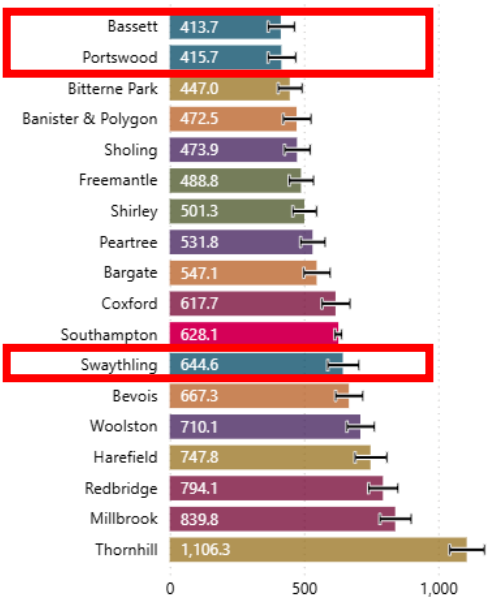

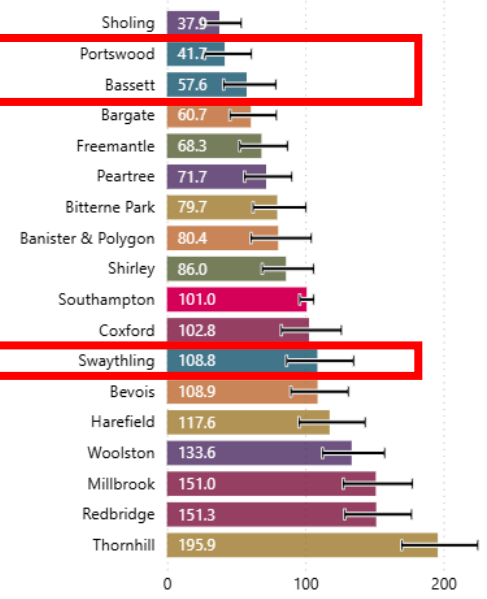

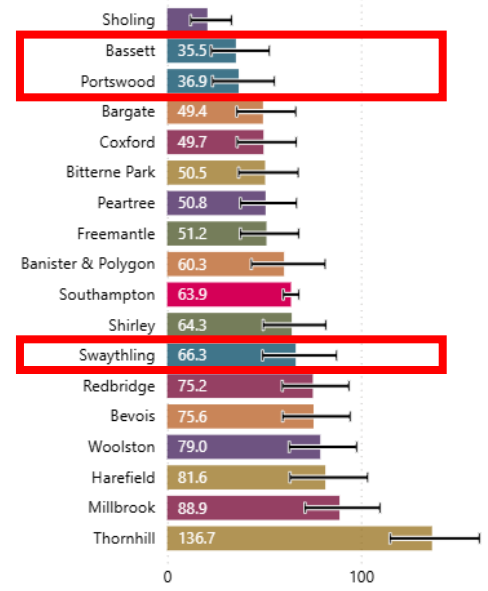
Rate of Children In Need per 10k 0-17 population by Ward: 2020/21 - 2022/23

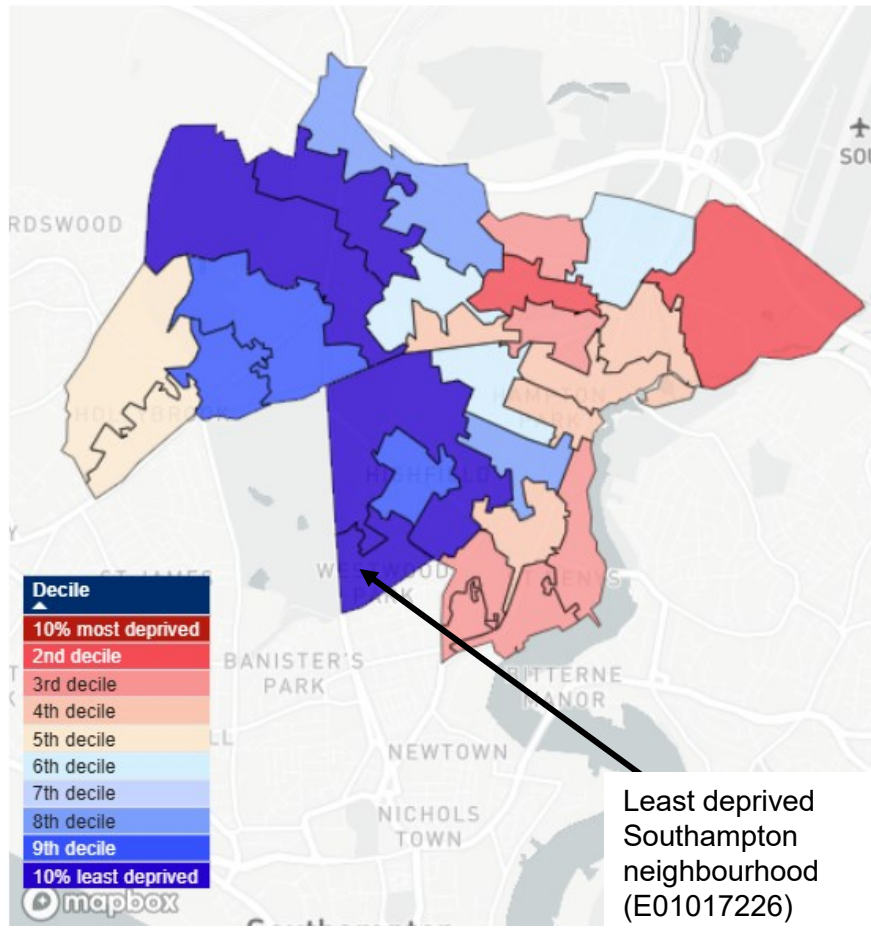
Mixed level of Children Social Care (CSC) involvement

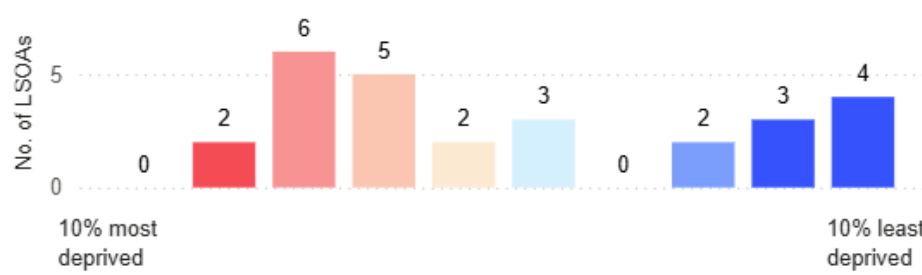


The map shows deprivation deciles by LSOA within the North neighbourhood. There is a mixed picture across the area, with pockets of deprivation and affluence.

Number of LSOAs by decile - North Locality: Overall IMD (2025)

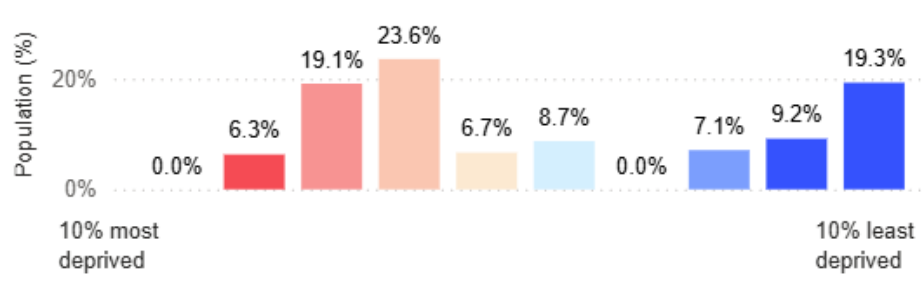

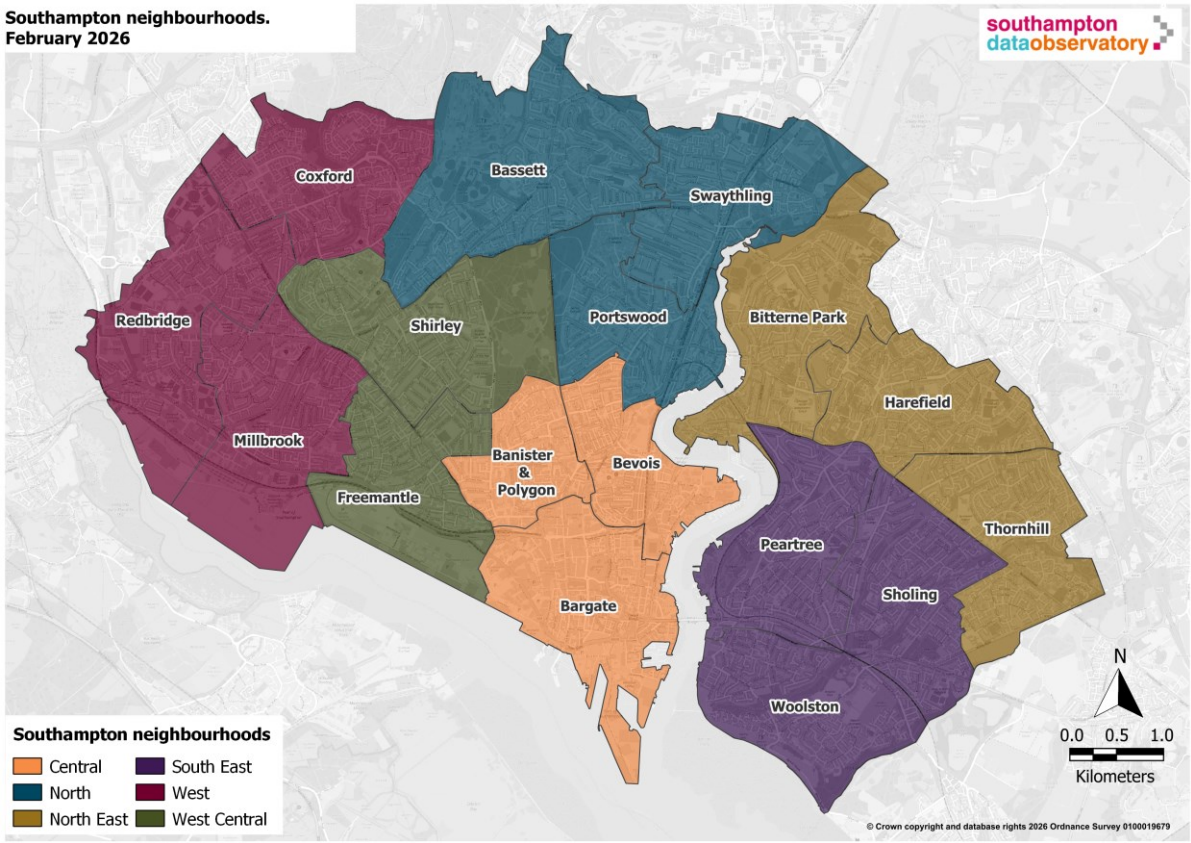


Housing tenure
