



### **Methodology and Promotion**



The main aim of the Child Friendly Southampton discovery stage was to collate both intelligence and insight across the city to provide a wider view of the children and young people in Southampton, and how they feel about a variety of topics.

This engagement activity ran through Summer 2022.

The main route for feedback was our Child Friendly Southampton Baseline Survey, which was circulated across the city with a main version as well as an easy read version for SEND and early years. We also created some activities to get feedback on certain topics in the questionnaire. The surveys and activities were promoted in the following ways:

- Roadshow
- Youth groups
- Local Events (e.g. Mela Festival and SPCA Play Day)
- Social Media
- Education settings
- Digital posters
- E-bulletins
- On the website
- Emails to stakeholders and partners
- Focus Groups

We also asked and collated questions from other surveys to that ran across the city including:

- Children and Young People's Draft Strategy Consultation (a younger version of the questionnaire was circulated to children and young people across the city at the end of 2021)
- Make your Mark (a poll and a questionnaire was circulated to children and young people across the city in Spring 2022)
- School Streets Survey (a survey that was conducted at selected schools in Summer 2022)

This report also outlines some of the key data intelligence figures around children and young people in the city on a variety of topics including safety, health, place and education.



## Communication

#### Across the city:

- Information about children's rights is shared with children, young people and adults in different ways.
- People know when important decisions affecting children, young people and families are being made.



### **Communication Badge – key findings**



#### For the communication badge, we spoke to young people about finding out information. We found out that:

- The majority of children and young people we surveyed know what children's rights are.
- They mostly found out about their rights at school, compared to anywhere else.
- 0 1 in 10 respondents disagreed that children and young people have rights in Southampton.
- Respondents from minority ethnic and younger age groups selected that they know what children's rights were more, and that they had learnt about them
   more, compared to white ethnicities and older age groups.
- When asked about finding information about things to, places to get help and children's rights, over a fifth of respondents selected it was difficult to find information.
- The top two places that respondents currently go, and the top two places where they would most like to go to find information on these topics, are friends and family, and school.
- 17% of respondents selected that they currently get information from the library, compared to almost half of respondents who said that they would like to get
  information from the library.
- Compared to other sections, 'getting information' was the topic that children and young people were least interested in answering questions about.





### Learning about children's rights at school





### Learning about children's rights somewhere else






### Children's rights

### Finding information on things to do for you and your family








