## South East

To enable integrated neighbourhood health and care delivery, Southampton has been split into six neighbourhoods. They are (mostly) made up of 3 existing electoral wards and range from around 30k to 50k residents.

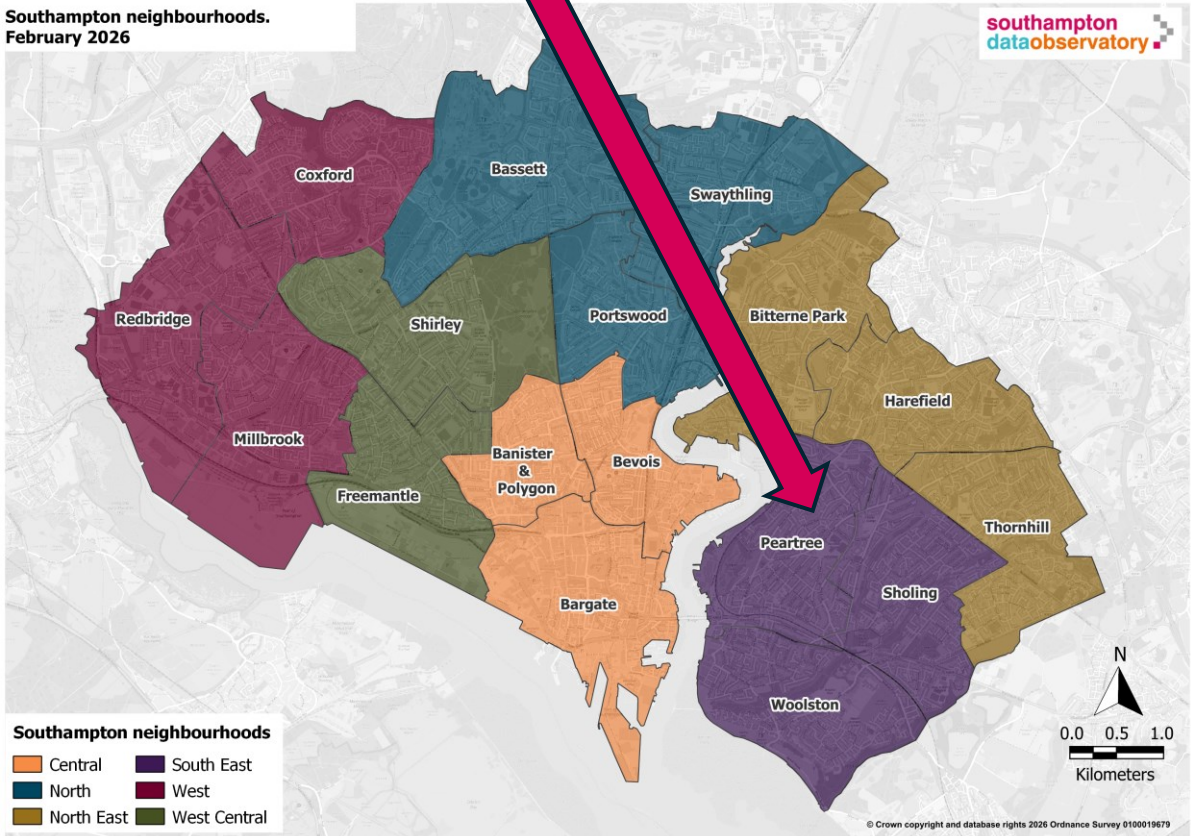
Each neighbourhood has been profiled based on its unique composition and need\*. These needs will be used to prioritise and inform service delivery at a local level in Southampton.

*\*Broad generalisations have been made about what makes each neighbourhood different. There are many individual residents in each neighbourhood who do not fit the profile.*

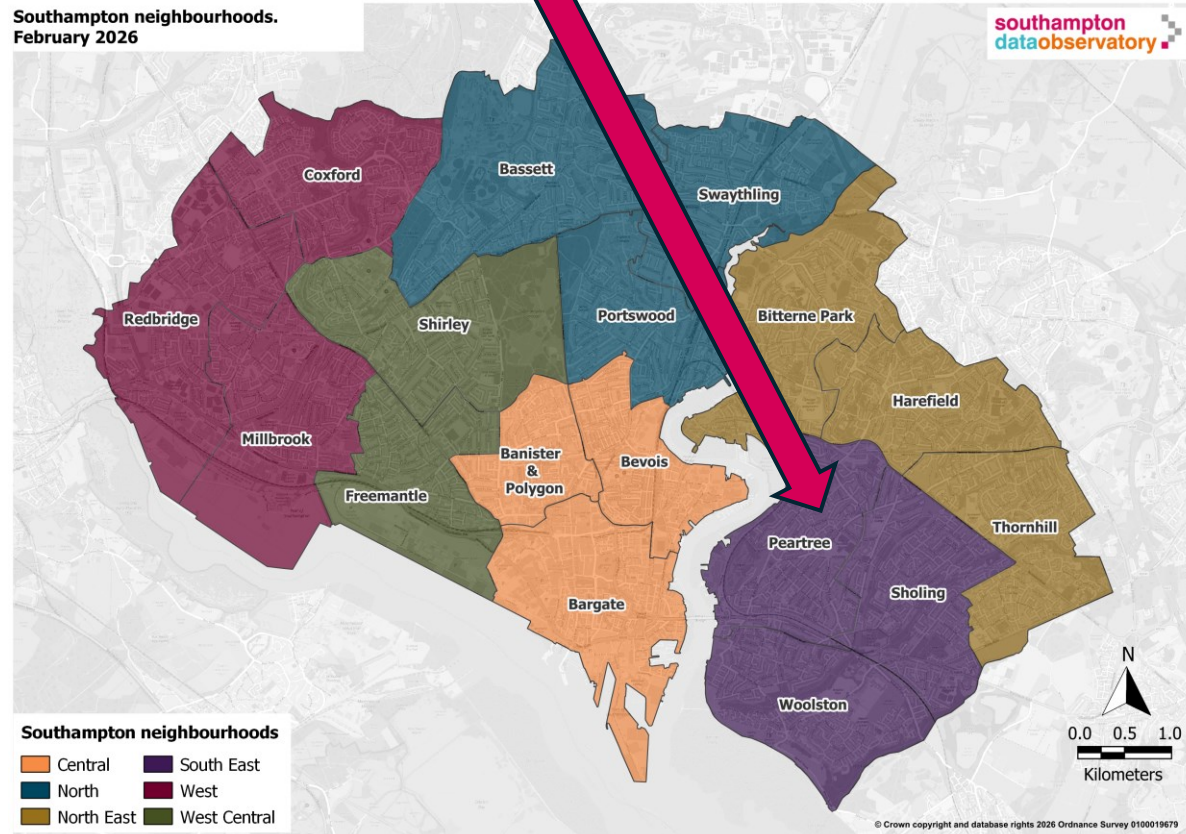

Southampton's South East neighbourhood (particularly Sholing and Woolston) has a higher proportion of residents aged 65+. This neighbourhood also has some of the worst mortality rates and shortest life expectancy in the city. Hospital admissions due to falls are also higher here.

Peartree has an acute need for adult social care. The number of care contacts, safeguarding concerns and section 42 enquiries are the highest in Southampton.

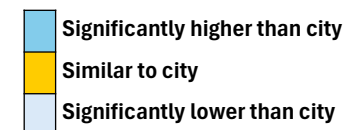
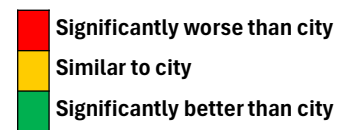
17.7% of residents live in IMD1 (England's most deprived 20% LSOAs). All three LSOAs in IMD1 are in the South East corner of Woolston, E01017281 (Weston Shore) is the most deprived LSOA in Southampton.

Geographical isolation and active travel is a challenge in parts of this neighbourhood, with all wards significantly worse than the city average for walking or cycling to work. Self reported bad health and disability is also high in this neighbourhood, especially in Woolston.

The population is growing slowly, forecast to increase by less than 300 (0.6%) by 2030.

# Discussion points

How do these insights impact priorities?



All wards in the South East neighbourhood have above city average levels of English spoken as a main language. Sholing has the highest rate in the city at 96.8%. Sholing also has the highest % of residents aged 65 or older.

This neighbourhood has some of the worst mortality (all cause ) and life expectancy rates in the city. By all measures, life expectancy is significantly worse than the city average in Peartree and Woolston. Sholing is slightly better but statistically similar to the city average for these measures.

Hospital admissions due to falls is a significant challenge in Peartree and Woolston, higher than almost any other ward in Southampton. Woolston also has higher than average drug related admissions.

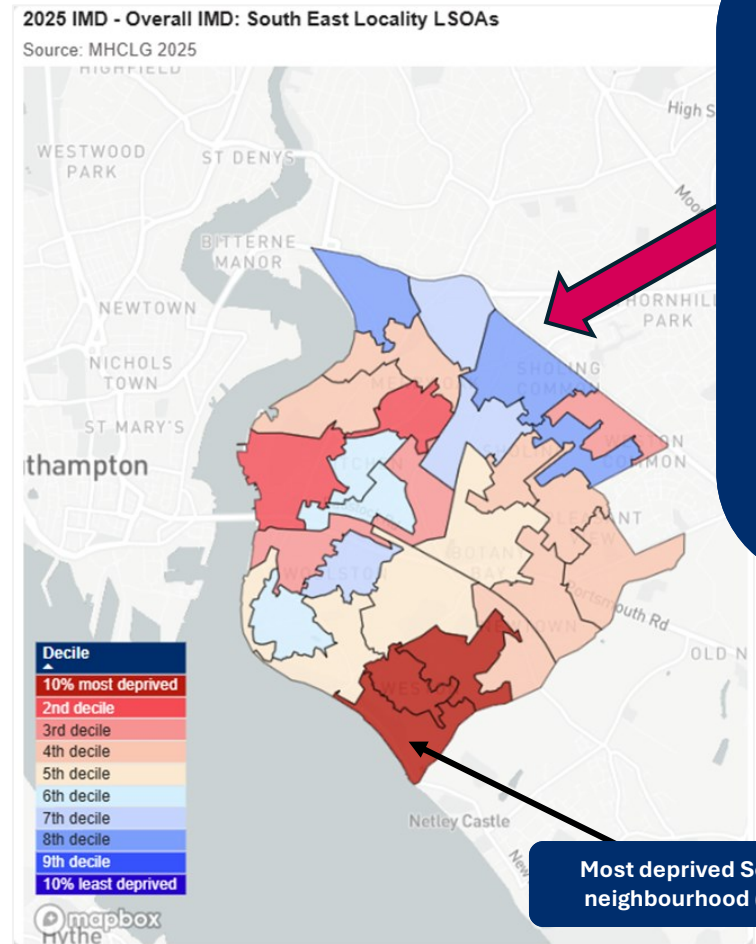

Active travel is a particular concern in this neighbourhood, with all wards significantly worse than the city average. Self reported bad health and disability is also high in this neighbourhood, especially Woolston.

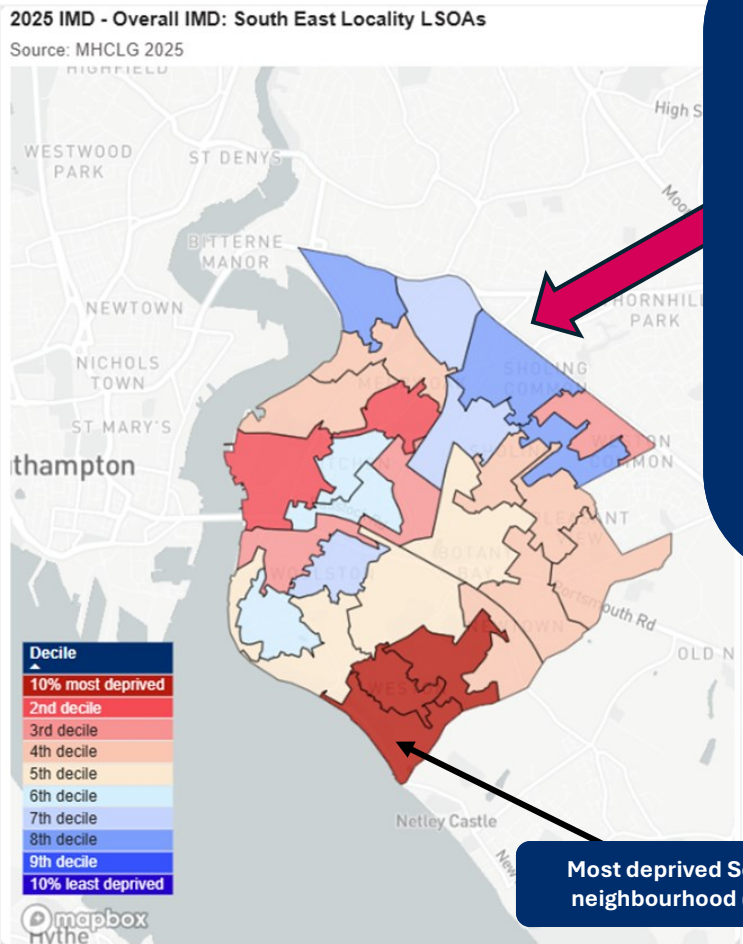
Woolston has by far the most greenspace in this neighbourhood (26.3%). Sholing and Peartree have significantly less greenspace than Southampton as a whole.



South East neighbourhood has the highest proportion of properties owned at 59% and the 2nd lowest proportion private rented (21%) across all neighbourhoods. 19% of properties in South East are social rented.

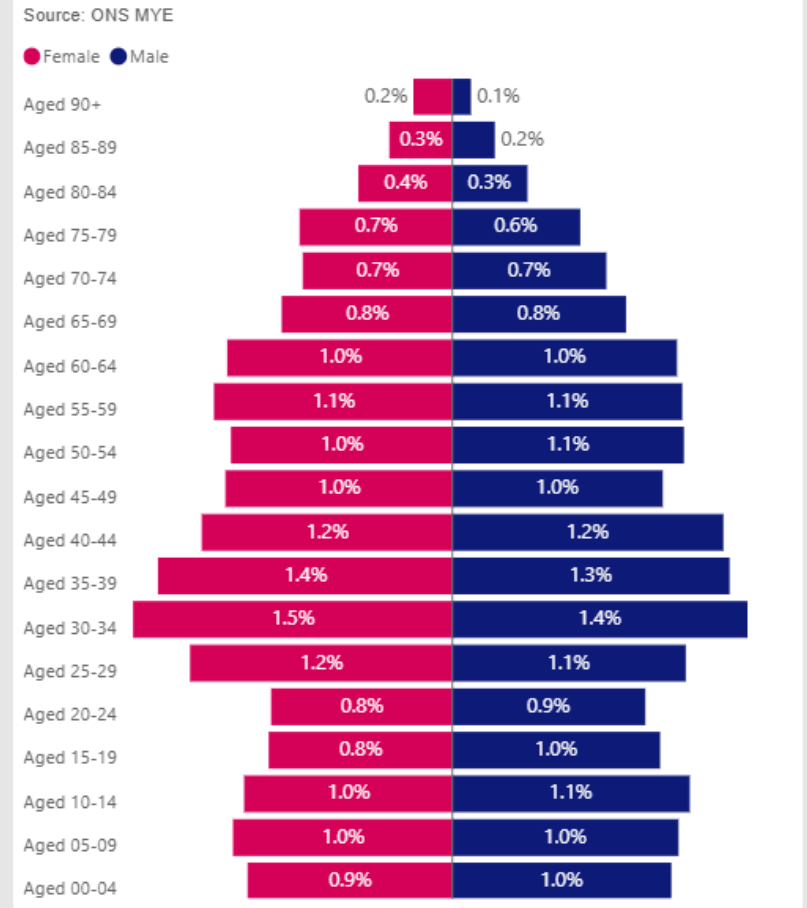

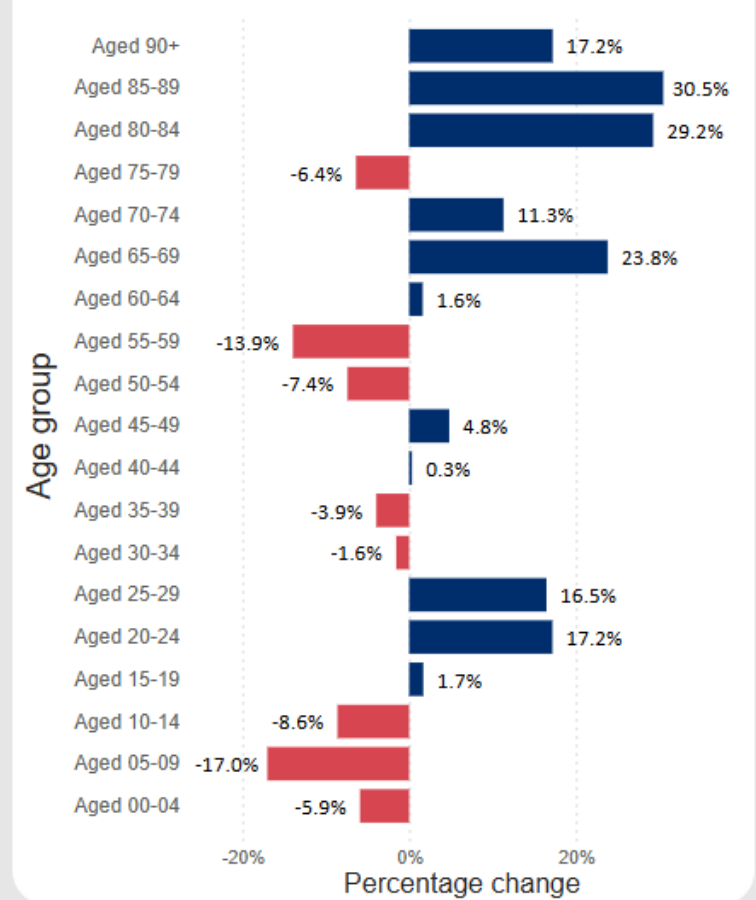

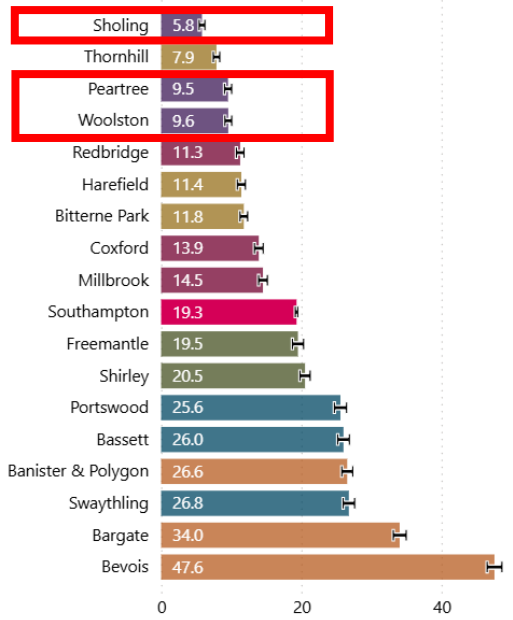

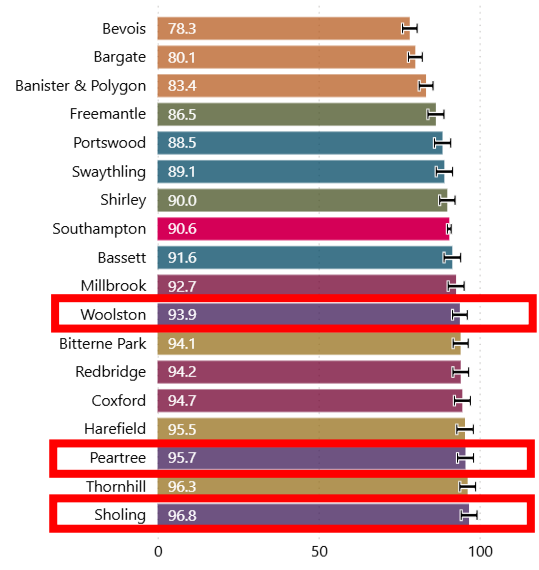

Percentage of households that have one or more persons with English as a main language by Ward: 2021



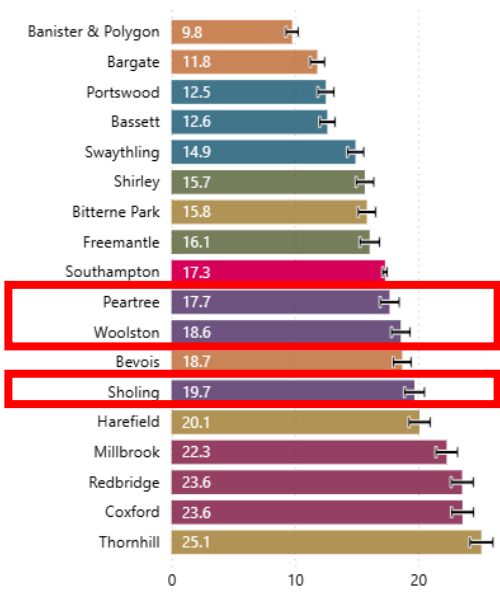

## Less ethnic and cultural diversity with an ageing population

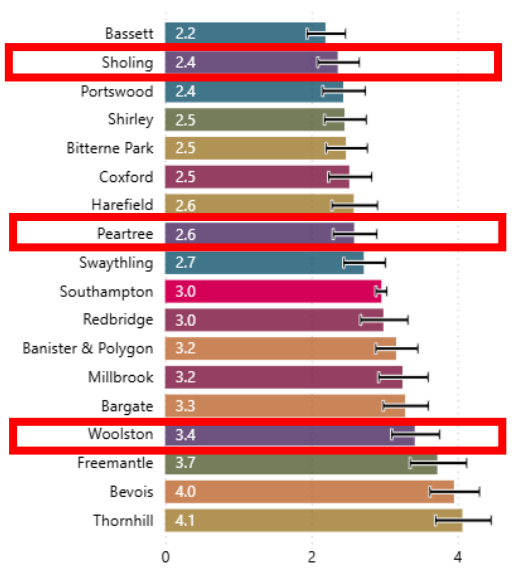
- All three wards have higher proportions of households where all residents have English as a main language than the city average and a lower proportion of minority ethnic residents.
- Sholing and Woolston have a significantly higher percentage of resident population aged 65+ compared to Southampton average, whilst Peartree and Woolston is significantly higher for ages under 16.
- In terms of demographic change, there is forecasted growth in older residents 65+ across Peartree, Sholing and Woolston along with a decline in the under 16 age group.

## Lower qualification levels and mixed economic activity

- All three wards have higher proportions of residents with no qualifications than the Southampton average.
- Economic activity levels are significantly better than the city average in all three wards despite lower qualification levels.
- There is mixed unemployment across the neighbourhood, with Woolston significantly worse than the city average, Peartree is similar and Sholing significantly better.

## Mix of health outcomes

- Premature mortality (from all causes and specific conditions such as cancer or cardiovascular disease) is notably worse in Peartree and Woolston, indicating more significant health inequalities. Sholing’s mortality rates are closer to the city average.
- Male and female Life expectancy is significantly worse in Peartree and Woolston.

- Sholing has lower hospital admissions overall, with fewer drug-related, fall-related and child injury admissions compared with the Southampton average.

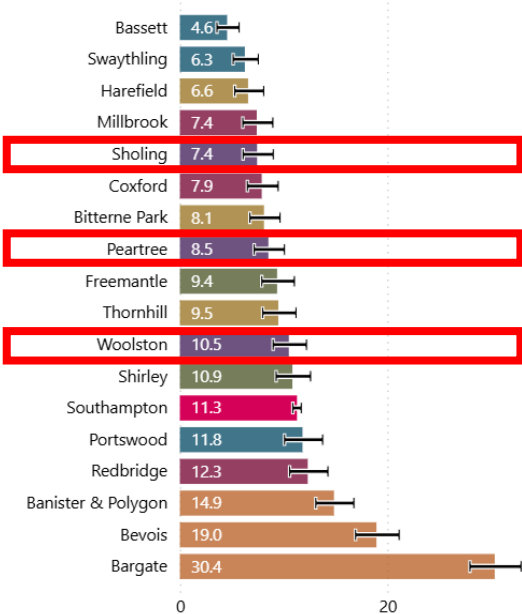

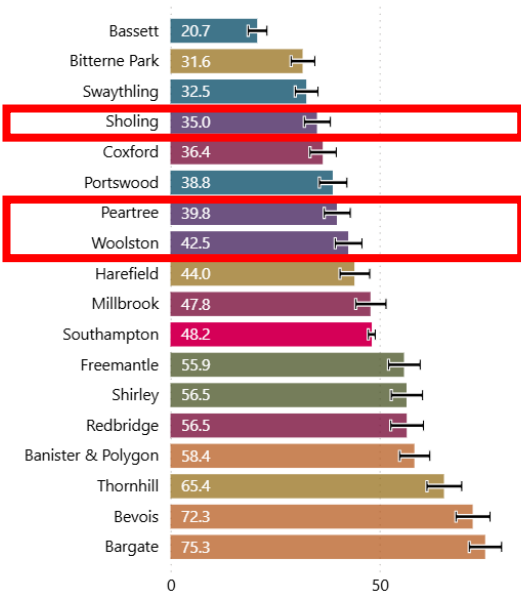
## Elevated education challenges

- Woolston shows the highest educational need in the neighbourhood, with significantly higher absence, persistent absence, FSM eligibility and the highest suspension rate in the city, compared with better outcomes in Sholing and Peartree.
- Sholing and Peartree have better education outcomes, with better attendance than Woolston.
- All three wards perform well in early years, with children achieving a good level of development at the end of Reception at rates above the Southampton average.

Rate of violent crime per 1k population by Ward: January 2023 - December 2023



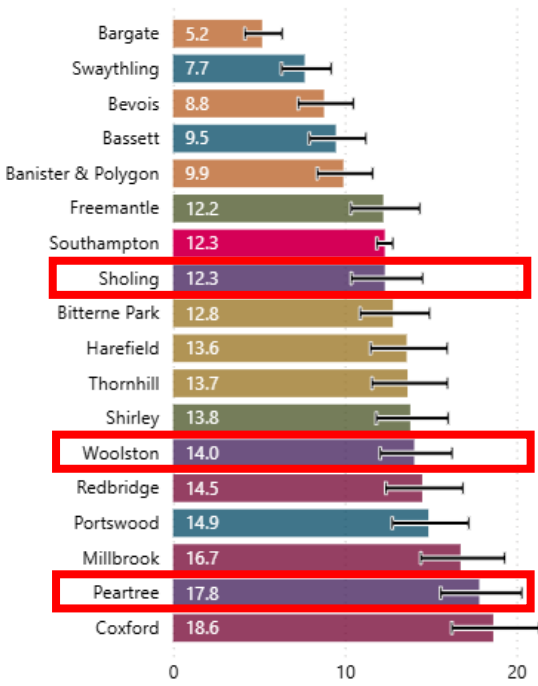

## Generally low crime, localised pressures

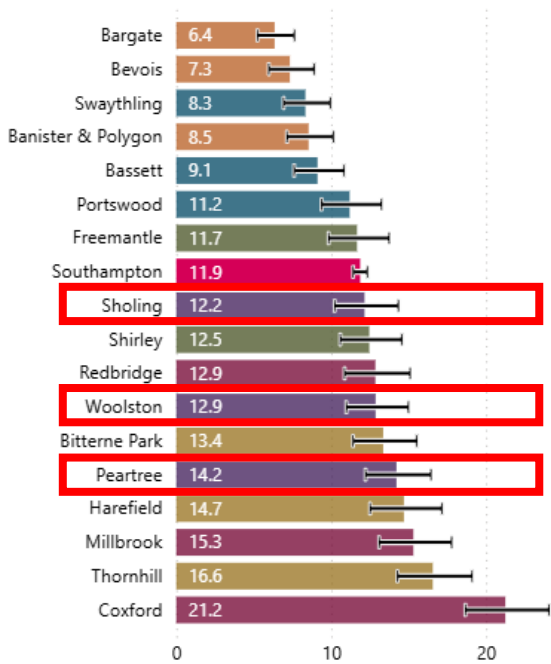
- Overall crime levels are low. All three wards are similar or significantly better than the Southampton average across the board
- Woolston has pockets of higher crime rates, with antisocial behaviour and domestic abuse-related crime higher than in Sholing and Peartree, though still largely below or close to the city average.
- The data suggests a generally safe neighbourhood, with localised crime in Woolston

Rate of new care request contacts where one of the three outcomes was Care Act Assessment Required per 1k population aged 18+ by Ward: March 2023 - February 2024



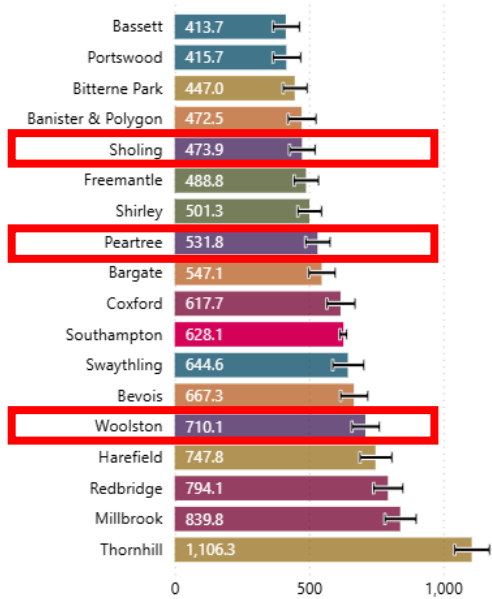

## High safeguarding and Adult Social Care (ASC) demand

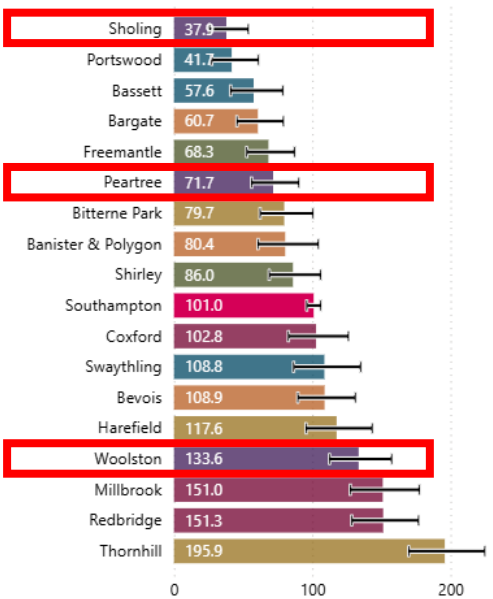
- Peartree shows the highest overall adult social care demand, with significantly more contacts resulting in information, advice and guidance than any ward in the city.
- Peartree has substantial ongoing need, with the city's second-highest level of active ASC cases and the highest rate of safeguarding concerns
- Safeguarding need is concentrated in Peartree and Woolston, which have the highest rates of Section 42 enquiries, indicating elevated risks and complexity.
- Sholing has the lowest ASC need in the South East neighbourhood, including one of the lowest Section 42 enquiry rates in Southampton.

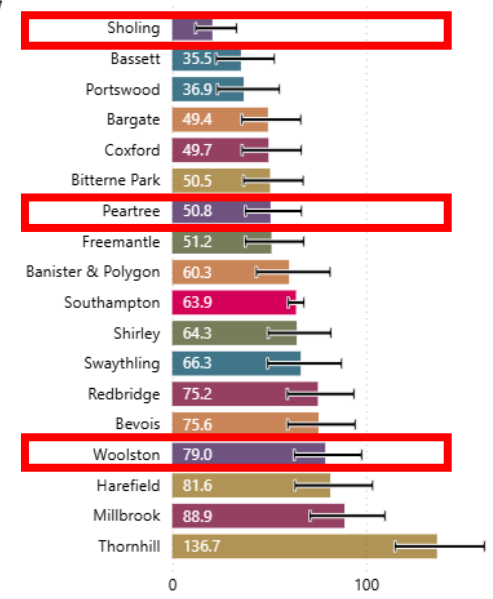
Rate of Children In Need per 10k 0-17 population by Ward: 2020/21 - 2022/23

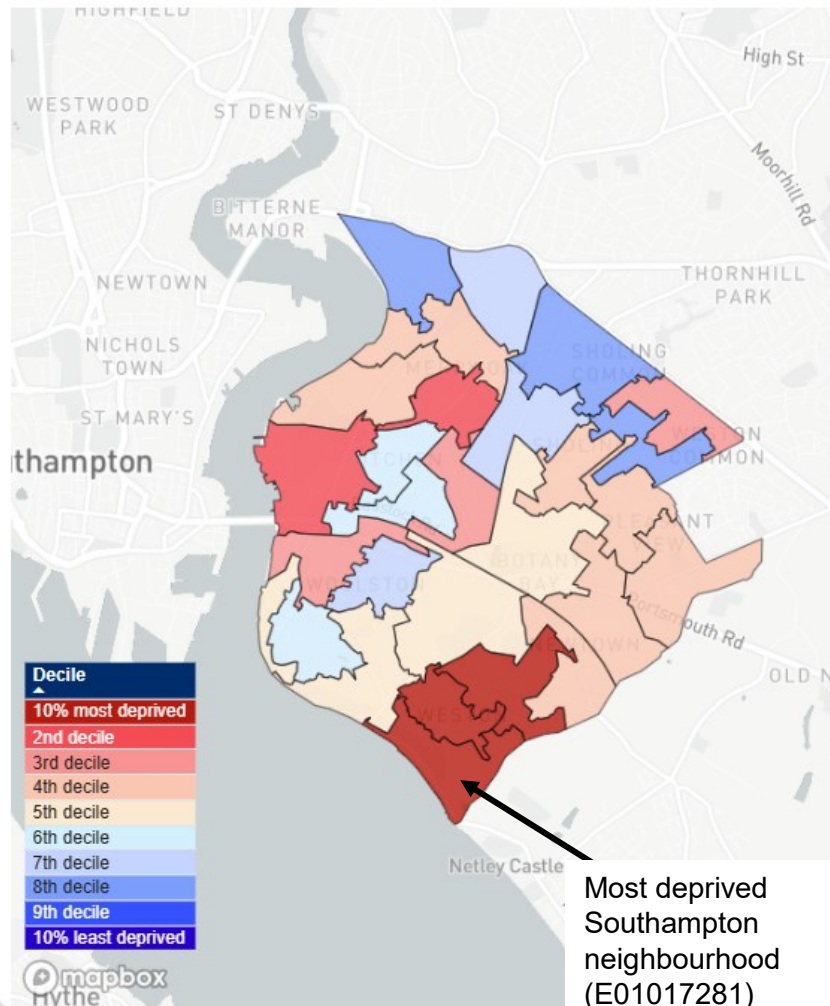
## Children's Social Care (CSC) need varies

- Sholing has the low levels of children's social care need, with significantly lower Children in Need rates and the lowest rate of Child Protection Plans and Children Looked After in the city.
- Woolston displays the highest need, among the top 5 wards in the city with the highest rate of Children in Need, Child Protection Plans and Children Looked After.
- Peartree's CSC need is generally similar to or lower than the Southampton average.

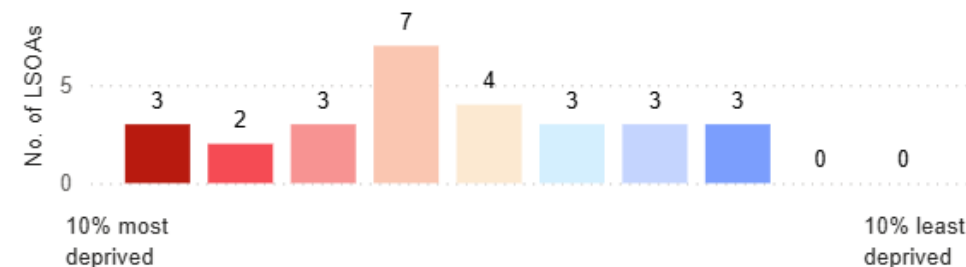

Number of LSOAs by decile - South East Locality: Overall IMD (2025)

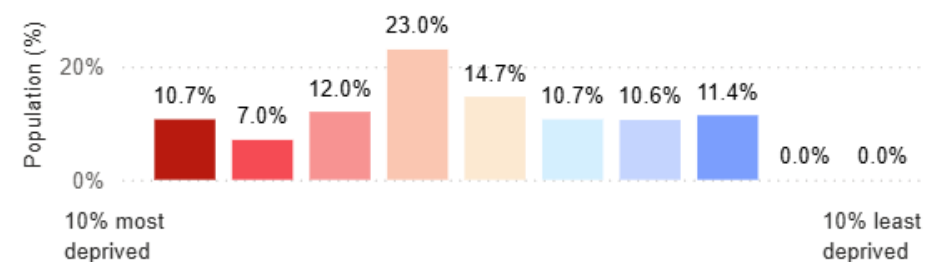

Percentage of population by decile - South East Locality: Overall IMD (2025)

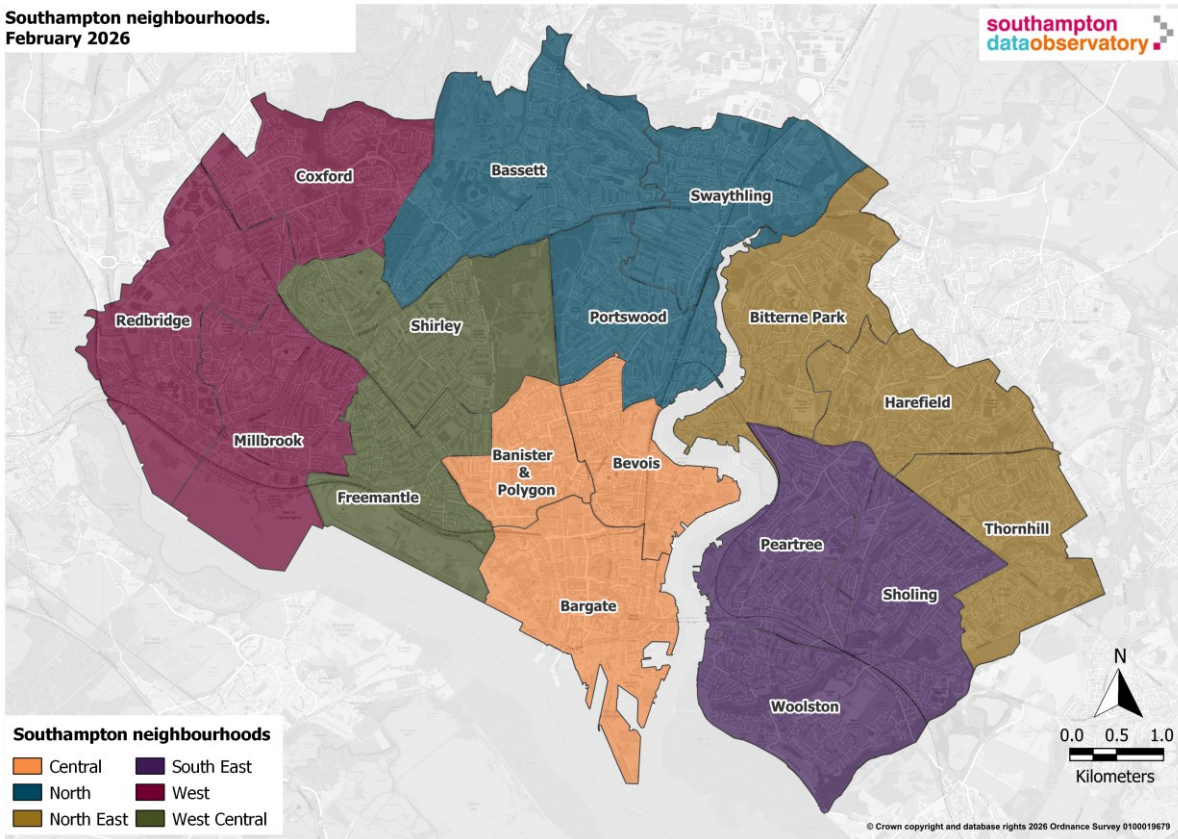
