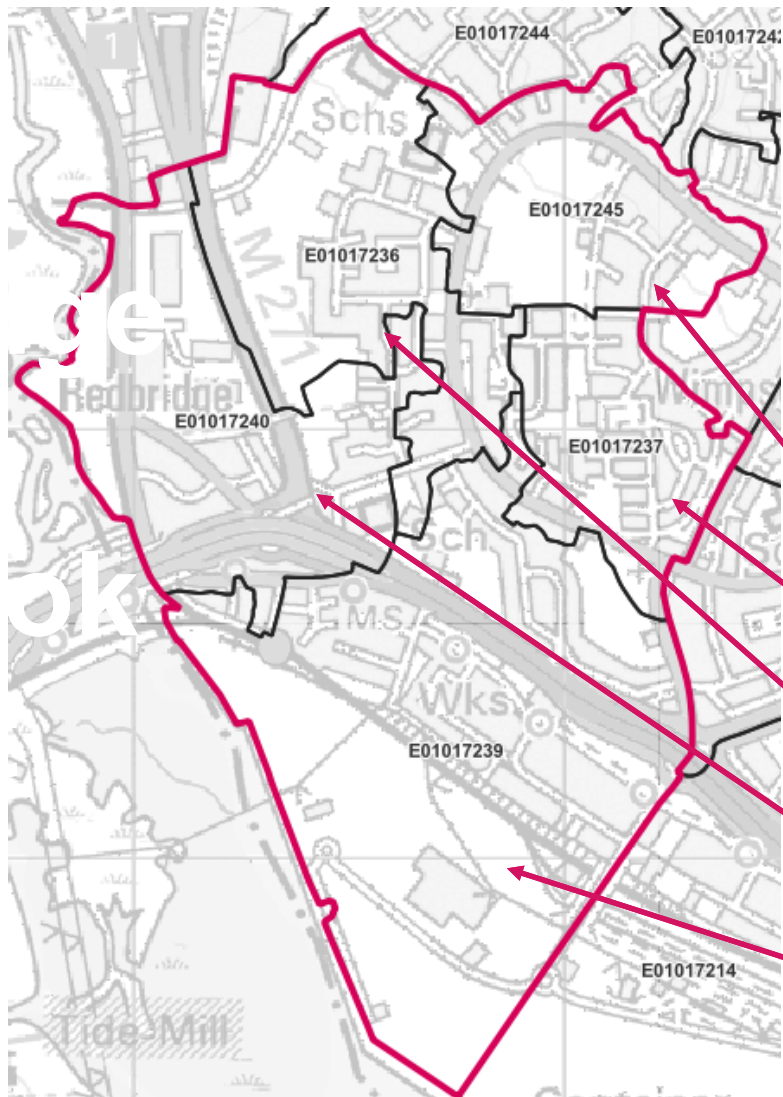

Redbridge & Millbrook West

“Poorer outcomes for children and adults in areas of high deprivation”
Pop: 7,305



Key challenges for children include high levels of child poverty including free school meals eligibility, childhood obesity, school absence, children’s social care need and child hospital admissions specifically for the under 5s.



Challenges for adults include low life expectancy, poor health with high levels of disability with hospital admissions and causes of death reflect poor outcomes across most areas, including high rates for all age cancer, cardiovascular and respiratory diseases as well as admissions for hip fracture (65+) and alcohol admissions.



More deprived (overall) More deprived (overall) with significant challenges in all deprivation areas (Income, Employment, Education Skills & Training, Health Deprivation & Disability, Housing, Living Environment and Crime) apart from Barriers to Housing & Services

More Adults have **low qualifications**. **Employment rates are lower**, with **more people out of work** or who have never worked. **Benefit reliance is higher** among both working and non-working adults



Areas with **more local authority social-rented housing**, typically with band C and D EPC likely built in 1950 and 60s. **Experience higher levels** of crimes such as criminal damage and arson, other crime, possession of weapons and violence and sexual offences.

Population in Redbridge & Millbrook West

Around a quarter (24%) of Redbridge and Millbrooks population is aged 0 to 15 years, higher percentages in the 5 to 14 age groups, suggest a higher number of families.

The working-age population (16 to 64 year) forms the largest group overall (63%), with a clear concentration in the 35 to 44 age range, particularly among women, 41% of families with dependent children are lone parents; who are likely to be part of this age group

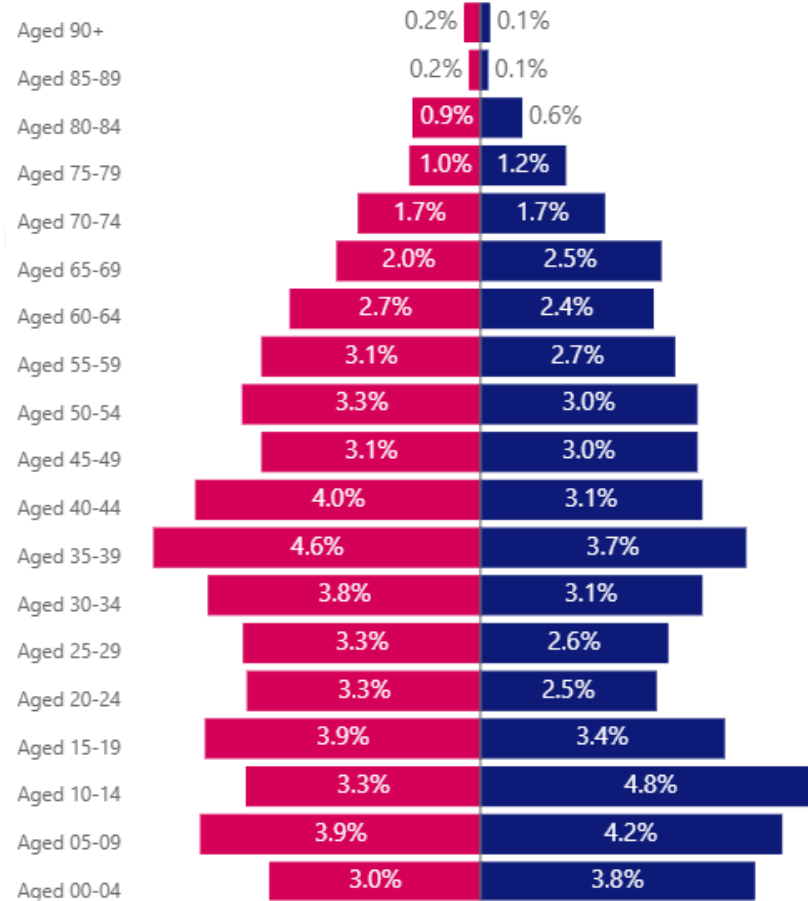
Around 1 in 10 or 12.3% of residents are aged 65+, gradually declining with age, signalling future growth in age-related health and care demand.

79.8% of residents live in IMD1 (England's most deprived 20% LSOAs).

Population change and ethnicity

Redbridge & Millbrook West is set to have a growing population in young adults aged 15-34 and older ages, particularly ages 80-84. The decline is highest in ages 5-9, suggesting families are moving when children are starting school.

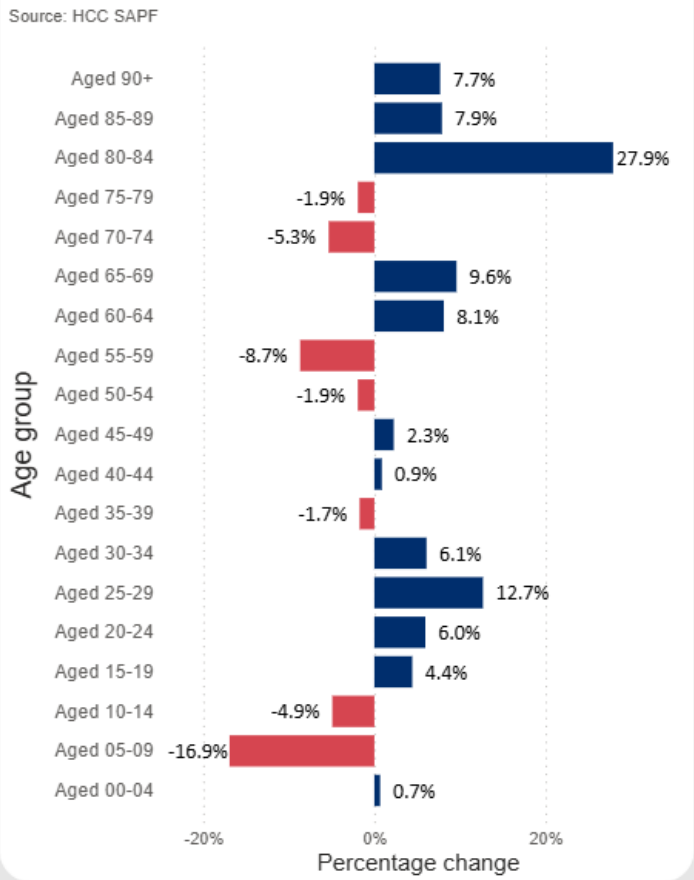

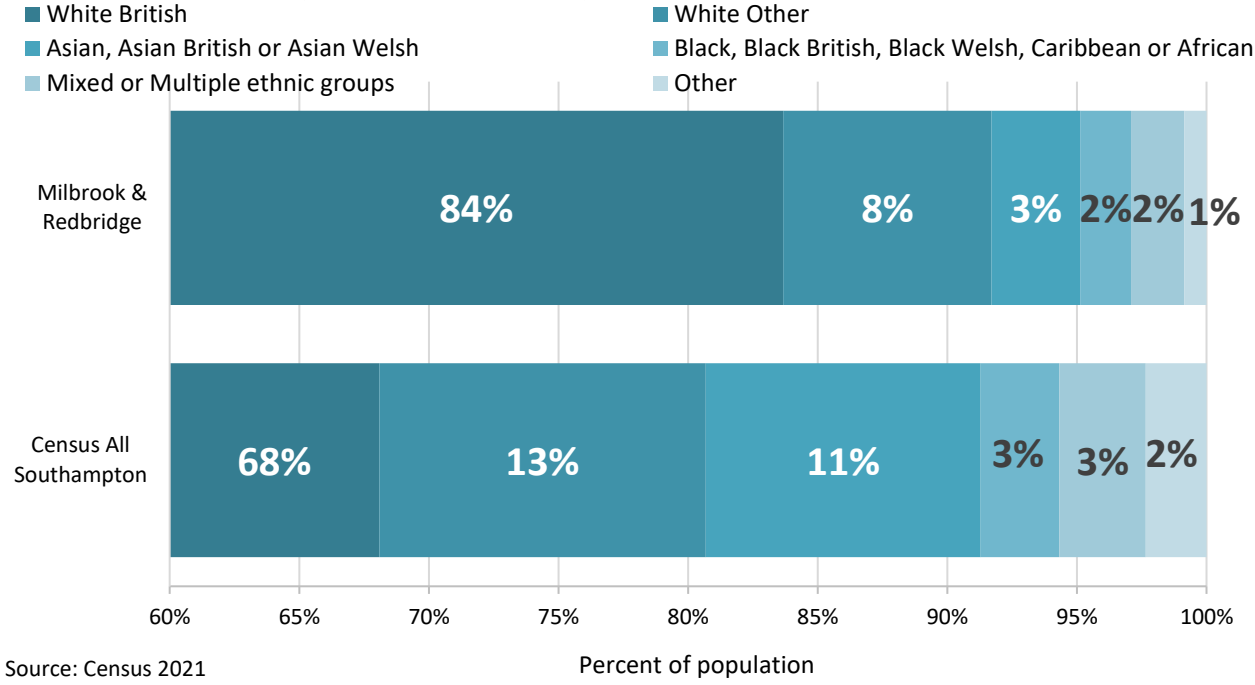

Eight out of 10 people in **Redbridge** and **Millbrook** are **White British**, higher than 7 out of 10 for the city. There are lower levels of ethnicity across **Redbridge** and **Millbrook** compared to Southampton overall.

Redbridge & Millbrook West MSOA has the 4th highest fertility rate of all 33 MSOAs in the city; 63. per 1k, significantly higher than Southampton (48.3 per 1k) and England (54.6 per 1k)

In Redbridge & Millbrook West, 1 in 13 live babies (7.9%) are low birth weight, worse than 1 in 14 for both Southampton (7.1%) and England (6.8%), ranking 11th worse MSOA (worse third)

Redbridge & Millbrook West has higher rates of childhood obesity than Southampton and England. Overweight including obese % in Year R is both significantly higher in Redbridge & Millbrook West than Southampton and England averages, ranking 8th in the city's 33 MSOAs

Redbridge & Millbrook West has significantly higher rates than England and Southampton for children and young people admissions; ranked 2nd worst in the city for all cause emergency admission in under 5 years. For Unintentional and deliberate injuries emergency admissions, Redbridge & Millbrook West is the worst for under 5s, 4th worst for under 15s & 7th worst for 15 to 24 yrs.

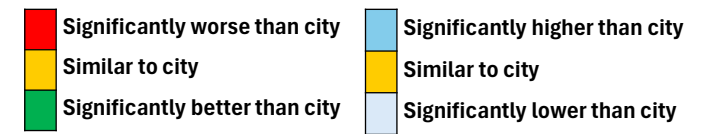

Redbridge & Millbrook West: Adult Hospital Admissions



Out of the 31 MSOAs where emergency admission rates were available, **Redbridge & Millbrook West** has the **4th highest** rate in the city for **all cause** admissions.

Hip fracture in 65+ yrs ranks **10th**, in the worse third MSOAs of the city

Intentional self harm is significantly worse and **2.6x** higher than the England average, ranking **8th** in the **worse 25%** of the city's rates and significantly worse than the city average, and links with importance of **good mental health and well-being**

Males and females in Redbridge & Millbrook West have significantly lower life expectancy (75.8 years and 80.0 years respectively) than the city average (78.1 years and 82.3 years) and the England average (79.1 years and 83.0 years)

Redbridge & Millbrook West males die 2 years 10 month before the average Southampton male and 3 years 5 months before the average England males. Females die 2 years 3 months before the average Southampton female and 3 years before the average England females

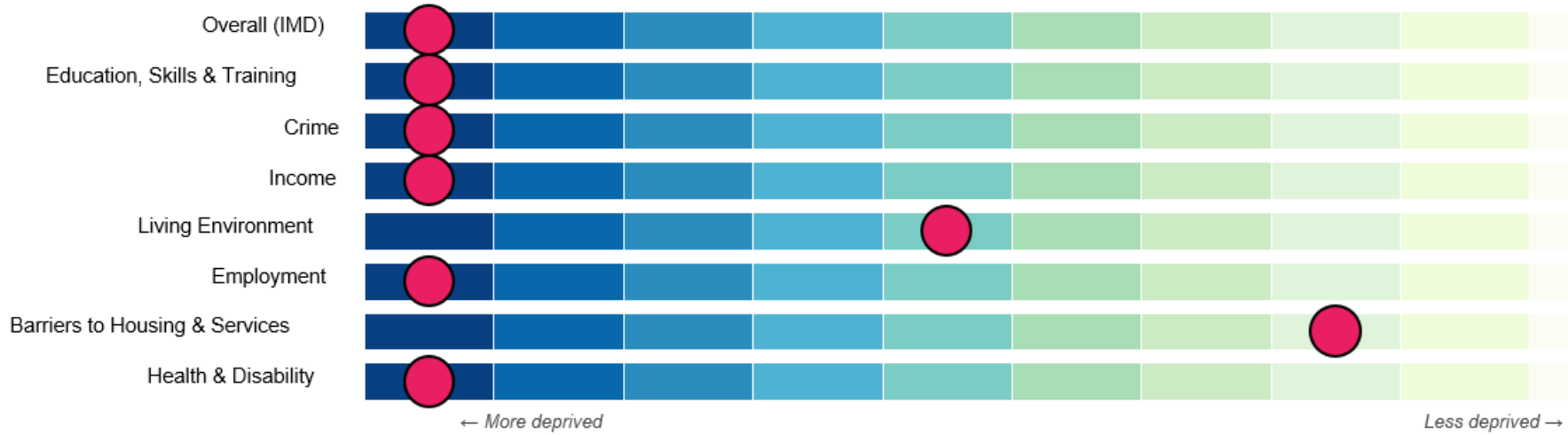
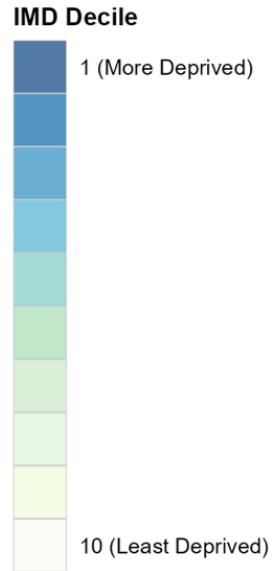
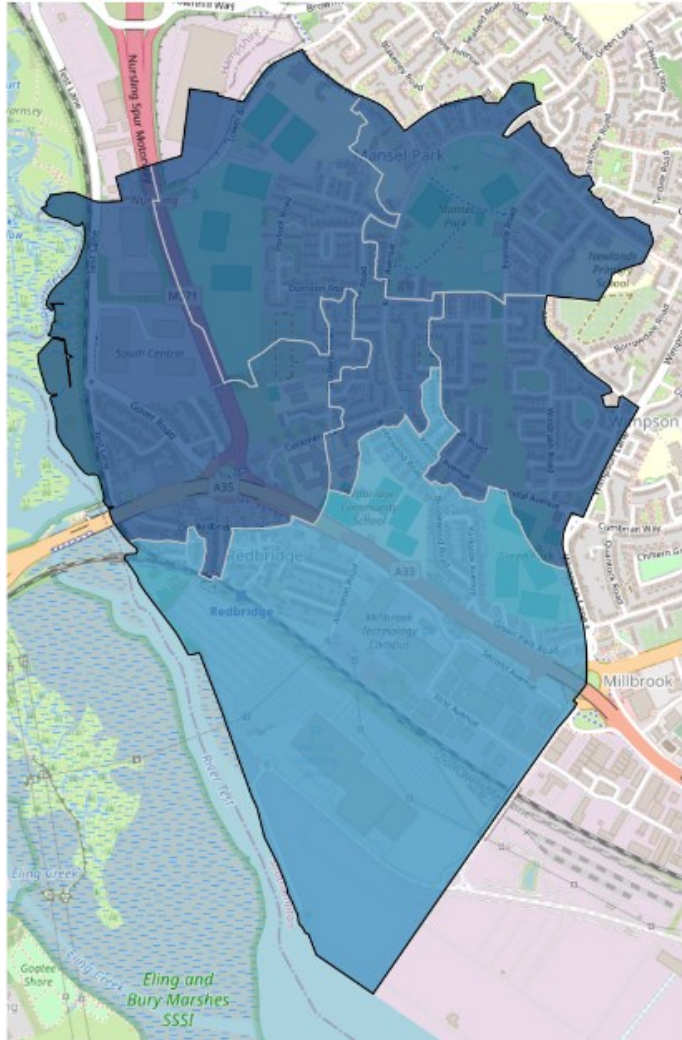
Redbridge & Millbrook West ranks in top 25% highest death rates among the 33 MSOAs for 5 indicators, with higher deaths rates of both cardiovascular deaths (1.4x higher than England rate) and coronary heart disease (1.6x higher than England rate).

Also 2nd highest in the city for death from respiratory disease (2.0x higher than England rate) and the 5th highest for under 75 cancer deaths (1.5x higher than England)

For 5 indicators, Redbridge and Millbrook West's rate of deaths from different causes is in the top 25% city rankings. These rates range from 1.4x to 1.8x higher than England

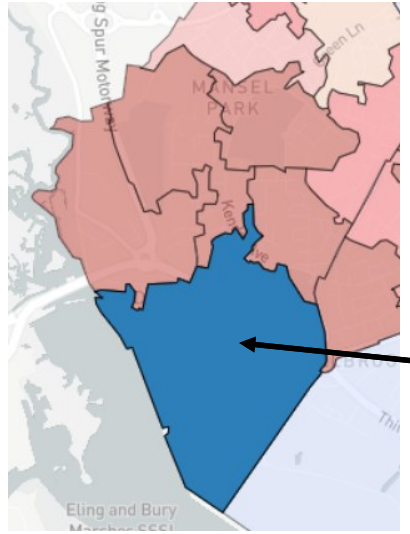
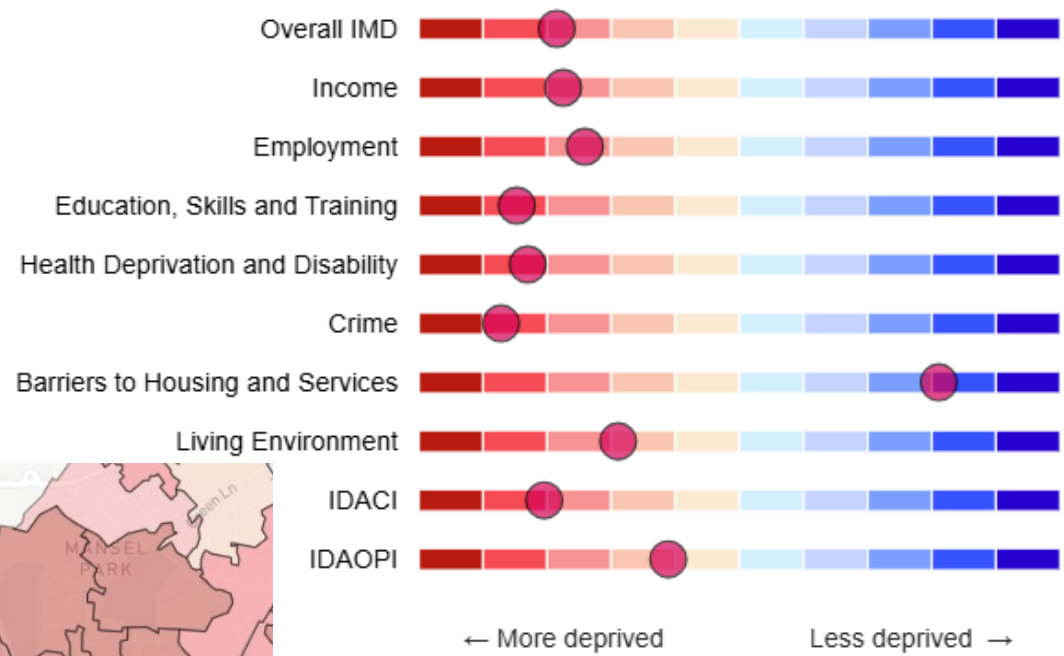

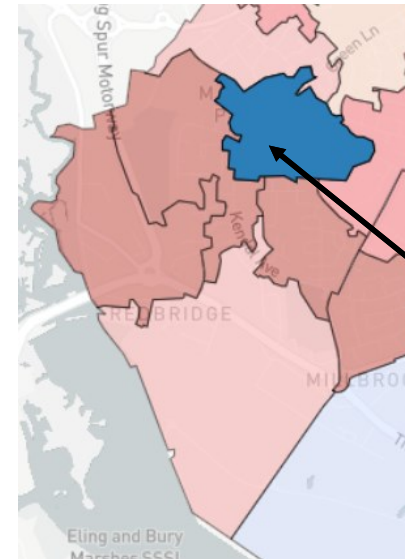

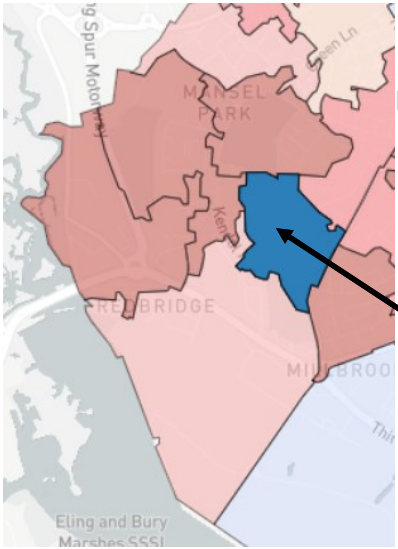

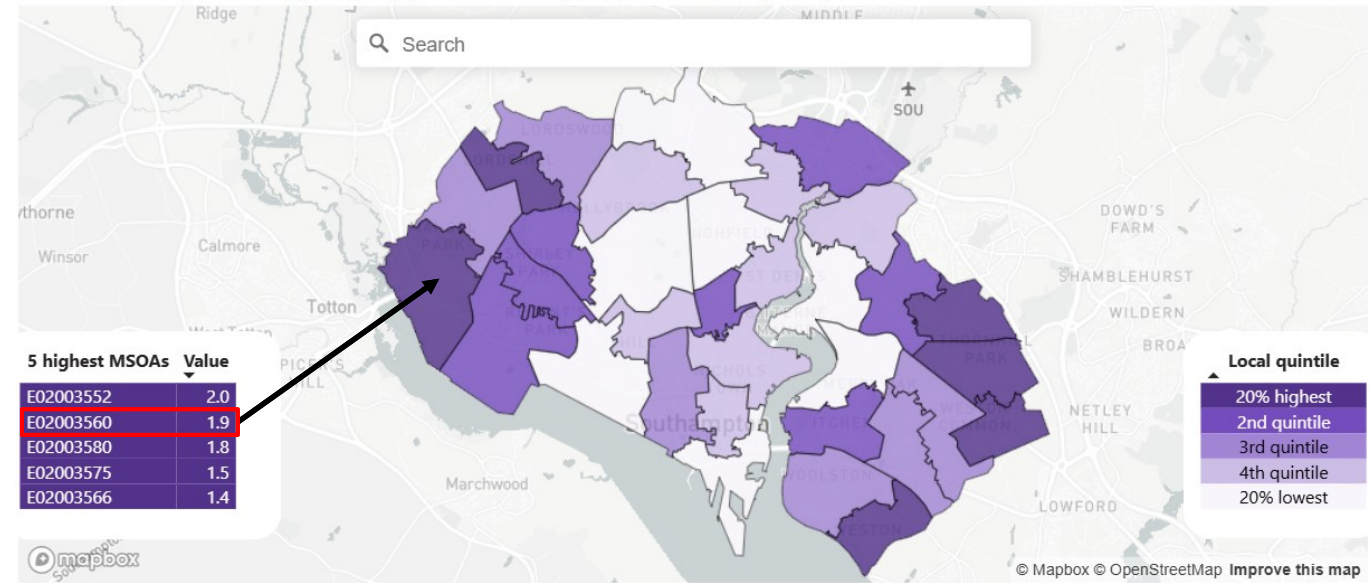

General health: Very bad health, deciles of population, Southampton by lower layer super output areas (LSOAs): Census 2021

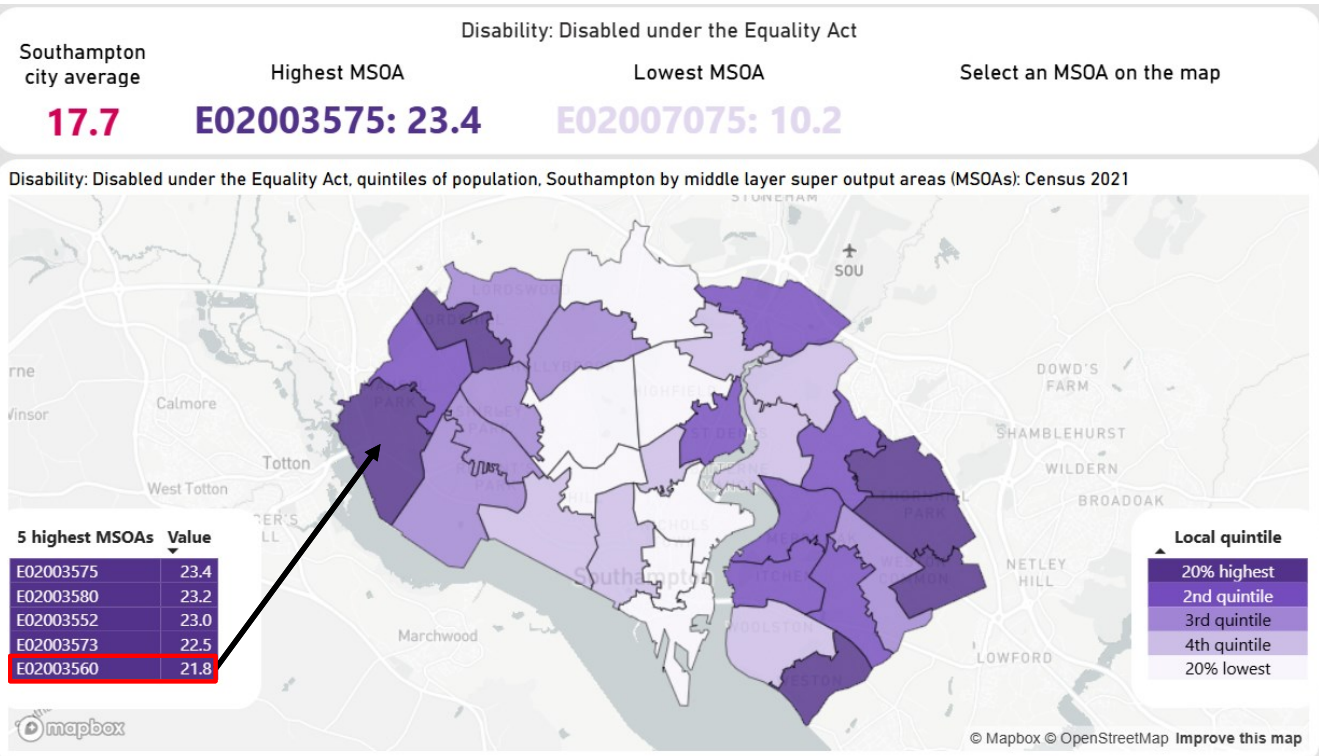


Redbridge & Millbrook West MSOA experiences some of the poorest health outcomes in Southampton, ranking in the top five MSOAs for very bad and fair health. One of its LSOAs also ranked 2nd in the city's top five for very bad health.

Disability

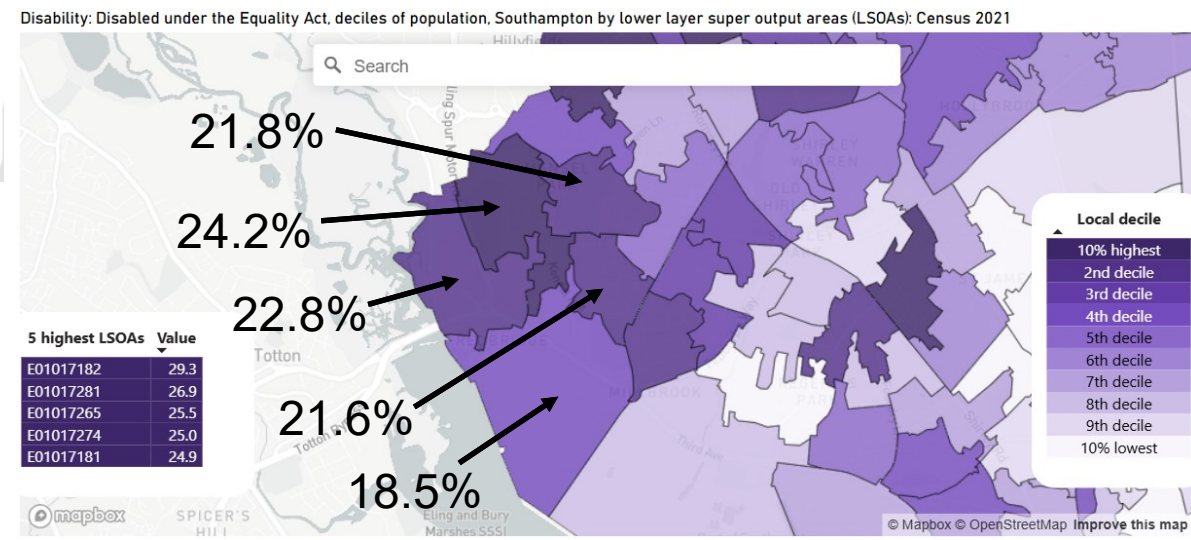


21.8% of residents in Redbridge & Millbrook West identify as having a disability under the Equality Act, the 5th highest MSOA across Southampton and higher than the Southampton (17.7%) and England average (17.3%).

1 of the 4 LSOAs are in the 10% highest decile, while 2 of 4 LSOAs are in the 2nd highest decile.

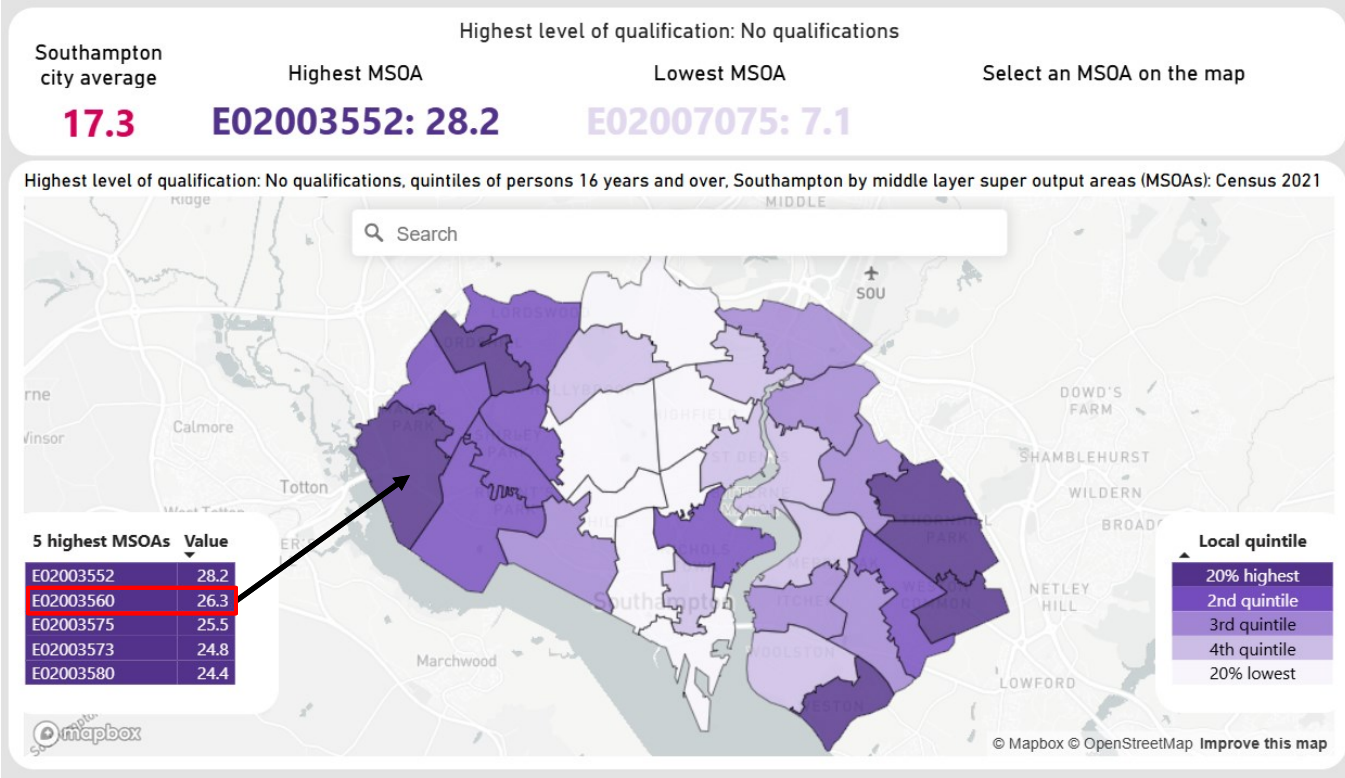

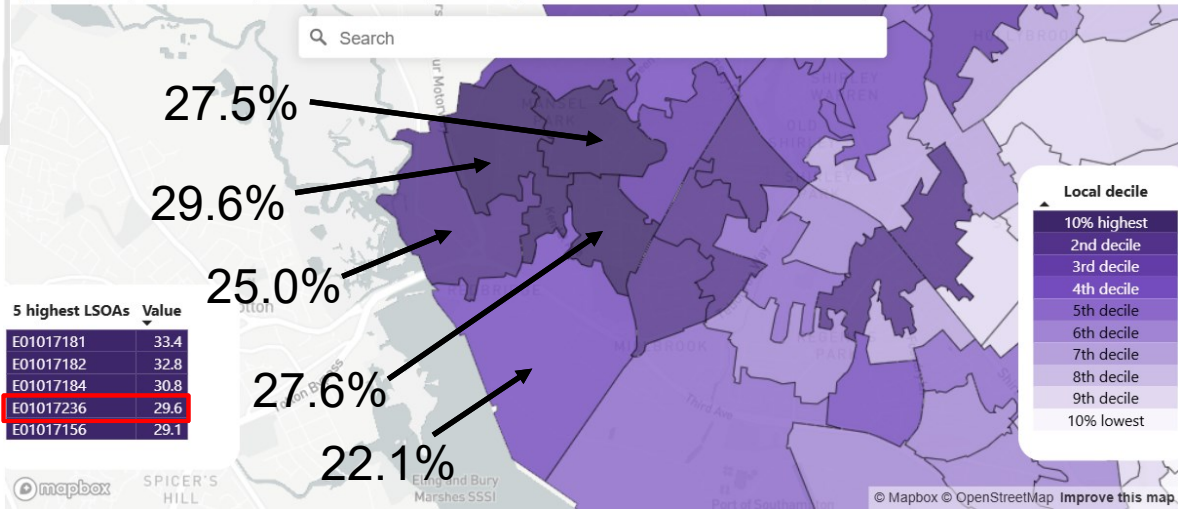

Across the five LSOAs in Redbridge & Millbrook West, three fall within the highest 10% decile, with the remaining areas in the 2nd and 4th deciles.

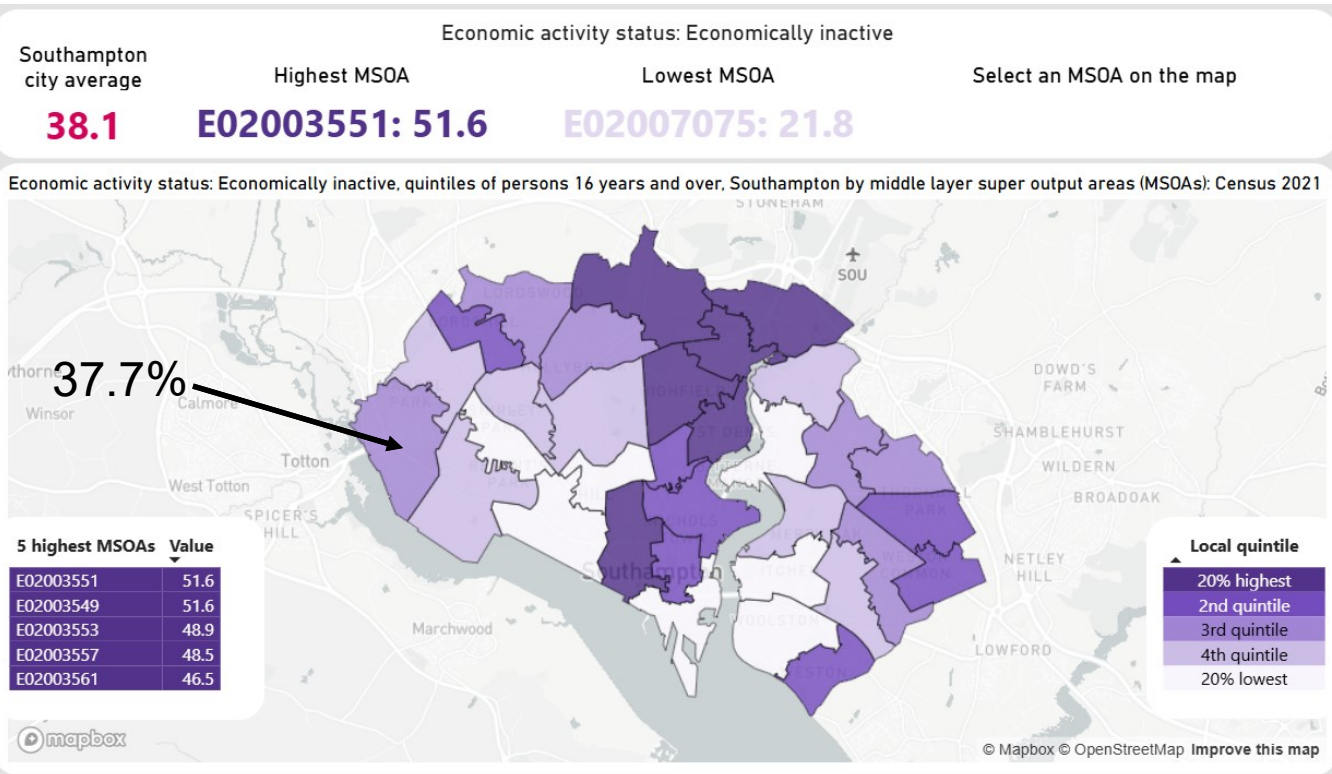

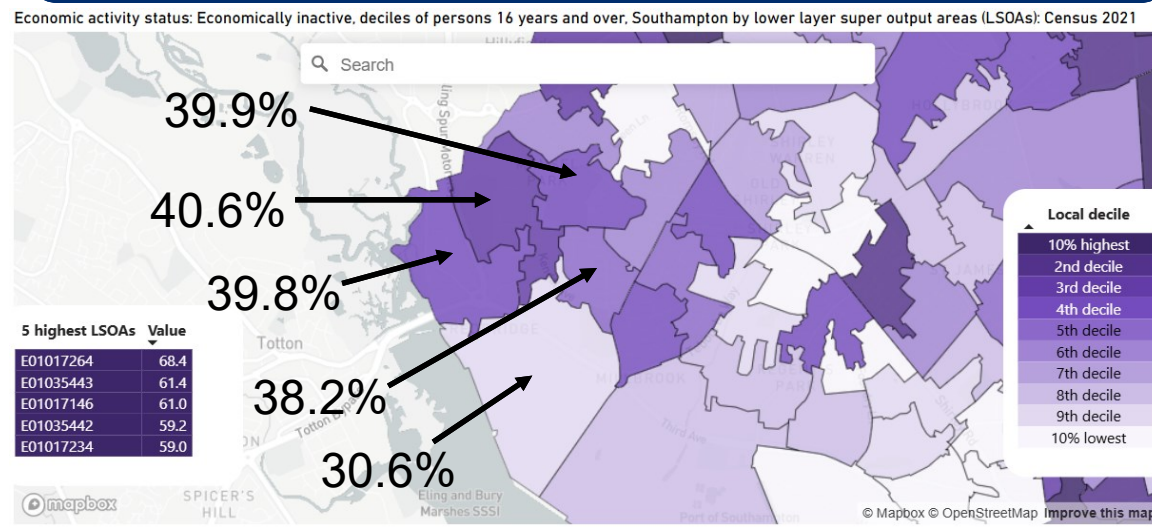

Redbridge & Millbrook West is significantly higher than Southampton for inactivity reason being long-term sick or disabled, looking after home or family & other.

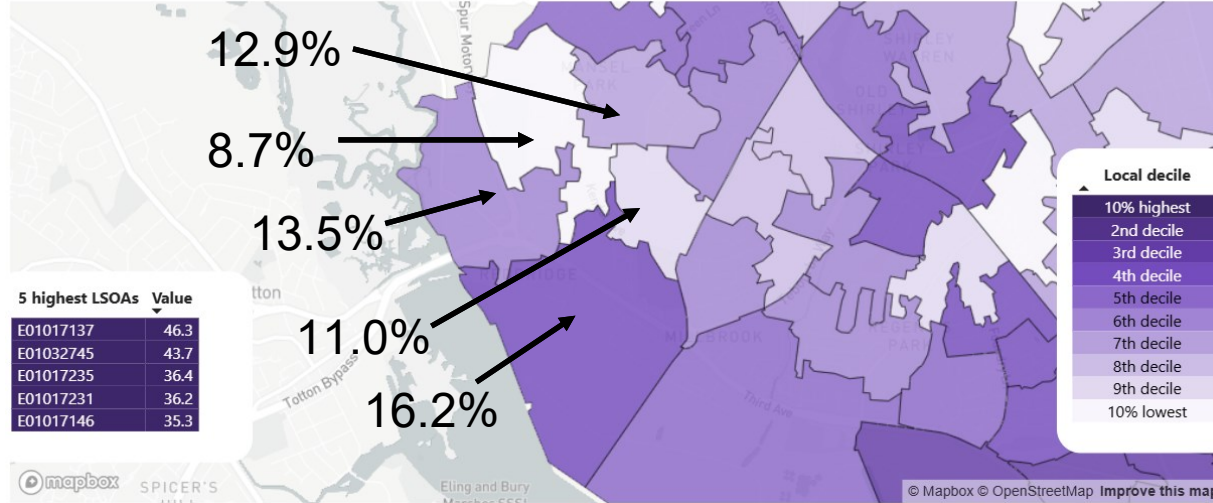


The total economic inactivity rate in Redbridge & Millbrook West (37.7%) is lower, but not significantly, than the Southampton average (38.1%). Across the five LSOAs in Redbridge & Millbrook West, one falls within the highest 3rd decile, with the remaining areas in the 4th, 5th and 9th deciles.

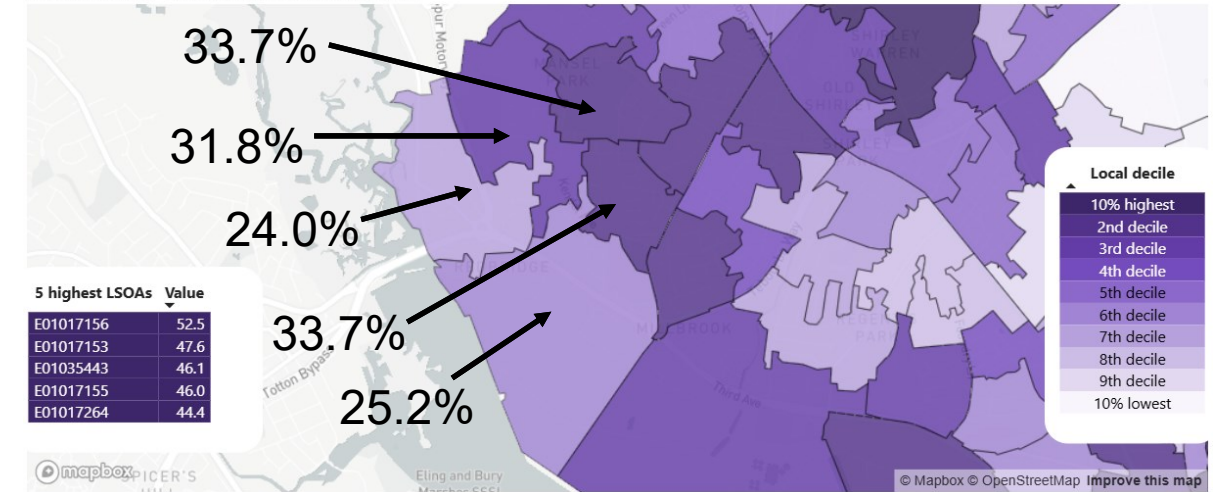

Of Redbridge & Millbrook West residents that are not in employment, 12.4% worked in the last 12 months, significantly lower than the Southampton average of 18.8%.

57.7% of those not in employment did not work in the last 12 months, significantly higher than the Southampton with 53.2%.

29.9% of unemployed residents never worked, higher, but not significantly than Southampton (27.9%).

2 LSOAs are in the 2nd decile and 1 LSOA is in the 3rd decile for highest percent of residents who are not in employment have never worked. For those who worked in the last 12 months, 1 LSOA is within the 10% lowest decile.

Overall, this points to longer periods out of employment among Redbridge & Millbrook West residents, highlighting the need for sustained employment and health-related support.

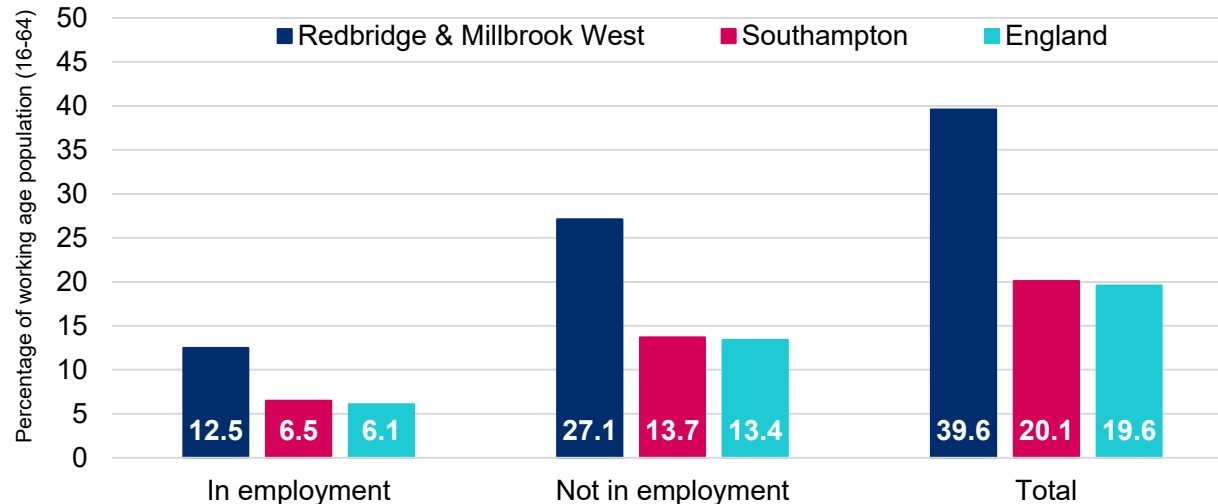

Universal Credit claimant rates in **Redbridge & Millbrook West** are **substantially higher** than both Southampton and England averages. Nearly **2 in 5 working age residents (39.6%)** are claiming Universal Credit, compared with **20.1%** across Southampton and **19.6%** for England.

Universal Credit claims among those in **employment (12.5%)** are **double** the Southampton and England rates, indicating a **high prevalence of in-work poverty**.

Rates among working age residents **not in employment (27.1%)** are also **more than twice** the city and England averages.

Together, this highlights **significant financial vulnerability** in **Redbridge & Millbrook West**, affecting both working and non-working households.

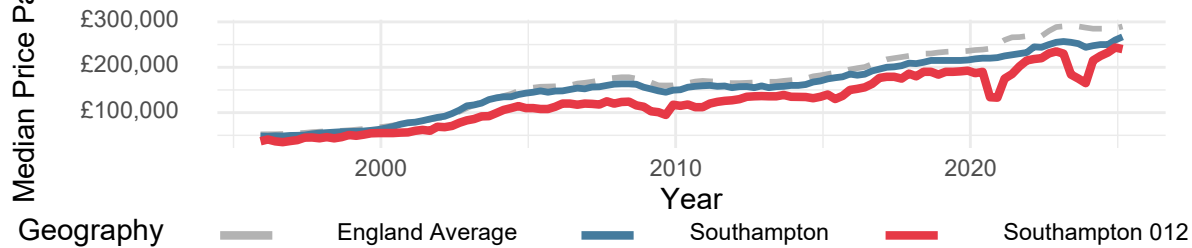

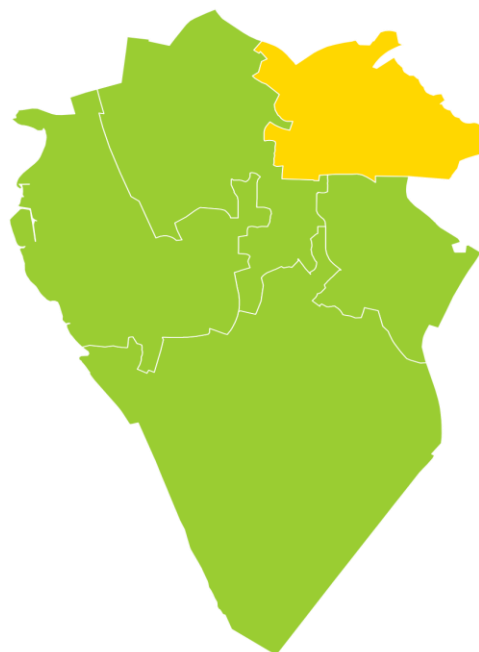

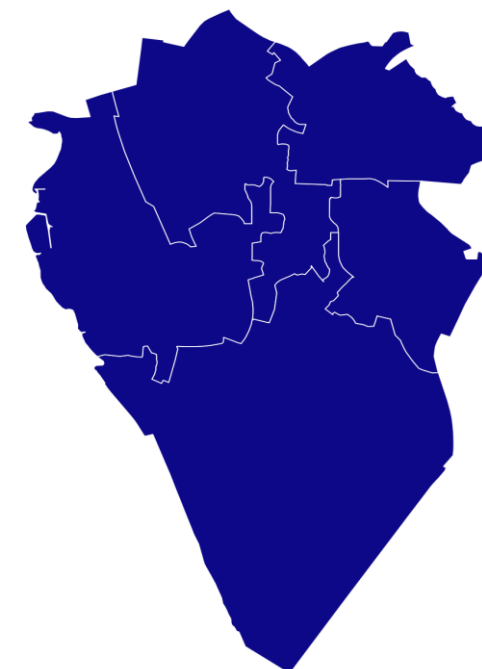

Most Typical Property Age Typical Building Age



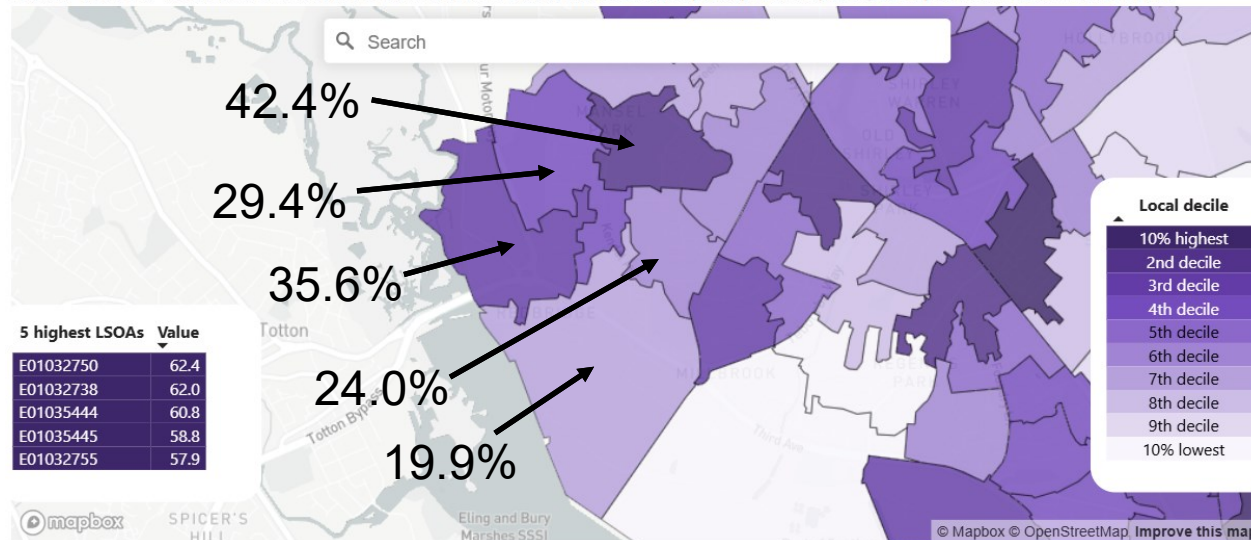
The most common Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) ratings are **bands C** for energy efficiency, with a small area typically council band D.

Transport and Connectivity in Redbridge & Millbrook West

30.3% of **Redbridge & Millbrook West** residents have no cars or vans in their household, significantly higher than the Southampton average of 27.4% and England's average of 23.5%. Two LSOAs are significantly higher than the Southampton average.

The most popular employment destination for residents in **Redbridge & Millbrook West** is City Centre & The Polygon (Southampton) (21.2%), followed by University Hospital of Southampton (16.2%).

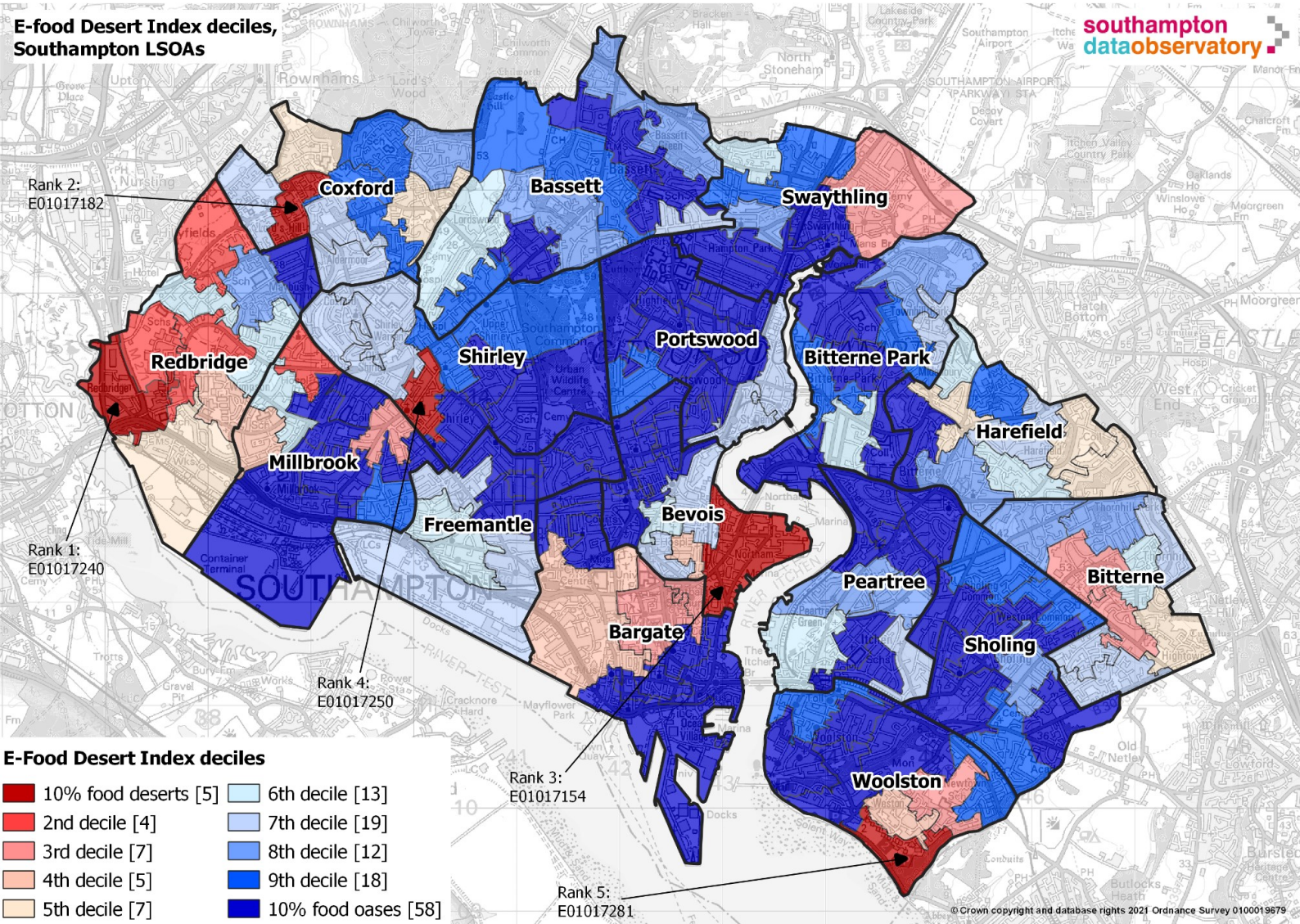
Number of cars or vans: No cars or vans in household, deciles of households, Southampton by lower layer super output areas (LSOAs): Census 2021



Redbridge & Millbrook West face longer travel times to Further Education than the England average. Local connectivity is strong with access to Employment centre, Primary School, Secondary School and Hospital is faster here than the wider Southampton average.

E-Food Desert Index

National index by LSOAs was produced by University of Leeds in 2020 and measures the extent to which LSOAs exhibit characteristics associated with food deserts, whilst also considering the online shopping behaviours – by four key drivers:

- Proximity and density of grocery retail facilities
- Transport and accessibility
- Neighbourhood socio-economic and demographic characteristics
- E-commerce availability and propensity

Majority of Southampton is classed as food oases, however LSOAs within Redbridge & Millbrook West are within the food deserts, with LSOA E01017240 ranked 1st of all 152 LSOAs in Southampton.

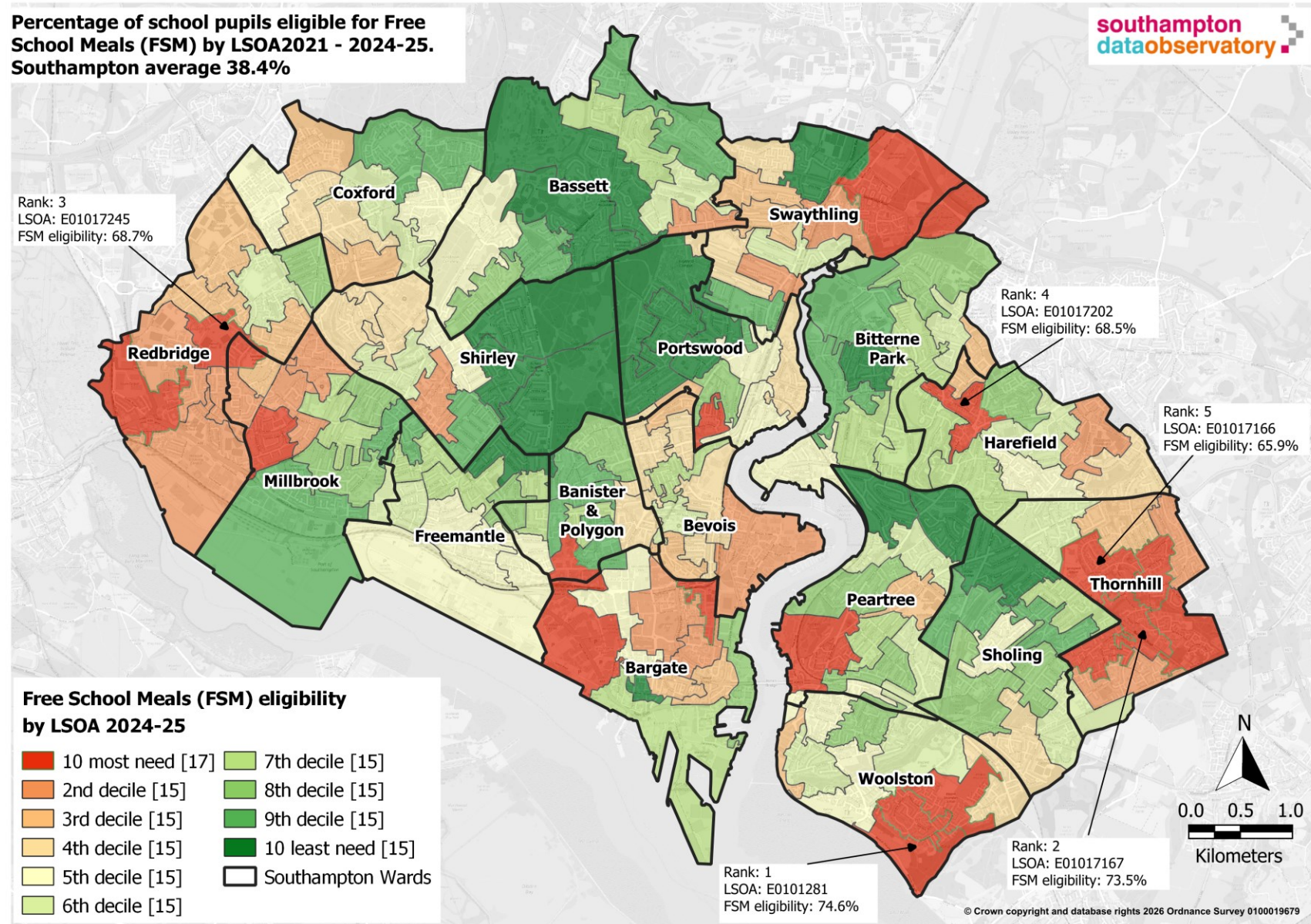

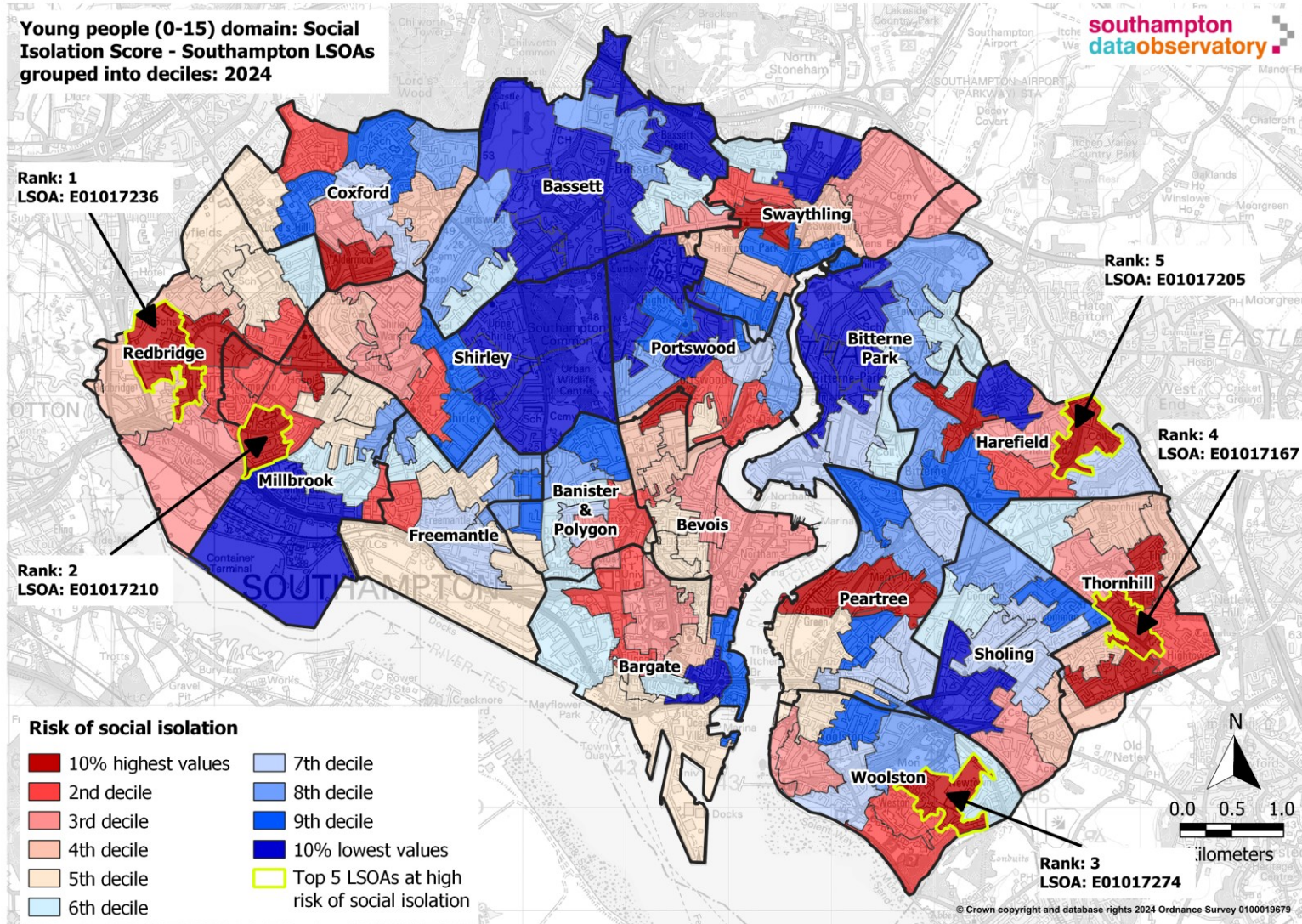

Social Isolation – Young People



Young People in **Redbridge & Millbrook West** are likely to experience among the highest levels of social isolation in the city with 2 of the 5 LSOAs in the highest 10% with one Redbridge & Millbrook West LSOA being the highest in the city.

These indices use a Department of Health evidence-based indicators looking at young people aged 0 to 15 years:

- English is not the main language
- Long term health problem or disability
- Provides unpaid care
- Year 6 excess weight
- NEET - Not in education, employment or training (16 and 17 years)*
- Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI)

*The DoH rationale suggests social isolation aged 0 to 15 years impacts on NEET aged 16/17 years

Safety, Security and Cohesion

Crime rates in **Redbridge & Millbrook West** are higher than the Southampton average for 7 categories, specifically: Criminal damage and arson, Other crime, Possession of weapons, Public order, Robbery, Vehicle crime and Violence and sexual offences. Compared to the England average, this area sees higher rates in all crimes apart from Shoplifting and Theft from the person.

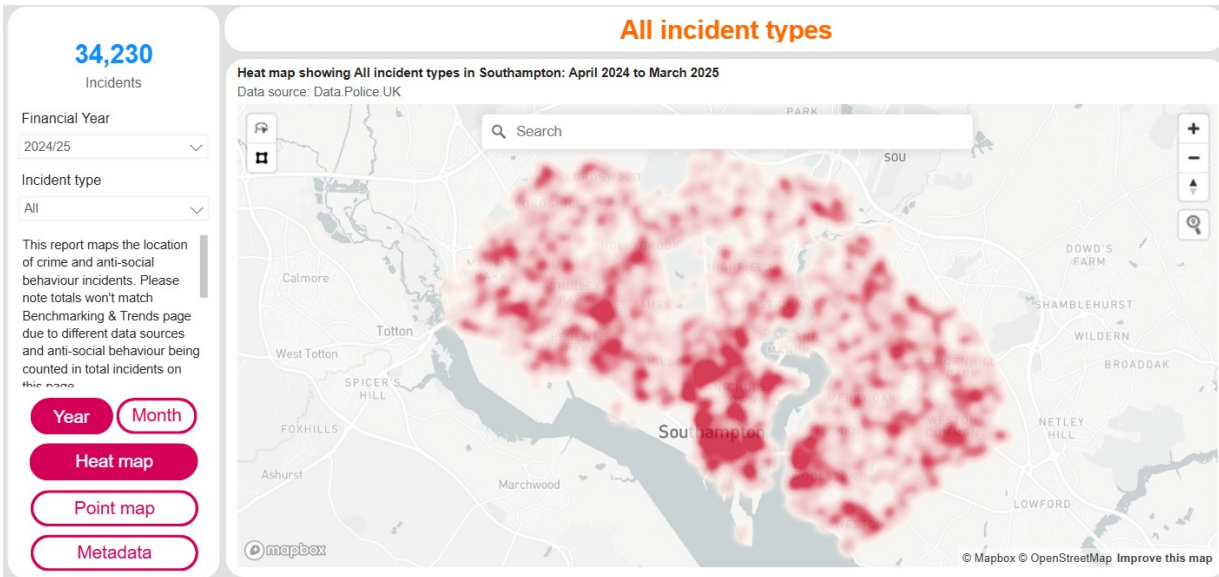
